appreciate more deeply the love of God for us, His plan of salvation, and our response to Him:


- **1. Recognize** the cross of Jesus as the evidence of God's agape love and the only means of our redemption.

C. Come to Life - 002. Dynamic Circles of Love

SUMMARY: Consider and appreciate now the **receiving** side of that circle of love, which forms **phase 1** in the discipling process.

The first theme and mark of discipleship in each phase cover the <u>receiving</u> side of the relationship, the second theme and mark the <u>giving</u> side. Jesus said, "Come to Me, Learn of Me." (Mt 11:28-30); then, "Go for Me into all the world." (Mk 16:15; Mt 28:20). So the three circles of love together form the <u>process</u> by which Jesus builds His church (Mt 16:18): **1.** He calls her to Himself (Mt 16:24), **2.** grows her into His full stature (Eph 4:13; 5:27), and **3.** sends her to complete her number (Rom 11:25-26). Then He will return to take His beloved bride home into God's eternal glory (Jn 14:1-3).



C. Come to Life – 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus – 101. God's Love for His World

SUMMARY: You take step 1 in the discipling process, as you believe the Gospel of God's love and respond to it with absolute love for Jesus.

"'God is love.' 1 John 4:16. His nature, His law, is love. It ever has been; it ever will be....With Him 'is no variableness, neither shadow of turning.' James 1:17. Every manifestation of creative power is an expression of infinite love. The sovereignty of God involves fullness of blessing to all created beings." (*PP* 33). "In the beginning, God was revealed in all the works of creation. It was Christ that spread the heavens, and laid the foundations of the earth. It was His hand that hung the worlds in space, and fashioned the flowers of the field... It was He that filled the earth with beauty, and the air with song. And upon all things in earth, and air, and sky, He wrote the message of the Father's love." (*DA* 20; *MM* 10).

"The message that the sinner should hear is, 'God so loved the world, that He gave His only-begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (*GW 154-155; Ev 189;* Jn 3:16). "In order to break down the barriers of prejudice and impenitence, the love of Christ must have a part in every discourse. Make men to know how much Jesus loves them, and what evidences He has given them of His love. What love can equal that which God has manifested for man, by the death of Christ on the cross? When the heart is filled with the love of Jesus, this can be presented to the people, and it will affect hearts." (*Lt 48, 1886; Ev 189*). Is our heart totally filled with Jesus' love?



C. Come to Life – 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus – 102. Gabriel's Prophecy of the Messiah

SUMMARY: You see God's love for you in His prophecy that identifies Jesus as your Savior, and 1844 as the beginning of your final judgment.

The 2300 Evenings and Mornings (Dan 8:14)

The vision in Da 8 with the 2,300-day/year prophecy was given in "the third year of the reign of king Belshazzar" (8:1), i.e., in 550/549 BC, but "none understood" it (8:27).

The 70-week/490-year prophecy (9:20-27) came in answer to Daniel's prayer (9:1-19), in "the first year of Darius" (9:1), or 539/538 BC, to bring understanding to Daniel (9:22).

All details of the 70th week or last 7 years were fulfilled in the life and work of Jesus who thus proved to be the *Messiah* (9:25) or *Christ* (Mt 16:16), the One *anointed* or empowered by the Holy Spirit (Isa 61:1; Lk 4:17-21; Ac 10:38).

Jesus lived "that it might be fulfilled." (Mt 1:22) and died "according to the scriptures" (1 Co 15:3), to fulfill all things "written in the law of Moses, the prophets, and in the psalms." (Lk 24:27, 44). The Scriptures testify of Him (Jn 5:39).

Daniel 9:24

The Purpose of Jesus' Life and Work

1. To finish transgression:

Restrain: Jesus called the Jews to accept Him as the fulfillment of the covenant with Abraham (Ge 17:1-8; Gal 3:16; Mt 23:37). **Complete:** Jesus' rejection (Jn 1:11) ended Jewish probation (Ac 7:52; Rom 10:1-4).

2. To make an end of sins:

Jesus takes sin away (Jn 1:29), becoming sin (2 Co 5:21) & giving Himself (Gal 1:4).

- 3. To make reconciliation for iniquity: Jesus died so God can reconcile people to Himself (Rom 5:10; 2 Co 5:19).
- **4. To bring in everlasting righteousness:** Jesus is our righteousness (1 Co 1:30). He imputes & imparts it to us (2 Co 5:21).
- 5. To seal up the vision and prophecy:
 Jesus confirms or ratifies it by fulfilling its time predictions (Mk 1:15; Gal 4:4).
- 6. To anoint the Most Holy:

The earthly sanctuary was anointed to inaugurate divine service (Ex 40:9). The anointing of the heavenly sanctuary points forward to Jesus' high priestly, intercessory ministry there following His ascension (Heb 9:12, 21, 24)

Daniel 9:25

The Timing of Jesus' Life and Work

1. From the going forth of the commandment: Decree of Persian King Artaxerxes I "in the seventh year of the king" (Ezr 7:7), 457 BC, implemented in the fall. Authorized the Jews to rebuild the temple & the city of Jerusalem

(Ezr 7:11-28).

2. Unto Messiah the Prince:

This can only refer to Jesus, since He is the one who fulfilled the time frame given here.

3. Seven, and threescore and two weeks:
69 prophetic weeks are 483 years. Countin

69 prophetic weeks are 483 years. Counting from 457 BC, this leads to the fall of AD 27, since there is no year "zero."

That fall, Jesus was baptized and anointed & began His public ministry "in the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar" (Lk 3:1, 21, 22). "The time is fulfilled." (Mk 1:15).

Daniel 9:24-27 - Summary

The exact and complete fulfillment of the 70week prophecy in the life and work of Jesus proves Him to be the predicted Messiah and testifies to the reliability and power of God's Word (Isa 55:11; Jn 17:17).

Daniel 9:26-27

The "Last Week" of Jesus' Life and Work

- **1. After threescore and two [62] weeks:** After the fall of AD 27, the beginning of the 70th week of the prophecy.
- 2. Messiah shall be cut off:

Jesus would be cut off (Isa 53:8), that is, die, to "cut" (Ge 15:8-18) or mediate the New Covenant in His blood (Lk 22:20).

- **3. But not for himself:** Or, shall have nothing: Jesus sacrificed Himself to save others (Isa 53:5-8; Mt 20:28; 26:28; 1 Co 15:3).
- **4.** The people of the prince shall... destroy: Titus' army destroyed Jerusalem in AD 70.
- 5. Confirm the covenant for one week:
 For 7 years, AD 27-34, Jesus and then His disciples confirmed the promise (Rom 15:8; Ac 2:38-39). After Stephen's death (Ac 7:59) the Gospel went to the Gentiles (Mt 21:43; 24:14; 28:18-20; Ac 11:5-18; 13:45-49).
- 6. Midst of the week...cause to cease:

After 3½ years, in the spring AD 31, Jesus died; the temple veil was torn in two, marking the end of the sacrificial system (Mt 27:51). Type met Antitype, "Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us" (1 Co 5:7), the new and living way into the Holiest (Heb 10:12-22).

Daniel 8:14 – Summary

Since the 490-year prophecy ended in AD 34, AD 1844 marks the end of the 2,300-year prophecy, and thus the beginning of Jesus' high priestly ministry of the cleansing of the heavenly sanctuary, or the pre-advent judgment. This present truth is confirmed and proclaimed by the Three Angels' Messages (Rev 14:6-11; 18:1-4), which have been entrusted to God's remnant church (Rev 10:11; 12:17; 14:12).

For the perfecting of the saints... Eph 4:12

C. Come to Life – 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus – 103. The Great Central Truth

SUMMARY: You see God's love for you in Jesus' death on the cross, the center of all other truths and the only reason for your end-time victory.

The Gospel of Jesus Christ centers on His self-sacrifice for the salvation of the human race. "There is one great central truth to be kept ever before the mind in the searching of the Scriptures--Christ and Him crucified. Every other truth is invested with influence and power corresponding to its relation to this theme. It is only in the light of the cross that we can discern the exalted character of the law of God. The soul palsied by sin can be endowed with life only through the work wrought out upon the cross by the Author of our salvation." (MS 31, 1890; 7ABC 458).

The cross is the only key to all other truths. "The sacrifice of Christ as an atonement for sin is the great truth around which all other truths cluster. In order to be rightly understood and appreciated, every truth in the word of God, from Genesis to Revelation, must be studied in the light that streams from the cross of Calvary. I present before you the great, grand monument of mercy and regeneration, salvation and redemption,—the Son of God uplifted on the cross. This is to be the foundation of every discourse given by our ministers." (*GW 315; 7ABC 457*).

The cross exerts a most powerful attraction and guarantees the greatest victory. "The cross of Calvary challenges, and will finally vanquish every earthly and hellish power. In the cross all influence centers, and from it all influence goes forth. It is the great center of attraction; for on it Christ gave up His life for the human race. This sacrifice was offered for the purpose of restoring man to his original perfection. Yea, more, it was offered to give him an entire transformation of character, making him more than a conqueror. Those who in the strength of Christ overcome the great enemy of God and man, will occupy a position in the heavenly courts above angels who have never fallen." (MS 56, 1899; 6BC 1113).

The cross is therefore the only reason for our faithfulness in the final crisis. "The only way in which men will be able to stand firm in the conflict is to be rooted and grounded in Christ. They must receive the truth as it is in Jesus. And it is only as the truth is presented thus that it can meet the wants of the soul. The preaching of Christ crucified, Christ our righteousness, is what satisfies the soul's hunger. When we secure the interest of the people in this great central truth, faith and hope and courage come to the heart." (LDE 151). Is the cross the center of your life?

8. Second Coming

The cross establishes the new covenant, opening a new way to the holiness we need to see God, which hastens the Lord's coming. (Heb 10:7-22; 12:14; 2 Pe 3:11-12).

7. Heavenly Sanctuary

Jesus' cross shed the blood He

now pleads for repenting sinners,

and by which He still cleanses the

sanctuary from all confessed sin.

(Da 8:14; Rom 8:34; Heb 7:25; 9:23).

1. Great Controversy

The cross glorifies God, proving His selfless love and the validity of His law, exposing Satan as a liar and murderer, and casting him out. (Jn 3:16; 8:44; 12:28-31; Mt 5:17-18).



2. Biblical Marriage

The cross models the agape love that Christian spouses are called to show to each other, reflecting Jesus' own love for His church. (Isa 54:5; Jn 3:29; Eph 5:21-32).



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The CROSS of Christ

Jesus' sinless life and self-sacrifice enable the restoration of God's image in repenting and believing humanity, to secure their eternal redemption and unity in Christ for all creation. (Mk 1:15; Jn 10:18; Heb 5:9; 9:12, 15; Eph 1:9-14; 2 Pe 3:13; Rev 21:1).



3. Seventh-day Sabbath

Jesus' cross and Sabbath rest parallel His rest after creation, enabling believers to rest by faith also in His finished recreation. (Ge 2:2-3; Heb 4:4-11; 2 Co 5:17).



6. Christian Stewardship

The cross reveals the self-denial we need to serve others by the proper use and increase of God's gifts through faithful stewardship. (Lk 12:42; 1 Co 4:1-2; 1 Pe 4:10).



5. Second Probation

The cross grants fallen humanity more history as a second chance to show obedience to God's law, by God's Spirit, in love for Jesus. (Rom 8:1-4; Jn 14:15, 23; 15:10)



4. Sin and Death

The cross, death, and resurrection of Jesus prove that the wages of sin is the second death, and the first death is a sleep in the grave. (Mt 27:46; Jn 11:11-15, 43; 20:17).

C. Come to Life – 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus – 104. His Experience of the Cross

SUMMARY: Your love for Jesus grows when you study and ponder His experience of suffering and death on the cross, as He Himself describes it.

May we all "behold what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us" (1 Jn 1:3) through the suffering and death of Christ, as Jesus describes it in His own words. "Having loved his own which were in the world, He loved them unto the end." (Jn 13:1). "Hanging upon the cross Christ was the gospel....This is our message, our argument, our doctrine, our warning to the impenitent, our encouragement for the sorrowing, the hope for every believer. If we can awaken an interest in men's minds that will cause them to fix their eyes on Christ, we may step aside, and ask them only to continue to fix their eyes upon the Lamb of God." (MS 49, 1898; 7ABC 458). May we ever and only "glory in the cross...." (Gal 6:14).

C. Come to Life – 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus – 105. The Depth of God's Love

SUMMARY: You can see the mystery of God's love in yet greater depth, as you consider the divine anguish, not only of Jesus but of the Father.

"Behold what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us." (1 Jn 3:1). "Having loved his own which were in the world, He loved them unto the end." (Jn 13:1). "God commendeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Rom 5:8). "...that the love wherewith Thou hast loved me may be in them, and I in them." (Jn 17:26). "This is my commandment, that ye love one another, as I have loved you." (Jn 15:12). Not only will the love of God be our eternal study and joy, but it is here and now to be the principle of the disciples' life.

"God's wonderful purpose of grace, the mystery of redeeming love, is the theme into which 'angels desire to look,' and it will be their study throughout endless ages. Both the redeemed and the unfallen beings will find in the cross of Christ their science and their song. It will be seen that the glory shining in the face of Jesus is the glory of self-sacrificing love. In the light from Calvary it will be seen that the law of self-renouncing love is the law of life for earth and heaven; that the love which 'seeketh not her own' has its source in the heart of God." (DA 19).

The true height and depth of this selfless, self-sacrificing love of Jesus is nowhere else more dramatically and ultimately revealed than during those despairing hours on the cross, when the Savior felt nothing but the guilt of humanity and the wrath of God against sin; when He was not upheld by the joy that previously had been set before Him of seeing souls eternally saved; when He had no assurance of His own resurrection and return to glory, but only the fear that the separation from His beloved Father might be for eternity – and yet, even then, He did not give in to the demonic challenges of the bystanders to come down from the cross and save Himself, but chose to give Himself up for us all (1 Ti 2:6; Tit 2:14).

C. Come to Life - 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus - 106. The Streams of Compassion

SUMMARY: The more you ponder the Father's suffering with His Son, the deeper you appreciate His infinite compassion and matchless love.

Some people tend to interpret the sacrificial death of Jesus on Calvary as a means to appease the righteous wrath of God against sinful humanity, as the way by which God's Son reconciled His Father in heaven to humanity on earth, or changed His wrath toward them into love and acceptance. But this view reflects more the heathens' fear of their ill-minded gods (*PK 124*) than the compassionate God of the Bible. **1.** It is true that "the wrath of God is revealed from heaven," yet His wrath is directed, not against the people themselves, but "against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men" (Rom 1:18), that is, against the sin in them. God "hates the sin, but loves the sinner." (*DA 462*).

- **2.** Jesus did not come to turn the Father's wrath into love, but because the Father Himself loved the world, He sent and gave His Son (Jn 3:16). "Behold what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us." (1 Jn 3:1). "God commendeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Rom 5:8). In love, God took His wrath against our sin upon Himself by making Jesus to be that sin for us (2 Co 5:21). **3.** God did not need to be reconciled to the world, but rather humanity to God (2 Co 5:19); and the call to reconciliation still goes out to every individual as Jesus' last day disciples spread the three angels' messages (2 Co 5:20-21; Rev 14:6-12; 18:1-4).
- **4.** Though on the cross God's Son experienced the wages of sin, eternal death, as separation from His Father (Rom 6:23; Mt 27:46), the Father did not leave His Son to suffer by Himself but suffered that separation with Him in His own heart, enduring the "sundering of the divine powers." (*7BC 924*). "The heart of God yearned with greatest sorrow when His Son, the guiltless, was suffering the penalty of sin." (*ibid.*) Anticipating the unfathomable depth of this divine pain, the Father had struggled long during Their counsel of peace "to yield up His Son to die for the guilty race. But 'God so loved the world, that He gave His only-begotten Son,'...Oh, the mystery of redemption!" (*PP 63-64*).

C. Come to Life - 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus - 107. Humanity's Need and Choice

SUMMARY: In gratitude for such divine love you believe the gospel, and seeing your need of the Savior you choose to surrender all to Him.

Even before They created this world, the Father and the Son agreed on the plan of salvation because They knew humanity would need a Savior. Yet people overlook their need of Jesus even after they know they are sinners (Ge 3:7). So God shows them the alternatives and their results. He told Adam and Eve what sin would do to them and the whole earth (Ge 2:16-17; 3:15-19). Through Moses, He set life and death before Israel (Dt 30:1, 19). Through Jesus, He outlined the blessings of faith and the woes of unbelief (Mt 5:1-20; 23:13-39). In these last days, God calls all humanity to respond to His final revelation (Rev 1:3; 14:6; 22:18-19).

"What you need to understand is the true force of the will. This is the governing power in the nature of man, the power of decision, or of choice. Everything depends on the right action of the will. The power of choice God has given to men; it is theirs to exercise. You cannot change your heart, you cannot of yourself give to God its affections; but you can choose to serve Him. You can give Him your will; He will then work in you to will and to do according to His good pleasure. Thus your whole nature will be brought under the control of the Spirit of Christ; your affections will be centered upon Him, your thoughts will be in harmony with Him.

"Desires for goodness and holiness are right as far as they go; but if you stop here, they will avail nothing. Many will be lost while hoping and desiring to be Christians. They do not come to the point of yielding the will to God. They do not now choose to be Christians. Through the right exercise of the will, an entire change may be made in your life. By yielding up your will to Christ, you ally yourself with the power that is above all principalities and powers. You will have strength from above to hold you steadfast, and thus through constant surrender to God you will be enabled to live the new life, even the life of faith." (SC 47-48). Choose life!

C. Come to Life – 2. Receive Salvation by Faith – 201. The Three Stages of Salvation


SUMMARY: In response to the gospel of Jesus, you receive salvation by faith in three stages, typified by the three sections of the sanctuary.

God has revealed His plan to save fallen humanity from sin throughout history, to Adam and Eve (Gen 3:15), Abraham (Gen 22:18; Jn 8:56), Isaiah (Isa 53), Daniel (Da 8 & 9) and others, and clearly has illustrated it through Moses in the sanctuary system (Ex 25:8-9). Ever since Eden, God is offering to the whole human race the benefits of the life, death, resurrection, and heavenly intercession of His Son (Rev 22:17), that is, salvation in three stages, justification or forgiveness, sanctification or holiness, and glorification or sinlessness.

All three stages of our restoration are typified in the sections, furniture, and services of the OT sanctuary. The earthly structure was a model of the heavenly original (Ex 25:9, 40), where Jesus is now completing the atonement He began in His life and through death on earth (Heb 9:23-28). "What was done in type in the ministration of the earthly sanctuary is done in reality in the ministration of the heavenly sanctuary." (*GC 420*). "The correct understanding of the ministration in the heavenly sanctuary is the foundation of our faith." (*Ev 221*).

God makes all stages available by grace; we receive them through faith (Eph 2:8). Jesus' righteousness is first imputed to us (Rom 4:3-5) as our *title* to heaven (*FLB 116*), then imparted as our *fitness* for heaven (ibid.) as we partake of His divine nature (1 Co 3:16; Col 3:9-10; 2 Pe 1:4) and love the world as He did (*DA 641*). As Jesus is perfectly reflected in us, we are *candidates* for heaven (*5T 216*), glorifying God in our bodies and as His body (1 Co 6:20; Jn 17:20), and at His return He will give His glory to our bodies (Rom 8:30; Php 3:20-21).

"The sanctuary in heaven is the very center of Christ's work in behalf of men. It concerns every soul living upon the earth. It opens to view the plan of redemption, bringing us down to the very close of time, and revealing the triumphant issue of the contest between righteousness and sin. It is of utmost importance that all should thoroughly investigate these subjects..." (GC 488).

C. Come to Life – 2. Receive Salvation by Faith – 202. The Two Parts of Justification

SUMMARY: You take step 2 in the discipling process, as you enter the first stage of salvation, justification by faith in its two parts, renewed daily.

Justification, as do sanctification and glorification, comes by God's grace through faith (Eph 2:8-9; Tit 3:7). He makes it available to "whosoever will" (Rev 21:6; 22:17); the sinner receives it at conversion (1 Co 6:11), and maintains it by daily walking after the Spirit (Rom 10:8-10; 8:1-4). It means forgiveness of sins (Rom 3:23-25) upon repentance (sorrow for and forsaking of sin, 2 Co 7:9-11; Isa 55:7), restitution (Ex 22:1-15; Lev 5:16; Num 5:7; Lk 19:8), and confession of sin and of faith in Jesus as Savior (2 Chr 7:14; Lk 24:47; 1 Jn 1:9; Rom 3:25).

As soon as the repentant sinner accepts and claims by faith that Jesus took upon Himself the just penalty for his or her sins, that faith is counted or imputed to him or her for righteousness as it was to Abraham (Ge 15:6; Rom 4:3, 23-25; Gal 3:6). He or she is declared free from condemnation, is at peace or reconciled with God, and as a new creature or creation (Rom 8:1; 5:1, 10-11; 2 Co 5:17-20) is adopted into His family and so a joint heir with Jesus (Rom 8:14-17; 6BC 1070-1071). In this healed relationship the justified sinner rejoices (Rom 5:11).

In the OT, the daily sanctuary service illustrated that justification, or atonement, is accomplished only when the blood of the sacrifice is both shed (the sinner's part) and applied (the priest's part). This service typified Jesus who spilled His blood at His death on earth as the sacrifice (1 Co 5:7) and now applies or pleads it in the sanctuary in heaven as our High Priest (Rom 8:34; Heb 7:25; *Lt* 87, 1894).

This two-part process was already in place, when God instructed the Israelites to kill lambs and then apply the blood to the doorposts (Ex 12:1-13; 21-23; *PP* 277), and also later made the old covenant (Ex 24:6-8; Heb 9:18-21). Likewise, Jesus confirmed the new covenant with His shed blood (Da 9:27; Rom 15:8; Heb 2:3), and now administers it by the sprinkled (applied) blood (Heb 12:24; 1 Pe 1:2).

God's plan is to save us from sin and for service (Rom 6:1-11; 12:1; Heb 9:15). Will we cooperate?

C. Come to Life – 2. Receive Salvation by Faith – 203. Signs of Genuine Conversion

SUMMARY: You will recognize that you can receive justification by faith only in a genuine or truthful conversion, as described by Ellen G. White.

"In order to be saved, we must know by experience the meaning of true conversion. It is a fearful mistake for men and women to go on day by day, professing to be Christians, yet having no right to the name. In God's sight, profession is nothing, position is nothing. He asks, Is the life in harmony with my precepts? There are many who suppose that they are converted, but who are not able to bear the test of character presented in the Word of God. Sad will it be, in the day when every man is rewarded according to his works, for those who can not bear this test....

"In the lives of many of those whose names are on the church books there has been no genuine change. The truth has been kept in the outer court. There has been no genuine conversion, no positive work of grace done in the heart. Their desire to do God's will is based upon their own inclination, not upon the deep conviction of the Holy Spirit. Their conduct is not brought into harmony with the law of God. They profess to accept Christ as their Saviour, but they do not believe that he will give them power to overcome their sins. They have not a personal acquaintance with a living Saviour, and their characters reveal many blemishes....The [genuine] change can be made only by the Holy Spirit." (RH 07-07-1904).

Will God's people allow the Spirit of God, if need be, to move them from a mere profession to genuine conversion?

C. Come to Life - 3. Obey Jesus from Love - 301. The Three Baptisms

SUMMARY: You take step 3 in the discipling process, as you lovingly and joyfully obey Jesus and commit yourself to the three Biblical baptisms.

The new believer gladly receives three baptisms which will mark his or her new journey with Jesus. **1.** Baptism in water by immersion declares his or her conversion and confirms one's membership in Christ's body, His church. **2.** Baptism of the Holy Spirit upon prayer empowers sanctification and the exercise of ministry according to his or her spiritual gifts. **3.** Baptism of suffering means persecution and/or martyrdom, which may come to any true disciple of Jesus as people or powers reject his or her sanctified life and Spirit-filled testimony (2 Ti 3:12).

Water baptism and baptism of suffering are one-time and short-term events. The baptism of the Holy Spirit, though received once initially, requires daily renewal to be effective. This is because sanctification and gifted ministry are both lifelong developments and tasks, which can be accomplished only through constant and total dependence on the power of the Holy Spirit, received in answer to prayer. Of all three baptisms, therefore, the baptism of the Holy Spirit is the most crucial for a successful Christian walk. Without daily growth in sanctification and obedient use of spiritual gifts, neither past water baptism nor future suffering will testify of "Christ in you" (Rom 8:10; 2 Co 13:5; Col 1:27; Gal 2:20).

"Impress upon all the necessity of the baptism of the Holy Spirit, the sanctification of the members of the church, so that they will be living, growing, fruit-bearing trees of the Lord's planting." (6T 86). "What we need is the baptism of the Holy Spirit. Without this, we are no more fitted to go forth to the world than were the disciples after the crucifixion of their Lord." (RH 02-18-1890). "There is nothing that Satan fears so much as that the people of God shall clear the way by removing every hindrance, so that the Lord can pour out His Spirit upon a languishing church and an impenitent congregation. When the way is prepared for the Spirit of God, the blessing will come." (RH 03-22-1887). Are we ready?

C. Come to Life - 3. Obey Jesus from Love - 302. The Four Marks of the Final Remnant

SUMMARY: You also commit to lovingly obeying all the commandments of Jesus, and to fulfilling the other three marks of His final remnant.

Revelation describes the final remnant, God's people during the time of the end, by four identifying marks. First, they keep God's commandments (Rev 12:17; 14:12). Second, they have the testimony of Jesus or the spirit of prophecy (Rev 12:17; 19:10; 22:9). Third, they keep the faith of Jesus (Rev 13:10; 14:12). Fourth, they have patience, that is, they endure (Mt 24:13) or persevere (Rev 13:10; 14:12).

- 1. To keep God's Commandments means to delight in them out of love for the Lord Jesus (Ex 20:6; Ps 40:8; 119:35; Jn 14:5, 21; 1 Jn 2:3-6).
- 2. To have the testimony of Jesus means to hear it, especially in Revelation and EGW, to heed it, and to spread it (Rev 1:2, 3; 3; 10:11; 18:1-4).
- 3. To keep the faith of Jesus means to have the kind of faith He had, loving and tried, and to have faith in Jesus (Rev 3:18; Gal 2:16; 5:6).
- 4. To persevere means to endure unto the end without being deceived or falling away (Mt 24:13; 2 Th 1:4; 2:3; Rev 1:9; 13:10; 14:12).

These four identifying marks of the remnant are dependent on each other; none of them is effective or even possible without the other three. Keeping the Commandments requires the faith of Jesus as well as perseverance (Heb 12:1-4), both of which we receive by heeding His testimony (Rev 3:18). It is therefore essential that all members of the remnant uphold their prophetic identity by making a daily, unconditional, and uncompromising commitment to all four characteristics. The Lord greatly desires that all will be found among the faithful at His coming (Lk 18:8).

C. Come to Life - 3. Obey Jesus from Love - 303. Promises to Claim

SUMMARY: You can exercise faith and faithfulness during the trials of the last days, as you claim God's promises to His remnant people.

The Lord wants to ensure His remnant people that He has made all the provisions necessary to preserve them in the faith and enable them to be faithful in the trials and sufferings during the last day events.
