



In a Nutshell

SUMMARY: This ministry points and responds to God's final call that His remnant people prepare for the latter rain by acting on the former rain.

Introduction - 101. About the Author

SUMMARY: Dear Friend, as you study this Guide, allow yourself to appreciate how the Lord has led Josef in the past and to the writing of this book.



For more than 40 years, God by His grace led Josef Ludwig to an ever deeper relationship with Jesus Christ as the Lord of his life and the Savior of the world. Josef's love grew for God's end-time people who gather for worship and training, then scatter for witness and service. He is ever more impressed that now is the time for the final revival and reformation of God's remnant people, the time to prepare for the last battle of the great controversy between the Lord Jesus and Satan.

The Lord Jesus entered Josef's life in June 1974 during his training for the Roman-Catholic priesthood. While teaching religion in Swiss and German high schools, Josef studied the Bible intensely, prayed much, and daily compared the doctrines with God's Word. Finally in 1982 he understood Revelation 18:4, "Come out of her my people..." as a divine call to search for the true church. In 1983 he met Canadian Christians, which resulted in his call to train as a pastor in Canada.

Between 1986 and 1993, Josef served a three-church district in rural Saskatchewan, and assisted other congregations as an instructor on revival and exercising spiritual gifts. Through Mennonite ministers Josef became convicted of believer baptism, the seriousness of the Ten Commandments, and the need for a Biblical lifestyle. He decided to join the Mennonite church, which led him to Richland, Pennsylvania, where He received a M.Div. degree in 1996. He remembers how after picking up the US visa in Calgary, Alberta in 1993, he asked God to assure him of His guidance in the USA. Just then he spotted a roof with big letters saying, "Jesus is Lord." Great peace flooded his heart.

Little did Josef realize that the Lord was already directing his journey to the Remnant Movement. During his last six months in Saskatchewan, a couple who came to town weekly with their truck of produce gave Josef a book by Amazing Facts. Most of its teachings were new to Josef though he understood the main arguments; but he objected to the notion that the Roman church had changed the Sabbath to Sunday. In fact, he gave a written defense of Sunday worship to the couple a few days later, unaware that this was their last market day for the season. Later in Pennsylvania a Seventh-day Adventist literature evangelist gave him a Great Controversy, but Josef read only one page.

Upon completing his M.Div. degree, Josef received a green card and worked as a German editor and translator for the international Mennonite publishing house Rod and Staff. He moved to North Carolina to join a rural church, but his growing interest in prophecy led him to ask many questions about Revelation and world events. In 1997 Josef received a flier from the local Seventh-day Adventist church announcing evangelistic meetings. He was amazed that the topics listed on it were his exact questions, almost to the wording! Josef saw God's leading and found complete answers; he was baptized on Sabbath, October 11, 1997, which was also the annual JEWISH Day of Atonement.

Right after Josef's baptism the Lord strongly impressed him that during this time of the GLOBAL Day of Atonement, believers need to prepare for the latter rain. At a men's retreat in 2002 Josef renewed his commitment to Jesus. Two weeks later the Lord called him to compile material and to hold seminars on revival and reformation in churches in the area, to help church members prepare for victory and ministry in the final days of earth's probation. In 2005 he married Kathie, who strongly supports him in this ministry, especially with her sense of urgency and gift of intercessory prayer. They are convinced that the final revival and reformation can be expected only in answer to prayer.

In 2006 Josef was impressed to develop a website to make this ministry useful to the wider church, and after camp meeting in 2008, the Lord urged him to introduce the material at the General Conference Session in Atlanta in June 2010 in the form of this *Get Ready!* Guide. God continues to lead in spreading its message to help God's people prepare for the testing of our faith, that time when only those who watch, pray, and work will receive the latter rain and remain faithful, while others will be surprised and overwhelmed; that time when ultimate decisions of eternal consequence shall be made by every inhabitant of the world in response to God's last rays of merciful light and His final warning.

Josef and Kathie Ludwig serve their local congregation, while working as a full-time gardener and a nurse respectively. They are always willing to share this material with members, churches, and groups who are ready to begin their own final revival and reformation, resulting in solid, faithful, Biblical last day discipleship. "Satan is constantly alluring away from faithfulness and thoroughness in the essential works of preparedness of the great event that will try every man's soul. Introduction – 105. A Challenge

SUMMARY: Now, as you evaluate this inspired challenge, permit it to awaken or deepen your resolve to join the final revival and reformation.

"Not One in Twenty Prepared

"It is a solemn statement that I make to the church, that not one in twenty whose names are registered upon the church books are prepared to close their earthly history, and would be as verily without God and without hope in the world as the common sinner. They are professedly serving God, but they are more earnestly serving mammon. This half-and-half work is a constant denying of Christ, rather than a confessing of Christ. So many have brought into the church their own unsubdued spirit, unrefined; their spiritual taste is perverted by their own immoral, debasing corruptions, symbolizing the world in spirit, in heart, in purpose, confirming themselves in lustful practices, and are full of deception through and through in their professed Christian life. Living as sinners, claiming to be Christians! Those who claim to be Christians and will confess Christ should come out from among them and touch not the unclean thing, and be separate...

"I lay down my pen and lift up my soul in prayer, that the Lord would breathe upon His backslidden people, who are as dry bones, that they may live. The end is near, stealing upon us so stealthily, so imperceptibly, so noiselessly, like the muffled tread of the thief in the night, to surprise the sleepers off guard and unready. May the Lord grant to bring His Holy Spirit upon hearts that are now at ease, that they may no longer sleep as do others, but watch and be sober.--General Conference Bulletin, 1893, pp. 132, 133." (*ChS 41*).

"Revival and Reformation Needed

"Christians should be preparing for what is soon to break upon the world as an overwhelming surprise, and this preparation they should make by diligently studying the word of God, and striving to conform their lives to its precepts. . . . God calls for a revival and a reformation.--Prophets and Kings, p. 626.

"A revival of true godliness among us is the greatest and most urgent of all our needs. To seek this should be our first work.--Review and Herald, March 22. 1887.

"The time has come for a thorough reformation to take place. When this reformation begins, the spirit of prayer will actuate every believer, and will banish from the church the spirit of discord and strife.--Testimonies, vol. 8, p. 251.

"A revival and a reformation must take place under the ministration of the Holy Spirit. Revival and reformation are two different things. Revival signifies a renewal of spiritual life, a quickening of the powers of mind and heart, a resurrection from the spiritual death. Reformation signifies a reorganization, a change in ideas and theories, habits and practices. Reformation will not bring forth the good fruit of righteousness unless it is connected with the revival of the Spirit. Revival and reformation are to do their appointed work, and in doing this work they must blend.-- Review and Herald, Feb. 25, 1902.

"Do not the Scriptures call for a more pure and holy work than we have yet seen? . . . God calls upon those who are willing to be controlled by the Holy Spirit to lead out in a work of thorough reformation. I see a crisis before us, and the Lord calls for His laborers to come into line. Every soul should now stand in a position of deeper, truer consecration to God than during the years that have passed. . . . I have been deeply impressed by scenes that have recently passed before me in the night season. There seemed to be a great movement--a work of revival--going forward in many places. Our people were moving into line, responding to God's call.--General Conference Bulletin, May 29, 1913, p. 34.

"In visions of the night representations passed before me of a great reformatory movement among God's people. Many were praising God. The sick were healed, and other miracles were wrought. . . . Hundreds and thousands were seen visiting families, and opening before them the word of God. Hearts were convicted by the power of the Holy Spirit, and a spirit of genuine conversion was manifest. On every side doors were thrown open to the proclamation of the truth. The world seemed to be lightened with the heavenly influence. Great blessings were received by the true and humble people of God.—Testimonies, vol. 9, p. 126.

"There is great necessity for a reformation among the people of God. The present state of the church leads to the inquiry, Is this a correct representation of Him who gave His life for us?--Testimonies, vol. 3, p. 474.

"When the reproach of indolence and slothfulness shall have been wiped away from the church, the Spirit of the Lord will be graciously manifested. Divine power will be revealed. The church will see the providential working of the Lord of hosts. The light of truth will shine forth in clear, strong rays, and as in the time of the apostles, many souls will turn from error to truth. The earth will be lightened with the glory of the Lord.-- Testimonies, vol. 9, p. 46." (*ChS 41-43*).

"Delay Is Fatal

"I was shown God's people waiting for some change to take place,--a compelling power to take hold of them. But they will be disappointed, for they are wrong. They must act; they must take hold of the work themselves, and earnestly cry to God for a true knowledge of themselves. The scenes which are passing before us are of sufficient magnitude to cause us to arouse, and urge the truth home to the hearts of all who will listen. The harvest of the earth is nearly ripe.--Testimonies, vol. 1, p. 261.

Nevertheless, "there are some who, instead of wisely improving present opportunities, are idly waiting for some special season of spiritual refreshing by which their ability to enlighten others will be greatly increased. They neglect present duties and privileges, and allow their light to burn dim, while they look forward to a time when, without any effort on their part, they will be made the recipients of special blessing, by which they will be transformed and fitted for service.—The Acts of the Apostles, p. 54." (*ChS* 43).

Introduction - 106. Initial Call

SUMMARY: Then, please hear and act on Jesus' call to become a disciple and to make disciples, by receiving the training provided by this Guide.

The root of Christian discipleship is a committed and joyous love for Jesus. The fruit of Christian discipleship is an intimate and glorious life with Jesus.

"Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart; and ye shall find rest for your souls, for my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Mt 11:28-30).

"All power is given unto me in heaven and on earth. Go ye therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things, whatsoever I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen." (Mt 28:18-20).

"Those who have spiritual oversight of the church should devise ways and means by which an opportunity may be given to every member of the church to act some part in God's work....That which is needed now for the upbuilding of our churches is the nice work of laborers to discern and develop talent in the church – talent that can be educated for the Master's use. There should be a well-organized plan for the employment of workers to go into all our churches, large and small, to instruct the members how to labor for the upbuilding of the church and also for unbelievers. It is training, education, that is needed..." (9T 116-117, 119-120).

"All this work of training should be accompanied with earnest seeking of the Lord for His Holy Spirit. Let this be urged home upon those who are willing to give themselves to the Master's service...There should be no delay in this well-planned effort to educate the church members...." (CS 58-59, 61).

My Initial Notes

Introduction – 107. The Six Marks of Discipleship

SUMMARY: The six themes, C to H, cover the six marks of Biblical discipleship in three phases, in the order of their spiritual progression.

This spiritual <u>progression</u> is illustrated in the three sections of the earthly <u>sanctuary</u>, and also in Jesus' three-phase <u>call</u>: **1.** "Come unto Me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden....", **2.** "Learn of Me, for I am meek and lowly in heart....", and **3.** "Go for Me and make disciples...." (Mt 11:28-30; 28:18-20; Mk 3:13-15). Each of the three <u>phases</u> covers two of the six marks of discipleship.

Being a <u>disciple</u> means more than gaining head knowledge (Jn 5:39-40). It means having a close <u>relationship</u> with the Teacher and sharing His experiences (Jn 15:27). It means knowing Jesus personally and walking with Him (1 Jn 2:6), following the Lamb wherever He goes (Rev 14:4). Discipleship is therefore not a program or an event. It is rather a life of radical <u>identification</u> with the character, calling, and concerns of Jesus, in Whose fellowship all His disciples find complete freedom, joy, and purpose (Jn 8:32; 16:24; 21:22).

Introduction - 108. Structure of the Course

SUMMARY: The eight themes and six marks are grouped under our great needs of REVIVAL and REFORMATION, empowered by PRAYER.

"A revival of true godliness among us is the greatest and most urgent of all our needs. To seek this should be our first work.... A revival need be expected only in answer to prayer." (1SM 212; LDE 189). "There is great necessity for a reformation among the people of God." (3T 474).

First Work: PRAYER is vital because "a revival and a reformation must take place, under the ministration of the Holy Spirit." (LDE 189)

Participants seek and see the life-changing power in the process of revival and reformation, as they keep praying for and in the Holy Spirit.

Most Urgent Need: REVIVAL refers to the process of refreshing the faith and committing to the godliness of the original apostolic church.

Great Necessity: REFORMATION is the process of implementing the lifestyle and exercising the ministry of the end-time remnant church.

Revival and Reformation progress along eight themes on through the two levels of Calling the Church and Growing the Church:

The 1st Level: Calling the Church challenges participants to exercise the six marks of discipleship in response to the needs of our time.

It proceeds by making them aware of these needs, calling for a decision, and preparing them precisely to implement the second level.

The <u>2nd Level</u>: Growing the Church enables participants to experience the 18 steps of disciple-making, or spiritual and numerical growth. It proceeds by walking in three phases through the three sections of the sanctuary and applying the meaning of its six pieces of furniture. It advances from heart conversion (courtyard), via character development (holy place), to empowered ministry (most holy place).



Introduction - 109. Dynamic Circles of Love

SUMMARY: Consider and appreciate also, how the three phases of disciple-making each form a circle of love with a receiving and a giving side.

The first theme and mark of discipleship in each phase cover the <u>receiving</u> side of the relationship, the second theme and mark the <u>giving</u> side. Jesus said, "Come to Me, Learn of Me." (Mt 11:28-30); then, "Go for Me into all the world." (Mk 16:15; Mt 28:20). So the three circles of love together form the <u>process</u> by which Jesus builds His church (Mt 16:18): **1.** He calls her to Himself (Mt 16:24), **2.** grows her into His full stature (Eph 4:13; 5:27), and **3.** sends her to complete her number (Rom 11:25-26). Then He will return to take His beloved bride home into God's eternal glory (Jn 14:1-3).



Introduction - 110. Initial Spiritual Survey

SUMMARY: As you begin training, make an initial honest self-assessment of your personal spiritual life and that of your congregation or group.

"Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves." (2 Co 13:5). To help participants

understand and experience the three steps in prayer as the reason for the power of revival and reformation:

- **1. Appreciate** the role and science of intercession in God's plan, and get trained in prayer ministry.
- 2. Identify the principles behind the outline of and progress within the prayer service.
- Plan and establish a permanent local intercessory prayer ministry to sustain revival and reformation.

Revival and reformation are initiated and accomplished by the Holy Spirit, but God can only "give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him." (Lk 11:13). The question then is, "Since this is the means by which we are to receive power, why do we not hunger and thirst for the gift of the Spirit? Why do we not talk of it, pray for it, and preach concerning it?" (AA 50).

The prayer school will help answer this question, and make it desirable for the participants to experience prayer services in the church and to establish a permanent prayer ministry. This will allow revival and reformation to become the way of life for the church, and the means by which both the spiritual and numerical growth of membership is sustained.

Specifically, as members ask for and receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit, the former and the latter rain, they discover and begin to exercise their spiritual gifts and other talents as an effective team. By this process, the church body fulfills its mission to spread the gospel of Jesus and vindicate God's true character by reflecting Him in words and actions.

Ongoing prayer for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the church, and intercession for the sanctification and empowerment of her members are therefore the indispensible prerequisite for fruitful ministry. An effective way to achieve this goal is to make use of periodic prayer services of group intercession led by a trained permanent prayer ministry team.

Intercessory Prayer - 1. Prayer School - 101. Seminar and Training

SUMMARY: The prayer school is the first step by which you seek and through which you see the divine power in true revival and reformation.

"And he spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint." (Lk 18:1). This means, "We must be much more with God in earnest prayer. We must make God our only trust. The Lord is our God, the strength of our soul. We must take hold upon the Lord. The Lord is pleased when we importune Him for His grace and His favor, not only for ourselves but for those who are in need of help. Oh let us put implicit confidence in our Lord Jesus. Now pray, and believe, and pray, and the Lord will certainly hear us." (6MR 379).

This Prayer School is to serve believers who seek to deepen their individual and/or corporate prayer life, and/or start a local intercessory prayer ministry. The weekend event includes **1**. a seminar on Friday/Sabbath with presentations and study on the necessity and the science of intercession, and **2**. two training sessions on Sunday morning and afternoon. The Prayer School is a necessary preparation for, but may not always lead to the immediate establishment, of a local prayer ministry. This permanent ministry may be established at a later date.

Some of the seminar material is also available under theme E. Grow in Grace (see pages 310-312), but it is here studied in greater detail and together with additional resources. The training sessions are for those who desire to establish a prayer ministry.

Intercessory Prayer – 1. Prayer School – 102. Basic Scriptures

SUMMARY: You consider the four texts covering the basics of prayer: our inability to pray right, our repentance, our commitment, our confidence.

God's people do not pray as much and as fervently as He desires and needs them to pray, because many of them are not sufficiently aware.

- 1. that the priesthood of all believers implies that they participate in Jesus' priestly ministry of intercession (Isa 53:12; 61:6; Joel 2:17; Jn 17);
- 2. that intercession plays a crucial role in the great controversy, that is, that God is waiting for the intercessions of His people, so He has just grounds to prefer the exercise of His mercy on sinners over His right to execute justice (Eze 22:30-31; Joel 2:17; Lk 23:34; Ac 7:60);
- 3. how intense God's desire is to answer prayers so He can bestow His love and grace upon them (Joel 2:18-32; Mt 7:7-8; 21:22; Jn 16:23-24);
- 4. how prayer actually works, that is, why we need help and where its effectual power is found (Rom 8:26-27; Ps 37:3-5; 1 Jn 5:14-15).

"Our heavenly Father waits to bestow upon us the fullness of His blessing. It is our privilege to drink largely at the fountain of boundless love. What a wonder it is that we pray so little! God is ready and willing to hear the sincere prayer of the humblest of His children, and yet there is much manifest reluctance on our part to make known our wants to God. What can the angels of heaven think of poor helpless human beings, who are subject to temptation, when God's heart of infinite love yearns toward them, ready to give them more than they can ask or think, and yet they pray so little and have so little faith?...Why should the sons and daughters of God be reluctant to pray, when prayer is the key in the hand of faith to unlock heaven's storehouse, where are treasured the boundless resources of Omnipotence?" (SC 94-95). What hinders us to ask in faith? (Mt 21:22).

"When Jesus was upon the earth. He taught His disciples how to pray. He directed them to present their daily needs before God, and to cast all their care upon Him. And the assurance He gave them that their petitions should be heard, is assurance also to us. Jesus Himself, while He dwelt among men, was often in prayer. Our Saviour identified Himself with our needs and weakness, in that He became a suppliant, a petitioner, seeking from His Father fresh supplies of strength, that He might come forth braced for duty and trial. He is our example in all things." (SC 93).

The desired result from this study is an increase in effectual intercession among God's people. Are we availing ourselves of it?

SUMMARY: You recognize that **disciples** are called to be a royal **priesthood** (Ex 19:6; 1 Pe 2:9), as they are **participating** in Jesus' priestly ministry.

God's gracious and glorious plan of salvation provides opportunities for His remnant people to participate in the priestly work of offering sacrifices and making intercession: **1.** Since apostolic days, as the body of Christ, we participate in Jesus' priestly ministry. **2.** During the last days, the members of the body of Christ who join the great reformatory movement partake of its spirit of intercession.

This Scripture reveals one of the fundamental weaknesses of sinful humanity: we don't know how or what to pray. "Because of the dimness of our human vision, we do not know whether the blessing we request will be the best for us. Only God knows the end from the beginning." (6BC 573).

Intercessory Prayer – 1. Prayer School – 105. On Psalm 37:4

SUMMARY: Here you find the key to understanding the process of effectual prayer, which is illustrated by Adam's experience in Genesis 1:18-23.

Psalm 37:4 says, "Delight thyself also in the Lord; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart." This helps us understand how effectual or answered prayer works. If "we choose and love what God loves, we shall enjoy the desires (literally 'petitions') of our hearts." (3BC 722).

"All true obedience comes from the heart. It was heart work with Christ. And if we consent, He will so identify Himself with our thoughts and aims, so blend our hearts and minds into conformity to His will, that when obeying Him we shall be but carrying out our own impulses. The will, refined and sanctified, will find its highest delight in doing His service....[in] a life of continual obedience....[S]in will become hateful to us." (DA 668).

In other words, God will first share His will with us as desires; then, He will give us what we desire as we bring it to Him as a petition. In this way, God sees to it that our petitions match up with His actual plans for us, and so He is willing to answer these prayers; they are effectual.

The first Biblical illustration of this divine method is the process of Adam missing, desiring, and finally receiving a fitting partner, Ge 2:18:23. Through the influence of His Holy Spirit, God also uses this process to put His desires for other people into the hearts of intercessors, who, as a result, will then intercede for them according to His will, that is, in Jesus' name, and He will answer these prayers as well (Jn 14:13-14; 15:16; 16:23).

Will God's people become excited and diligent about praying in this way, the only way to be effectual in intercession?

Intercessory Prayer – 1. Prayer School – 106. The Power of Prayer

SUMMARY: You see that the power or success of prayer is secured only, when all three divine persons are involved in the process of prayer.

"The glory that rested upon Christ [after His baptism] is a pledge of the love of God for us. It tells us of the power of prayer, -- how the human voice may reach the ear of God, and our petitions find acceptance in the courts of heaven." (*DA 113*). "It is a wonderful thing that we can pray effectually, that unworthy, erring mortals possess the power of offering their requests to God. What higher power can man desire than this, -- to be linked with the infinite God? Feeble, sinful man has the privilege of speaking to his Maker. We may utter words that reach the throne of the Monarch of the universe. We may speak with Jesus as we walk by the way, and He says, I am at thy right hand." (*MYP 250*). Wow!!

The Lord has always been calling, encouraging, and even waiting for people to speak with Him (Ge 3:9; 4:9-10; 1 Ki 19:9; Eze 22:30; Joel 2:17-19; Mt 7:7; Jn 14:13; 15:7,16; 16:23-24; Heb 4:16; Jas 5:15; *DA* 667). However, we realize that even as believers we do not know how or what to pray according to His will, and that for our prayers to be effectual, we totally depend on the inspiration of the Holy Spirit (Rom 8:26; *1SM* 344). As we remain in God's Word and will (Ge 2:19-20; Jn 15:7) and walk in His Spirit (Rom 8:1,14), He impresses us about our true needs (Jn 16:8-11; *5T* 632-633) and how to pray (Rom 8:26), and enables us to fulfill the various conditions for effectual prayer (*COL* 133-149).

Therefore, the key to the power of prayer lies in the believers' full reliance on God's Spirit. He always inspires us according to God's will since He knows it (Rom 8:27; 1 Co 2:10). And because He is also the Spirit of Christ (Rom 8:9), the prayers He inspires us to offer are in Jesus' name (Jn 14:13; 15:16; 16:23). The secret of their power or success is, that Jesus will now make such prayers His own and purify them so they become acceptable to God (*AG 154; DA 667-668; 8T 178*). As Jesus' followers pray in His name, relying on the Holy Spirit, they may have confidence that "God will hear the earnest entreaties of His people. The prayer of faith will move the arm of God." (*ST 09-04-1879*; Jn 16:23).

Are God's remnant people ready and eager to engage in such powerful, effectual, Spirit-led intercession for each other and others (1 Ti 2:1)? Are they willing and committed to be involved, together with holy angels, in God's answer to their prayers in Jesus' name (*ML 19; AG 154*)? In short, do we long and are we receptive for the spirit of intercession within our great reformatory movement (*8T 251; 9T 126*)?

God answers prayers: He receives them from Jesus as His desires, which His own Son enables Him to accept.

STEP 5

The Heavenly Father

- a) accepts the prayers of His people through Jesus' intercession (1 Jn 5:14; AG 154);
- **b)** grants their desires according to His, i.e., Jesus' will (Ps 37:4; Jn 15:16; 1 Jn 5:15);
- c) involves angels and His people in answering their prayers (2 Ki 5:1-14; Jn 9:1-7; *ML* 19).

STEP 1

The Lord God

- a) has a plan for every individual and His church (Ge 2:18; Jer 29:11; Rom 8:14-17);
- b) puts it into us as desires as we remain in His Word & will (Ge 2:19-20; Ps 37:4-5; Jn 15:7);
- c) awaits the prayer requests of His people (Joel 2:17-19; Mt 7:7; Lk 11:9-13; Jn 16:24).

God calls for prayers: He gives them to people as their desires, which His own Spirit enables them to express.

STEP 4

The Lord Jesus

- **a)** makes the prayers of His people His own (6T 364; DA 667; LHU 190; Pr 13, 35);
- b) mingles them with His purity so God can accept them (1SM 344; AG 154; 8T 178);
- c) presents them before God in intercession (Rom 8:34; Heb 7:25; 1SM 344).

- **a)** makes us feel our true needs (5*T* 632-633), moves us to pray (1SM 344; DA 189);
- **b)** helps us to pray "as we ought" (Rom 8:26), i.e., to meet the conditions (COL 133-149);
- c) gives us earnestness & intensity in prayer as a divine pledge of abundant help (COL 147).

Summary of the human problem:

Our God has many good gifts for us that He wants to bestow upon us. But He will not force them on us, so He needs us to ask for them. However, we often do not know that and why we need these gifts, let alone how to pray for them.

STEP 3

The People of God

- **a)** are empowered to fulfill the conditions for answered prayer (*COL* 133-149).
- **b)** pray in Jesus' name (Jn 14:13-14; *DA* 668), according to God's will (1 Jn 5:14);
- c) but do so through their corrupt humanness (1SM 344; AG 154; TMK 75)

Summary of the divine solution:

Our God wants all our prayers to be effectual, i.e., according to His will, so He can answer them all. This is why He gives us His Word and His Spirit Who inspires correct prayers, and He receives them from His Son Who made them acceptable to Him.

Intercessory Prayer – 1. Prayer School – 107. Conditions to Answers

SUMMARY: You also realize that prayers can be effective only to the degree, to which you fulfill the divine conditions and claim the promises.

Just as our Heavenly Father always heard the prayers of His own Son (Jn 11:41-42; Heb 5:7), so is He wants to answer all our prayers (Mt 21:22; Jn 14:13; 15:16; 16:23; 1 Jn 5:14). He wants us to trust that He will do so (1 Jn 5:15), if we pray in such a way that He can. These conditions (*DA 126*) are not arbitrary burdens, but rather promises we claim by faith (Eze 36:26-27; *COL 333; Ed 126; MB 76*). They are not given to persuade God to act, but so we and others become receptive for what He already has in store (Isa 65:24; Mt 6:7-8; 7:7-11).

Once we pray according to God's will, we can expect surprises and miracles. He delights to do much more than we can ask or imagine (Eph 3:20). Our God promises and loves to answer each and all our petitions and intercessions, whenever we...

[&]quot;To claim that prayer will always be answered in the very way and for the particular thing that we desire, is presumption." (SC 97).

Intercessory Prayer - 2. Prayer Service - 201. Principles and Outline

SUMMARY: The prayer service is the second step by which you seek and through which you see the divine power in true revival and reformation.

Prayer is the key to a true, heartfelt revival and reformation. Perhaps, "We are not willing enough to trouble the Lord with our petitions, and to ask Him for the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Lord wants us to trouble Him in this matter. He wants us to press our petitions to His throne." (*LDE 188-189*). He well knows that a "revival of true godliness among us is the greatest and most urgent of all our needs....But it is our work, by confession, humiliation, repentance, and earnest prayer, to fulfill the conditions upon which God has promised to grant us His blessing. A revival need be expected only in answer to prayer." (*1SM 121; LDE 189*). This service is based on three Biblical principles on prayer.

- **1.** "We are exhorted to be 'instant in prayer.' [Rom 12:12], 'to pray without ceasing.' [1 Th 5:17]. We are to keep a spirit of intercession, and present all our wants to God....You can never weary the Lord by your importuning." (*ST 05-28-1896*). "Through divine agency, we have the spirit of intercession, whereby we may plead with God, as a man pleadeth with his friend." (*ST 10-03-1892*).
- 2. The Lord promises that "if two of you shall agree on earth as touching any thing that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven." (Mt 18:19). God's people pray, not just in, but as a group in one accord (Ac 1:14; 12:5). "Companies should be gathered together to ask for specific help, for heavenly wisdom, that they may know how to plan and execute wisely." (8T 22).
- 3. The Lord promises total cleansing from unrighteousness and freedom from burdens (1 Jn 1:9; Mt 11:28). So room is created, not for greater evil (Mt 12:43-45), but for divine gifts (Jas 1:17). "It is not enough to make the heart empty; we must have the vacuum filled with the love of God. The soul must be furnished with the graces of the Spirit of God....We must unite with Christ." (*RH 01-24-1893*).

These three principles are the foundation for the outline and progress of the prayer service. "No sooner does the child of God approach the mercy seat than he becomes the client of the great Advocate. At his first utterance of penitence and appeal for pardon Christ espouses his case and makes it His own, presenting the supplication before the Father as His own request." (6*T* 364). In this service, requests leading to an emptying of self are taken to God first, then those for being filled with the fruit of the Spirit, spiritual gifts, and other divine graces.

Intercessory Prayer – 2. Prayer Service – 202. Requests, Faith and Touch

SUMMARY: You see that prayers are made for two types of requests, are based on faith in two parties, and allow for appropriate physical touch.

The apostles could not heal because they lacked faith (Mt 17:14-20). God says the prayer of faith will save the sick, and He will heal (Jas 5:15). So it is just as essential for intercessors to ask themselves if they have the faith that God will hear them (1 Jn 5:14-15).

Intercessory Prayer – 2. Prayer Service – 203. Attitudes and Gifts

SUMMARY: As a member of the prayer ministry team, you maintain particular attitudes and exercise the specific gifts the Spirit may apportion.

Members of the prayer ministry team understand that for the prayer service to be effective, it is necessary that they maintain certain attitudes and exercise specific spiritual gifts as the Holy Spirit enables them (1 Co 121:11). Both these attitudes and the gifts serve to safeguard 1. a sense of safety for the recipients of ministry that allows them to freely express themselves, 2. a spirit of openness toward the Holy Spirit that allows Him to do His work without the interference of human ideas, and 3. harmony between team members in submission to God's plan.

Intercessory Prayer – 3. Prayer Ministry – 301. Outline and Planning

SUMMARY: The prayer school is the third step by which you seek and through which you see the divine power in true revival and reformation.

Intercession is as vital to the experience of revival and reformation as to the continuing and growing life of any local congregation. "In visions of the night, representations passed before me of a great reformatory movement among God's people. Many were praising God. The sick were healed, and other miracles were wrought. A spirit of intercession was seen, even as was manifested before the great Day of Pentecost." (9T 126). "As ministering spirits angels are sent forth to minister to those who shall be heirs of salvation. Pray..., pray as you have never prayed before. We are not prepared for the Lord's coming. We need to make thorough work for eternity." (4BC 1173).

Once an intercessory prayer ministry group has been formed during or after the Prayer School weekend, a permanent local prayer ministry may be established at any time, in agreement with and under the guidance of the local church leadership. It is recommended that an elder be a member of the ministry team. This team will plan and conduct all future local prayer services.

A. Resolute Loyal Love - 1. Awake to Our Present Time - 101. The Blessings of Jesus

SUMMARY: Before we go into details, remember that whatever Jesus requires of you as His disciple, is actually meant for your own happiness.

Jesus is calling us to discipleship, so we may engage in the inevitable conflict and become more than conquerors through His own love (Rom 8:37). He promises us this victory and shows us how gain it – as the only way to true happiness now and for all eternity.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus gives His inaugural address as the King of His new kingdom of divine grace (Mt 5:1-8:1; Lk 6:17-49). Right at its beginning (Mt 5:1-12), He "proclaims that the main objective of the kingdom is to restore the lost happiness of Eden to the hearts of men, and that those who choose to enter in by the 'strait' gate and the 'narrow' way (Matt. 7:13, 14) will find true happiness." (5BC 324).

In the book of Revelation, Jesus announces His soon return as the King of kings finally to establish His eternal kingdom of divine glory (Da 7:14). Throughout the book, He gives some more blessings and instructions to His beloved remnant people in these last days, so they may not only retain their happiness in the present kingdom of grace on earth, but also secure it for the soon coming kingdom of glory.

A. Sound the Trumpet – 1. Awake to Our Present Time – 102. The Ultimate Exodus

SUMMARY: The other good news is that in your training as a disciple, Jesus is actually preparing you for our ultimate exodus from this sinful world.

In anticipation of the rebellion of Lucifer and the resulting great controversy between Jesus and Satan (Eze 28:13-19; Isa 14:12-15; Rev 12:7-9), God conceived His gracious plan of our salvation through His Son (Mt 1:21; Jn 3:16) before Their creation of our world (Eph 1:4; 1 Pe 1:20; Rev 13:8). Ever since Adam's fall it has been God's goal, as illustrated in the earthly sanctuary, to free His people from the penalty, power, and then the presence of sin (Ge 3:15). In order to accomplish this plan, God provides several stages of freedom, each of which involves a delivery, or an exodus, of faithful believers from sin and/or sinners, through several events at different times in world history. Scripture relates these events to each other.

In the first instance, God gave humanity 120 years to repent of their wickedness (Ge 6:3), while faithful Noah was building the ark and warning his contemporaries of the coming destruction of the world through a global flood. Finally eight, this preacher of righteousness and his family, were saved (Ge 7:23; 2 Pe 2:5). The wickedness of humanity just prior to Jesus' second coming will be "as in the days of Noah" (Mt 24:37). Therefore, as the ark saved Noah from the worldwide flood, so today baptism upon conversion saves believers from the coming global fire (1 Pe 3:18-21; 2 Pe 3:9-12). Jesus' remnant has preached His righteousness for 120+ years, and also calls other believers to make their exodus from fallen Babylon.

The second historical event that typifies the plan of salvation, was the exodus of God's people from their slavery in Egypt and their journey to the prosperity and safety of the Promised Land (Ex 3:8, 17; Lev 20:24). But before the Israelites could be free, they were to eat unleavened bread, kill and eat a lamb without blemish, and apply its blood to their doorposts. Only then would the Lord pass over their dwellings, save them from destruction and enable their exodus from national slavery (Ex 12). Today, since Jesus our Passover is sacrificed, only those who claim His blood by faith and purge the old leaven of sin in their lives, are saved from spiritual slavery and final destruction (1 Co 5:7-8; Rom 3:25; 1 Pe 1:19; Rev 7:14; 20:15).

We are now on the verge of the ultimate exodus into freedom from the presence of sin, as we await and hasten the coming of Jesus. He will take His faithful ones to Himself into their eternal Promised Land (Jn 14:1-3; 2 Pe 3:13; Rev 21:1-7). Are we ready for our ultimate exodus?

A. Sound the Trumpet – 1. Awake to Our Present Time – 103. Prophetic Descriptions

SUMMARY: First then, you need absolute loyal love for Jesus, so you can be vigilant and remain faithful to Him in all aspects of our present time.

Our present time, the time of the end between 1844 and the close of human probation, has been announced and described prophetically in the Scriptures in various ways. All of these aspects point to a critical time of decision and division among God's people, and in the world due to their global witness (Mt 10:32-36; Lk 12:51; Rev 14:6-12; *LDE 172-173*). Soon the great controversy between Christ and Satan will reach its climax as people decide whether they take the mark of the beast or will be faithful to the end (Rev 14:9-12; 2:10).

We need to be awake to our present time so we will not be taken by surprise, but be found ready to be taken home (Rom 13:11; *PK* 626; Rev 19:7). We need to "be sober, be vigilant" so the roaring lion will not devour us (1 Pe 5:8). As always but especially in the last days, "Satan watches eagerly to find Christians off their guard. O that the followers of Christ would remember that eternal vigilance is the price of eternal life. Many have a slumbering faith. Unless they are invigorated, revived, quickened into action, their souls will be lost." (*UL* 200).

In short, our present time is the most crucial period in the history of the church and the world. The choices we make right now effect us eternally. The Scriptures describe ten aspects of our time relating to our conversion, conflict, and conquest.

A. Sound the Trumpet – 1. Awake to Our Present Time – 105. The One Issue of the Great Controversy

SUMMARY: Recall also that Satan hides his true issue and pretends that God's law is at fault. But Jesus and His disciples disprove his claims.

"From the very beginning of the great controversy in heaven it has been Satan's purpose to overthrow the law of God. It was to accomplish this that he entered upon his rebellion against the Creator, and though he was cast out of heaven he has continued the same warfare upon the earth. To deceive men, and thus lead them to transgress God's law, is the object which he has steadfastly pursued. Whether this be accomplished by casting aside the law altogether, or by rejecting one of its precepts, the result will be ultimately the same. He that offends 'in one point,' manifests contempt for the whole law; his influence and example are on the side of transgression; he becomes 'quilty of all.' James 2:10."

"In seeking to cast contempt upon the divine statutes, Satan has perverted the doctrines of the Bible, and errors have thus become incorporated into the faith of thousands who profess to believe the Scriptures. The last great conflict between truth and error is but the final struggle of the long-standing controversy concerning the law of God. Upon this battle we are now entering -- a battle between the laws of men and the precepts of Jehovah, between the religion of the Bible and the religion of fable and tradition. The agencies which will unite against truth and righteousness in this contest are now actively at work." (*GC* 582). Soon they will take legal action against God's law and people (Rev 13:15-17).

The actual issue behind the great controversy is Satan's pride and resulting envy of Christ (Isa 14:12-14; Eze 28:2-17; *GC* 494-495; *DA* 21-22). But in order to conceal and defend his true motive for his rebellion, and to gain followers among angelic and human beings, Satan projected his own characteristics on God, thus leading them to doubt His word and to distrust His goodness (Ge 3:1-5; *DA* 22; *GC* 495). "Unselfishness, the principle of God's kingdom, is the principle that Satan hates; its very existence he denies. From the beginning of the great controversy he has endeavored to prove God's principles of action to be selfish, and he deals in the same way with all who serve God. To disprove Satan's claim is the work of Christ and of all who bear His name." (*Ed* 154). The remnant people of God are called to help vindicate God and His law.

"It is only as the law of God is restored to its rightful position that there can be a revival of primitive faith and godliness among His professed people." (GC 478). Will God's people share in Christ's victory over Satan by obedience to His whole law?

A. Sound the Trumpet – 1. Awake to Our Present Time – 106. The Beast of the Great Controversy

SUMMARY: In order to trace Satan's activities throughout history, you identify him in the prophetic descriptions of Daniel and Revelation.

"The world has no just conception of Satan. He is not thought of as the prince of the world, the general of a vast rebellion, a being logical and philosophical, possessing a powerful intellect. But thus it is. The adversary of God and leader in the great controversy waged against the world's Redeemer, his deceptive powers have been sharpened by constant practice; and in the final crisis he will deceive to their own ruin those who do not now seek to understand his methods of working." (*RH 07-16-1901*). Daniel was shown the "nature of the beast" and his demonic activities as a sequence of 4 beasts, one with 10 horns and a little horn. Revelation depicts Satan three times as a composite beast with 7 heads and 10 horns.

God wants His people to have His wisdom to understand these things (Rev 13:18; 17:9). Are we asking for this wisdom (Jas 1:5)?

A. Sound the Trumpet – 1. Awake to Our Present Time – 108. The Seven Powers of the Great Controversy

SUMMARY: As you study the corporate level of Satan's rebellion, you see that we live under the final powers, 6 to 8. Jesus is soon to return!!

God and Satan pursue their great controversy also on the corporate level. Daniel and Revelation together reveal seven political powers before Christ's kingdom is established. Satan uses paganism or idolatrous nations with counterfeit religions, as well as apostasy or corruption of true religion, to try to force or deceive God's people into allegiance to him (*4BC 1163-1164*). Cooperation between church and state has often been Satan's means to accomplish his rebellious goal. On the other hand, God allows Satan's strategies to affect His people as a test of faith so He can preserve for Himself a faithful remnant, through which He reveals His truth and His power to save (Isa 10:22; Jer 23:3; Joel 2:32; Rom 11:5; Rev 12:17).

In "the rise and fall of empires...above, behind, and through all the play and counterplay of human interest and power and passions," we are to see "the agencies of the all-merciful One, patiently working out the counsels of His own will," the "manifestation of His power who 'removeth kings, and setteth up kings' (Daniel 2:21) – this is to understand the philosophy of history." (*Ed 173-175; PK 499-502*). But also, "for centuries satanic agencies have been at work. Will they now give up without a struggle?" (*7BC 985*). "Not without a struggle does Satan allow the kingdom of God to be built up in the earth. The forces of evil are engaged in unceasing warfare against the agencies appointed for the spread of the gospel..." (*AA 167*).

Therefore, "Let the people of God prepare for what is coming upon the earth." (7BC 985). Are we awake and willing to get ready? Are we equipped to fight the good fight of faith (1 Ti 6:12; Rev 14:12) as we share the last divine message of mercy with a dying world (Rev 14:6-11)?

A. Sound the Trumpet – 1. Awake to Our Present Time – 109. The Two Natures of the Great Controversy

SUMMARY: You then recognize how you participate in Satan's rebellion on the personal level, until you freely choose Jesus' divine nature.

Jesus and Satan fight on the cosmic level in direct confrontation in heaven (Rev 12:7) and on earth (Jude 9; Da 10:13; Mt 4:1-11), on the corporate level through religious idolatry/apostasy (12BC 982-989) and political powers (Rev 13), and on the personal level in each human heart (Ge 3:1-8; Lk 22:3; Jn 8:38-46; 16:8; Jas 1:13-15). "Within the domain of every human heart this controversy is repeated." (DA 116). Each level involves the same "two principles" or "antagonistic motives" that are "contending for supremacy...." (Ed 190). Therefore, every follower of Jesus needs to know "how, whether he will or not, he is even now deciding upon which side of the controversy he will be found." (ibid.).

Through fallen churches and political legislation, the arch enemy uses deception and persecution to try to force the whole human race to join his rebellion against God (Rev 12:9, 13, 17; *UL* 262) and thus deprive Jesus of the joyful reward of His self-sacrifice on Calvary (Isa 53:11; Heb 12:2; *GC* 647, 652, 671; *DA* 680). God, however, through preaching the gospel and compassionate service to suffering humanity, uses truth and love to draw all people to Jesus as their crucified Savior (Jn 12:32; *DA* 759), gives them repentance and forgiveness (Ac 5:31), saves them by grace through faith (Eph 2:8), and makes them children of God and joint-heirs with Christ of His everlasting kingdom (Rom 8:14-17).

In the second battle of the Great Controversy, Christ's death exposed Satan as a liar and murderer (Jn 8:44; *DA* 57), and so defeated him and destroyed his works (Heb 2:14; 1 Jn 3:8). In the fourth battle, "this last conflict of the great controversy" (*PK* 627), the faithful remnant of God's people again will overcome Satan "by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death." (Rev 12:11; 2SM 380). Thus, God is revealed and vindicated in His true character of just, merciful, selfless love, first personally and decisively in the physical body of His Son, and now corporately and globally through the spiritual body of Christ, His church (Eph 3:10-11).

God's people overcome Satan in this final battle only as they take seriously that his own nature is expressed on both the corporate level, in fallen Babylon, which has received her "power, seat, and great authority" from him (Rev 13:12), and on the personal level, in the human heart (Jer 17:9). They are determined to fight the battle on both levels: By coming out and staying clear of Babylon (Rev 18:4; 14:4), the "beast without", they overcome confusion and error; and by repentance from dead works and spiritual pride (Rev 3:1-3, 17-19), they overcome sin and selfishness, the "beast within." They clearly recognize that overcoming on both levels is essential to their salvation (Mt 24:9-13; Rev 2 & 3).

Moreover, God's remnant people know that staying away from institutions led by Satan, his "power without", is not the whole battle, since Satan's "power within" must also be overcome (COL 174-175). Martin Luther is quoted as confessing, "I fear the pope self more than I fear the pope of Rome." (Eli Wigle, Prevailing Prayer, Continental Publishing, 1900, p. 75). "A man may be baptized, and his name placed on church rolls, yet his heart may be unchanged. Hereditary and cultivated tendencies may still work evil in the character." (UL 182). Even true believers may still have "corrupt and sinful habits that must be overcome by vigorous warfare. Every soul is required to fight the fight of faith." (6BC 1111).

Will God's people choose to fight the Great Controversy on both levels and strive to overcome in the victorious nature of their Savior and Lord? Will they help other people understand the Great Controversy and how they can participate in the total victory over sin and error? Will they fight the good fight of faith to the very end and remain faithful until Jesus comes to take them home (1 Ti 6:12; Rev 2:10)?

SUMMARY: Lastly, you identify the powers in the final crisis, and your duty calling for absolute loyal love to Jesus, if you are to share in His victory.

"As God's people approach the final crisis, they must with increasing power proclaim the message He has given them... God's requirements must be laid before those who are transgressing His law. They must be made to understand that this is a life and death question. God's remnant people are to fill the earth with the cry of the third angel." (*RH 07-16-1901*). "The great crisis is just before us. To meet its trials and temptations, and to perform its duties, will require persevering faith. But we may triumph gloriously; not one watching, praying, believing soul will be ensnared by the enemy." (*6T 404*).

Who of God's people are properly preparing for the final crisis as depicted in Rev 17, so they can share in Christ's final victory? Only those who keep all His commandments from loyal loving faith in Him (Jn 14:15; Rev 3:18). We must remember: "The great controversy going on in the world is waging more sharply today than at any period of the world's history..." (*UL 20*). Satan "knoweth that he hath but a short time" (Rev 12:12).

A. Sound the Trumpet - 2. Stand on the Side of Truth - 201. The Two Last Day Movements

SUMMARY: Second, you need complete self-denial in the final crisis to persevere against the satanic counterfeit of the Three Angels' Messages.

"Before the final visitation of God's judgments upon the earth there will be among the people of the Lord such a revival of primitive godliness as has not been witnessed since apostolic times. The Spirit and power of God will be poured out upon His children....The enemy of souls desires to hinder this work; and before the time for such a movement shall come, he will endeavor to prevent it by introducing a counterfeit....There will be manifest what is thought to be great religious interest....Under a religious guise, Satan will seek to extend his influence over the Christian world....Yet none need be deceived. In the light of God's word it is not difficult to determine the nature of these movements." (*GC 464*).

"Two great opposing powers are revealed in the last great battle. On one side stands the Creator of heaven and earth. All on His side bear His signet. They are obedient to His commands. On the other side stands the prince of darkness, with those who have chosen apostasy and rebellion." (7BC 982). "Between the laws of men and the precepts of Jehovah will come the last great conflict of the controversy between truth and error. Upon this battle we are now entering--a battle not between rival churches contending for the supremacy, but between the religion of the Bible and the religions of fable and tradition. The agencies which have united against truth are now actively at work." (PK 625).

The last days of earth's history are of unprecedented spiritual import and impact. Movements of both divine and satanic origins and power are now gathering followers by drawing them into their ranks to get ready for the battle of Armageddon (Rev 16:13-14). Being initiated by opposite spirits, they will necessarily and very soon be on an open collision course (Rev 12:17). By the time probation closes, the human race will have been divided into two distinct and fixed groups with opposite eternal destinies (Rev 22:11). Only those who remain on God's side will finally be saved (Mt 24:13; Rev 2:11). The time is urgent. "Church and state are now making preparations for the last great conflict." (RH 01-23-1908).

Are we making our preparations, both individually and corporately? God is calling on His remnant people now to give humanity, in the power of the latter rain, His final invitation to receive the gospel (Rev 14:6-7; 18:4; 22:17), and His last warning of the tragic results of rejecting it (Rev 14:8-11). The faith of all people will be tested (Rev 3:10; *GC* 560, 605). Already many depart from it and are shaken out (1 Ti 4:1; Heb 12:27), while others purpose their refining and renewing (Mal 3:2; Rev 3:18). "The Lord is calling for self-denying workers to follow in His footsteps, to walk and work for Him...." (8T 28). His probing question is: Will we persevere in the self-denial needed to stand on the side of truth (Lk 18:8)?

A. Sound the Trumpet – 2. Stand on the Side of Truth – 202. The End-Time Elijah

SUMMARY: Here you can see how, by spreading these messages, you help prepare a people for the Lord as did Elijah and John the Baptist.

The prophetic Three Angels' Messages preached in the power of Holy Spirit (Rev 14:6-12; 18:1-4), directly contradict the three demons' messages of the counterfeit trinity (Rev 16:13). As both messages go out to and gather followers from the whole world (Rev 14:6; 16:14), the great controversy between Christ and Satan comes to a climax in the spiritual "Battle of Armageddon" (Rev 16:14-16). Christ, the true High Priest (Heb 6:20) and King of kings (Rev 17:14), and His followers of pure faith, His virgin bride (Rev 14:4; 19:7-9), fight against prostitute Babylon, which is posing as a High Priest (Rev 17:4-5; Ex 28; 39) and a queen (Rev 18:7), and her followers of corrupt faith, her illicit lovers (Rev 17:1-2, 14).

"Armageddon" means "mountain of Megiddo", but there is no mountain by that name, nor was Megiddo itself on a mountain. However, the city is reminiscent of two decisive historic battles: Israel's dramatic victory over Canaanite kings "by the waters of Megiddo" (Jdg 4; 5:19), and Elijah's victory over the priests of Baal on nearby Mount Carmel (1 Ki 18:16-46). Both battles are types of the two aspects of the Battle of Armageddon: 1. As God gave His people of Israel physical victory over kings at Megiddo (Jdg 5:19), so Christ assures His remnant people that when He comes He will destroy the "kings of the earth" and Babylon, which had united to destroy them (Rev 6:14-17; 16:18-21; 17:14-16; 19:19-21).

2. But before "that great day of God Almighty" (Rev 16:14), a <u>spiritual</u> victory is to be gained, a decision secured: As on Mount Carmel the prophet Elijah called the Israelites to follow the true God, so in the Battle of Armageddon God's remnant, through the prophetic Three Angels' Messages (Rev 16:14-16; 18:1-4), calls the end-time world to worship Him. Carmel and Armageddon urge the same decision: Who will you follow or worship, the true Creator God or an idol (1 Ki 18:21; Rev 13:8; 14:7)? It is a matter of life or death (1 Ki 18:37-40; Rev 19:19-21; 20:15). By calling everyone on earth to worship God, "for the hour of His judgment is come" (Rev 14:6), God's remnant acts as His end-time Elijah (7T 141).

This is still our mission. "Thousands were led to embrace the truth preached by William Miller, and servants of God were raised up in the spirit and power of Elijah to proclaim the message." (*EW 233; 1SG 133*). "Those who are to prepare the way for the second coming of Christ are represented by faithful Elijah, as John came in the spirit of Elijah to prepare the way for Christ's first advent. The work of John the Baptist, and the work of those who in the last days go forth in the spirit and power of Elijah to arouse the people from their apathy, are in many respects the same." (*Mar 22*). It is to globally "make straight the way of the Lord" (Isa 40:3-5; Mt 3:3) by making "ready a people prepared for the Lord" (Lk 1:17).

A. Sound the Trumpet – 2. Stand on the Side of Truth – 203. The Comings of the Two Christs

SUMMARY: You also prepare yourself and others for the Lord's return, as you discern Satan's deception when he counterfeits Jesus' coming.

The second coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ has been the "blessed hope" (Tit 2:13) of all true believers who have looked for their final deliverance for centuries (Da 12:1; Heb 11:39-40; Mt 6:10). As this most climactic event of earth's history is drawing closer, Satan knows he has but a short time left (Rev 12:12) to achieve his devious goal to deceive the whole human race into deifying him instead of worshipping the Creator (Isa 14:13-15; Mt 4:9; *LDE 168*). He will attempt this, not just by claiming to be the Christ as many others have before him (Mt 24:5), but by actually personating Him, thereby counterfeiting the coming of the true Christ (2 Th 2:9; *LDE 162-164*).

This will be Satan's greatest delusion, the "crowning act in the drama of deception" (*GC* 624), by which he will mislead almost all the people of the world and attempt to deceive, if it were possible, even the very elect (Mt 24:24). However, the elect are able to discern Satan's trickery. They know that he is not permitted to counterfeit the manner of Jesus' coming and the events associated with it (*LDE* 165-166). They have identified the exact points by which to distinguish between the genuine and the false Christ, and are committed to endure to the end and patiently wait for their true great God and Savior (Mt 24:13; Isa 64:4; 25:9; Tit 2:13), even if they are in the minority (*5T* 136).

God's remnant people look for the glorious future, which their divine Lord has prepared for those who love Him (1 Co 2:9; Jas 2:5). That is why, in the power of the latter rain, they faithfully and powerfully proclaim the true Savior and the true Sabbath, calling people out of Babylon (Rev 18:1-4). This constitutes "the final warning to be given to the inhabitants of the earth." (*GC* 604).

A. Sound the Trumpet – 3. Qualify for the Seal of God – 301. The Purposes and Phases of the Sealing

SUMMARY: Third, you need perpetual abiding in Jesus through His Spirit, since without Him you cannot qualify for or benefit from His sealing.

The sealing of God's faithful people is the means by which the Lord achieves His divine plan for them (Isa 55:11; Jer 27:11).

A seal is a literal impression on a document (Est 3:12) or a spiritual sign for its recipients (Ex 31:13). It contains the name, title, and jurisdiction of its author, thereby declares the authority of the owner, and gives authority to the message to share and act on the message.

In the Scriptures any sealing has three purposes. They apply to the written document such as a letter or a book, to a message such as a law to be proclaimed, as well as to its messenger. This is particularly true for the Ten Commandments and God's people in the last days.

The sealing of God's people is not simply a single one-time occurrence, but a process in four phases. It comes at crucial points in their lives, and will be completed only on the faithful who endure unto the end and are then delivered and saved (Da 12:1; Mt 24:13; Mk 13:13).

Who of God's people are committed to qualify for all stages of the sealing?



A. Sound the Trumpet – 3. Qualify for the Seal of God – 302. Events of the Time of the End

SUMMARY: Only as you abide in Jesus and are sealed, can you remain faithful through the prophesied sequence of the rapid final events.

"We are living in the time of the end. The fast-fulfilling signs of the times declare that the coming of Christ is near at hand." (9T 11).

- (12) The 7 last plagues (GC 614). During 2nd: Death decree against the remnant starts time of Jacob's trouble (GC 615-620). Saints are protected, will not die (EW 283; GC 629-631). During 6th: Battle of Armageddon (Rev 16:16).
- (13) During 7th: <u>Deliverance begins</u> (Da 12:1):
 Death decree not executed, but Christ starts to deliver saints at midnight (*GC* 636).

 <u>Special Resurrection</u> (Da 12:2; Mt 26:64) of all who pierced Christ (Rev 1:7), derided and opposed Him the most, and all who died in the faith of the third angel's message, to behold Him in His glory (*GC* 637), with terror (Rev 6:16) or joy (*LDE* 271-278).
- (14) Coming of Christ (GC 644): 144,000 receive "Seal of final triumph" (AG 200). Wicked destroyed (Jer 25:33), dead saints raised and the living translated; all meet Him in the air ever to be with Him (1 Th 4:15-17).
- "And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh." (Lk 21:28)

A. Sound the Trumpet – 1. Awake to Our Present Time – 107. The Four Battles of the Great Controversy

SUMMARY: Now, look closer at Satan's rebellion: he fights on three levels. Rev 12 describes the cosmic level as four battles. Jesus wins them all.

Every student of the Bible is called to "gain a knowledge of its grand central theme, of God's original purpose for the world, of the rise of the great controversy, and of the work of redemption. He should understand the nature of the two principles that are contending for supremacy, and should learn to trace their working through the records of history and prophecy, to the great consummation. He should see how this controversy enters into every phase of human experience; how in every act of life he himself reveals the one or the other of the two antagonistic motives; and how, whether he will or not, he is even now deciding upon which side of the controversy he will be found." (Ed 190).

In short, the Great Controversy, this "unrelenting war between God and Satan," is fought on three levels, on the "cosmic and the personal levels" (12BC 969), and on the corporate level of both political and spiritual powers. Thus, the age-old conflict provides the Biblical key to the history of nations and religions and their interactions with God's people. Revelation 12 outlines the cosmic level in four major battles. Satan fights against Christ in direct and often unseen confrontations, both in heaven (Rev 12:7; Job 1:6-12) and on earth (Jude 9; Da 10:13; Mt 4:1-11; 16:23). Every one of these battles reveals Jesus and His faithful ones (angelic and human) as overcoming Satan and his followers.

This means, "The last great conflict between truth and error [the fourth battle] is but the final struggle of the long-standing controversy concerning the law of God. Upon this battle we are now entering - a battle between the laws of men and the precepts of Jehovah, between the religion of the Bible and the religion of fable and tradition. The agencies which will unite against truth and righteousness in this contest are now actively at work." (GC 582). Moreover, Satan is very angry with God's people, for he knows he has "but a short time." (Rev 12:12, 17). For this reason, "The great controversy going on in the world is waging more sharply today than at any period of the world's history..." (UL 20).

Are God's people ready for this final battle? And will they remain faithful to Jesus (Lk 18:8)?

B. Hear the Call – 2. Fulfill the Divine Commission – 201. The Double Duty of the Remnant

SUMMARY: Fifth, God requires of you and empowers you to fruit-bearing ministry, so you can help fulfill the double duty of His last day people.

Inspiration calls God's people to wait and watch for the coming of the Lord in an active manner, by sanctifying obedience and sincere ministry. "Christians are not to await their Lord's return in idle expectancy. While waiting and watching they are to be vigilant in purifying their own souls by obedience to the truth, and to be earnest in working for others [DA 634]. It is their privilege 'not only to look for but to hasten the coming of the day of God' (DA 633)." (5BC 505). "Working, waiting, watching, and praying,--this constitutes genuine Christianity." (RH 01-21-1902). We are shown here that sanctification and service require each other. Both are needed to end the delay of the Lord's coming.

Before His ascension to heaven, the Lord commissioned His followers to make disciples of all nations (Mt 28:18-20). He was going to build His church against which the gates of hell shall not prevail (Mt 16:18). Before His second coming, Jesus commissioned His remnant people to preach the three angels' messages to the whole world (Rev 10:11; 14:6-12; 18:1-4). Ever since 1844, He has been preparing His bride to go home with Him into their eternal happiness together (Jn 14:1-4; Rev 21:1-4). This means God's remnant people have a twofold commission or double duty to fulfill, as the three angels' messages provide several parallels but also end-time urgency to the Great Commission.

The Great Commission and the Three Angels' Messages have several <u>common</u> features: **1.** They come with the authority of the Lord Jesus Christ. **2.** Both represent a work of global extent. **3.** They call on believers to prepare for it. **4.** They are empowered by an outpouring of the Holy Spirit. **5.** They proclaim righteousness by faith. **6.** They urge repentance and faith in Christ. **7.** They warn of false teachings, and call true believers to come out of apostate faith groups. **8.** Their proclamation is accompanied by confirming signs and wonders. **9.** Both movements proclaim and anticipate the second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ. In these aspects, the 3AMs simply carry out the Great Commission.

But the two commissions also <u>differ</u> in significant ways: **1.** The Great Commission was and is empowered by the former rain to start and to grow the church; the 3AMs through the latter rain ripen and prepare the church for the harvest at the second coming of Christ (*GC 611*). **2.** Under the Great Commission, the warning against false teachings and the call to come out is directed to people in the OT church and the pagan world; the 3AMs warn against apostasy within the Christian churches and call God's people out of spiritual Babylon. **3.** Under the Great Commission the time of judgment was in the future; the 3AMs proclaim it as a present reality, which adds urgency to the Great Commission.

4. Under the Great Commission the apostles Paul and Peter indicated that the second coming of Jesus was not as near as many expected (2 Th 2:1-4; 2 Pe 3:9); the judgment message of the 3AMs implies it is very near, as the preceding signs are all being fulfilled, including the global preaching of the 3AMs themselves (Mt 24:14). Therefore, while the remnant people of God continue to carry out the Great Commission to make disciples of all nations, they also proclaim its end-time urgency, since the day of judgment is in progress, the second coming or the "day of the Lord" is at hand, and it will come to those who are unprepared as a thief in the night (1 Th 5:1-5; 2 Pe 3:10; Rev 3:3; 16:15).

God has a people for this final work! "He has His thousands who have not bowed the knee to Baal. Such will stand with Him on Mount Zion. But they must stand on this earth, girded with the whole armor, ready to engage in the work of saving those who are ready to perish." (7BC 978). Who of God's remnant people will commit to their double duty of making disciples in and for the last days?

B. Hear the Call - 2. Fulfill the Divine Commission - 202. The Two Phases of Matthew 24:14

SUMMARY: Spirit-empowered, fruit-bearing ministry is ever more necessary as we approach the second phase of last day global preaching.

Of all the statements in Jesus' outline of end-time events, Matthew 24:14 has always inspired Seventh-day Adventists the most to be faithful to their divine commission, as it identifies the preaching in all the world as the final prophetic sign to be fulfilled before their great deliverance at the return of Jesus (Da 12:1). They understand that this preaching hastens His coming as people respond to the call to holiness; because all need it before they can see the Lord, He is waiting and longing to see it manifested in His disciples so He can return (Ac 2:38; Heb 12:14; 2 Pe 3:9-12; *DA* 633-634; *COL* 69). However, the church's failure to do her work as He ordained resulted in His delay, to this day (*DA* 633; *Ev* 695-696; *LDE* 37-38).

On the other hand, the ever increasing use of modern media technology in the global spreading of the three angels' messages has excited God's people as many see in it the complete fulfillment of Matthew 24:14 and thus the final sign that the Lord is coming soon. There is no doubt that ministries using literature, radio, satellites, TV, internet, etc., are reaching people around the globe in creative ways, and in most of the major languages of the world population. At the same time, while many reports at the General Conference Session in Atlanta, GA in 2010 have documented rapid growth of church membership in many part of the world, it was clear that much work remains to be done for yet unreached people groups.

Several sermons at the GC Session have reflected awareness that the work of the global preaching of the Gospel can be finished, and will lead to true conversions, not merely baptisms, only through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in latter rain power. In other words, the great efforts and success of media ministries constitute a first and partial fulfillment of Matthew 24:14, a preaching to all the world by many evangelists from selected locations. But only the global outpouring of the latter rain on God's people enables the final and complete fulfillment, a preaching in all the world by all members who, without media but with the Spirit's power, proclaim the Gospel in their own respective locations (Joel 2:28-32; Rev 18:1-4).

The Spirit of Prophecy confirms this understanding of the two-phase fulfillment of Matthew 24:14. The outpouring of the latter rain Spirit always is assumed or explicitly mentioned (6T 24; AG 353; Mar 261; LED 207-208), and also the two distinct phases are described (GC 611-612; Ev 697-701). While they may well occur simultaneously for a while in various places, the first phase will end once Sunday law enforcement begins to threaten with economic boycott and death (Rev 13:15-17). This means, the first phase, with its emphasis on media ministries, takes place before such threats are enforced and buying and selling are still possible; the second phase, the latter rain, is needed for preaching without such means.

"The angel who unites in the proclamation of the third angel's message is to lighten the whole earth with his glory. A work of world-wide extent and unwonted power is here foretold. The advent movement of 1840-44 was a glorious manifestation of the power of God; the first angel's message was carried to every missionary station in the world, and in some countries there was the greatest religious interest which has been witnessed in any land since the Reformation of the sixteenth century; but these are to be exceeded by the mighty movement under the last warning of the third angel.

"The work will be similar to that of the Day of Pentecost. As the 'former rain' was given, in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at the opening of the gospel, to cause the upspringing of the precious seed, so the 'latter rain' will be given at its close for the ripening of the harvest...'In the last days, saith God, I will pour out of My Spirit upon all flesh.' 'And...whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved.' Acts 2:17, 21.

"The great work of the gospel is not to close with less manifestation of the power of God than marked its opening. The prophecies which were fulfilled in the outpouring of the former rain at the opening of the gospel are again to be fulfilled in the latter rain at its close. Here are 'the times of refreshing' to which the apostle Peter looked forward when he said: 'Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord; and He shall send Jesus.' Acts 3:19, 20.

"Servants of God, with their faces lighted up and shining with holy consecration, will hasten from place to proclaim the message from heaven. By thousands of voices, all over the earth, the warning will be given. Miracles will be wrought, the sick will be healed, and signs and wonders will follow the believers. Satan also works, with lying wonders, even bringing down fire from heaven in the sight of men. Revelation 13:13. Thus the inhabitants of the earth will be brought to take their stand.

"The message will be carried not so much by <u>argument</u> as by the deep <u>conviction</u> of the Spirit of God. The arguments <u>have</u> been presented. The seed <u>has</u> been sown, and <u>now</u> it will spring up and bear fruit. The publications distributed by missionary workers <u>have</u> exerted their influence, yet many whose minds were impressed <u>have</u> been prevented from fully comprehending the truth or from yielding obedience. <u>Now</u> the rays of light penetrate <u>everywhere</u>, the truth is seen in its clearness....A large number take their stand upon the Lord's side." (*GC* 611-612).

Will God's people, while still using modern media, also prepare and be receptive for the power of the latter rain?

B. Hear the Call – 2. Fulfill the Divine Commission – 203. The Process of Disciple-Making

SUMMARY: The fruit that Jesus expects of you is to remain (Jn 15:16), that is, He needs you to be successful in making more true disciples.

When an individual responds to the Gospel message with faith, it may be a true heart conversion, that is, Spirit-wrought sorrow and repentance of sin (2 Co 7:10) and genuine, saving faith in the Lord Jesus Christ (Ac 2:37-41), expressed in mutual love and support (vv. 42-47). Or this faith might merely be a mental assent to doctrines, a dead faith, expressed in a formal religious life without sanctifying spiritual power (Jas 2:17; 2 Ti 3:5). "The faith that is unto salvation is not a casual faith, it is not the mere consent of the intellect, it is belief rooted in the heart, that embraces Christ as a personal Saviour." (1SM 391). "We cannot glorify God with a dead faith. I have made my mark high for heaven and eternal life." (2SG 216).

In either case, one may receive water baptism and become a church member. Nominal members may do wonderful works for a while, but they will eventually be shaken out (*LDE 173-178*; *GC 602*) and finally be rejected by the Lord (Mt 7:23). Only those who were converted in the heart will become true disciples of Jesus. They will do genuine works of service, grow in faith and in the knowledge of Jesus, and seek to fulfill their commission to spread the last message of divine mercy around the globe in the power of the latter rain (Eph 4:12-16; Rev 14:6-12; 18:1-4). They will be willing to even give their lives for the word of God and their testimony about Jesus (Rev 1:2; 12:11), and the Lord will finally take them to Himself (1 Th 4:17).

Therefore, disciple-making is the process that helps believers toward a true heart conversion, supports them in the spiritual growth of their faith, love, and consecration to Jesus Christ, and enables the complete development and compassionate exercise of all their spiritual gifts within the church community and in the world around them. This process advances through the three sections of the sanctuary in six stages of spiritual restoration. Each stage corresponds to a role of Jesus in the life of the disciple, and a Biblical mark of discipleship that involves three steps each, adding up to 18 steps. The biblical end result is a truthful, faithful, and Spirit-filled follower of Jesus who reflects and proclaims Him by a life of selfless service.

B. Hear the Call – 3. Be Ready to Stand at Last – 301. Dress for the Final Battle

SUMMARY: Sixth, the Lord requires you to be an overcoming witness (Rev 12:11), so He supplies His whole armor, and you put it on and pray.

The Lord's deep desire for His people is to secure their redemption that He has obtained for them by His perfect sacrifice (Jn 17:24; Heb 9:11-15). Foreseeing the "great test," indeed, the "final test" (*GC 605; LDE 227-228*) that is to come to His remnant church during the little time of trouble, He keeps expressing His concern for them: "The day of the LORD is great and very terrible; and who can abide it?" (Joel 2:11). "Who may abide the day of his coming? And who shall stand when he appeareth?" (Mal 3:2). "When the Son of man cometh, shall he find ["the"] faith on the earth?" (Lk 18:8). The wicked will ask too late, "For the great day of his wrath is come; and who shall be able to stand?" (Rev 6:17).

The answers to the Lord's concern are: Those will abide or stand who have rent their hearts and turned to the Lord (Joel 2:12-13); those who have allowed the refiner's fire to purify them (Mal 3:2-4); and those who were sealed (Rev 7:1-3) once they had overcome by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, by patiently keeping His commandments in the faith of Jesus (Rev 12:11, 17; 14:12). God's people join in this repentance, purification, and sealing process when they heed the Lord's call given by the apostle Paul to "put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil,...to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand." (Eph 6:11, 13).

"We are engaged in a warfare against the hosts of darkness. Unless we follow our Leader closely, Satan will obtain the victory over us." (*UL 200*). Therefore, "The Christian soldier must be strong in the Lord ["in the power of his might," Eph 6:10]. God is all-sufficient. In the omnipotence of His might gird on the armor. Make use of all the proper means of defense against the enemy....The armor is prepared. Put it on, and fight bravely for the Lord." (*UL 129*). "God wants everyone to stand with the whole armor on, ready for the great review." (*MS 63, 1908*).

Who of God's people will commit to such faithfulness in the strength of Jesus in order to stand at last?

Furthermore, the Lord tells us how, or in what spirit to wear the armor effectively, so we will not only fight but actually win the battle. He gives us the double admonition to pray continuously and watch perseveringly (Eph 6:18), just as He told His first disciples. They needed to watch and pray when He was about to accomplish the first part of His work of atonement, His suffering in Gethsemane, and His sacrificial death on Calvary (Mt 26:41; Mk 14:38). So now His remnant must watch and pray while He is about to finish the second part of this work, the cleansing of the sanctuary in heaven and the judgment of His people on earth, in preparation of His return in glory (Mk 13:33; Lk 21:36; 1 Pe 4:7).

The reason we need to watch and pray is still the same: so we do not "enter into temptation" (Mt 26:41; Mk 14:38). Back then, the disciples "did not realize the necessity of watchfulness and earnest prayer in order to withstand temptation." So Jesus "feared that they would not be able to endure the test which would come upon them in His betrayal and death" (*DA 688-689*). Indeed, they failed to watch and pray with Him (Mt 26:40, 43; Mk 14:37, 40), when the hour of His suffering had come (Mt 26:45; Mk 14:41; Jn 17:1). As a result, one denied and all forsook Him (Mt 26:56, 69-75; Mk 14:50, 66-72) just as He had forewarned them that they would (Mt 26:31-35; Mk 14:27-31; Lk 22:31-35; Jn 6:32).

"In these sleeping disciples He sees a representation of a sleeping church. When they should be watching, they are asleep." (5BC 1104). The Lord warned us that in the last days His people would also be asleep (Mt 25:5), though "the hour of his judgment is come" (Rev 14:7) and "the great test of loyalty," indeed, the "final test" (GC 605; Rev 3:10), will soon come upon us in the global Sunday law. So Jesus urges us now to "awake out of sleep," put on the armor (Rom 13:11-14), and "take heed, watch and pray" (Mk 13:33). "While engaged in our daily work, we should lift the soul to heaven in prayer. The Christian whose heart is thus stayed upon God cannot be overcome." (MYP 249; Pr 123).

Who will take heed, watch and pray so as to finally "stand before the Son of man" (Lk 21:34-36)?

B. Hear the Call - 3. Be Ready to Stand at Last - 302. "Add" and "Buy of Me"

SUMMARY: Just as His whole armor, the Lord also provides the plan of addition and three essential gifts, so you may overcome as He did.

"Add": That end-time disciples may be equipped and ready to stand in spiritual strength, God provides the plan of addition in 2 Pe 1:5-10: "Giving all diligence, add to your faith..., for if you do these things, ye shall never fall." (vv. 5, 10). "'All diligence' means...a daily diligence. There is danger that we shall be blind in regard to the working of satanic agencies, and that we shall be ensnared by Satan's alluring temptations. Therefore the word comes to us, 'Giving all diligence,' add to your character the graces that will make you strong to resist evil." (7BC 943-944). "The work of transformation from unholiness to holiness is a continuous one....[As man] works on the plan of addition, God works for him on the plan of multiplication. Our Saviour is always ready to hear and answer the prayer of the contrite heart, and grace and peace are multiplied to His faithful ones." (AA 532).

"Buy of Me": In order to remedy their deplorable condition, the Lord Jesus is still urging His end-time remnant church of Laodicea in Rev 3:14-22: "I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot....I counsel thee to buy of me gold tried in the fire..., white raiment..., and eyesalve....As many as I love I rebuke and chasten: be zealous therefore, and repent. Behold, I stand at the door and knock." (vv. 15, 18-20). "The chastening reveals a hope of reform....I saw that this call to the Laodicean church will affect souls. A becoming zeal is called for by God on our part....The counsel of the true Witness does not represent those who are lukewarm as in a hopeless case. 

C. Come to Life - 002. Dynamic Circles of Love

SUMMARY: Consider and appreciate now the **receiving** side of that circle of love, which forms **phase 1** in the discipling process.

The first theme and mark of discipleship in each phase cover the <u>receiving</u> side of the relationship, the second theme and mark the <u>giving</u> side. Jesus said, "Come to Me, Learn of Me." (Mt 11:28-30); then, "Go for Me into all the world." (Mk 16:15; Mt 28:20). So the three circles of love together form the <u>process</u> by which Jesus builds His church (Mt 16:18): **1.** He calls her to Himself (Mt 16:24), **2.** grows her into His full stature (Eph 4:13; 5:27), and **3.** sends her to complete her number (Rom 11:25-26). Then He will return to take His beloved bride home into God's eternal glory (Jn 14:1-3).



C. Come to Life – 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus – 101. God's Love for His World

SUMMARY: You take step 1 in the discipling process, as you believe the Gospel of God's love and respond to it with absolute love for Jesus.

"'God is love.' 1 John 4:16. His nature, His law, is love. It ever has been; it ever will be....With Him 'is no variableness, neither shadow of turning.' James 1:17. Every manifestation of creative power is an expression of infinite love. The sovereignty of God involves fullness of blessing to all created beings." (*PP* 33). "In the beginning, God was revealed in all the works of creation. It was Christ that spread the heavens, and laid the foundations of the earth. It was His hand that hung the worlds in space, and fashioned the flowers of the field... It was He that filled the earth with beauty, and the air with song. And upon all things in earth, and air, and sky, He wrote the message of the Father's love." (*DA* 20; *MM* 10).

"The message that the sinner should hear is, 'God so loved the world, that He gave His only-begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (*GW 154-155; Ev 189;* Jn 3:16). "In order to break down the barriers of prejudice and impenitence, the love of Christ must have a part in every discourse. Make men to know how much Jesus loves them, and what evidences He has given them of His love. What love can equal that which God has manifested for man, by the death of Christ on the cross? When the heart is filled with the love of Jesus, this can be presented to the people, and it will affect hearts." (*Lt 48, 1886; Ev 189*). Is our heart totally filled with Jesus' love?



C. Come to Life – 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus – 102. Gabriel's Prophecy of the Messiah

SUMMARY: You see God's love for you in His prophecy that identifies Jesus as your Savior, and 1844 as the beginning of your final judgment.

The 2300 Evenings and Mornings (Dan 8:14)

The vision in Da 8 with the 2,300-day/year prophecy was given in "the third year of the reign of king Belshazzar" (8:1), i.e., in 550/549 BC, but "none understood" it (8:27).

The 70-week/490-year prophecy (9:20-27) came in answer to Daniel's prayer (9:1-19), in "the first year of Darius" (9:1), or 539/538 BC, to bring understanding to Daniel (9:22).

All details of the 70th week or last 7 years were fulfilled in the life and work of Jesus who thus proved to be the *Messiah* (9:25) or *Christ* (Mt 16:16), the One *anointed* or empowered by the Holy Spirit (Isa 61:1; Lk 4:17-21; Ac 10:38).

Jesus lived "that it might be fulfilled." (Mt 1:22) and died "according to the scriptures" (1 Co 15:3), to fulfill all things "written in the law of Moses, the prophets, and in the psalms." (Lk 24:27, 44). The Scriptures testify of Him (Jn 5:39).

Daniel 9:24

The Purpose of Jesus' Life and Work

1. To finish transgression:

Restrain: Jesus called the Jews to accept Him as the fulfillment of the covenant with Abraham (Ge 17:1-8; Gal 3:16; Mt 23:37). **Complete:** Jesus' rejection (Jn 1:11) ended Jewish probation (Ac 7:52; Rom 10:1-4).

2. To make an end of sins:

Jesus takes sin away (Jn 1:29), becoming sin (2 Co 5:21) & giving Himself (Gal 1:4).

- 3. To make reconciliation for iniquity: Jesus died so God can reconcile people to Himself (Rom 5:10; 2 Co 5:19).
- **4. To bring in everlasting righteousness:**Jesus is our righteousness (1 Co 1:30).
 He imputes & imparts it to us (2 Co 5:21).
- 5. To seal up the vision and prophecy:
 Jesus confirms or ratifies it by fulfilling its time predictions (Mk 1:15; Gal 4:4).

6. To anoint the Most Holy:

The earthly sanctuary was anointed to inaugurate divine service (Ex 40:9). The anointing of the heavenly sanctuary points forward to Jesus' high priestly, intercessory ministry there following His ascension (Heb 9:12, 21, 24)

Daniel 9:25

The Timing of Jesus' Life and Work

1. From the going forth of the commandment: Decree of Persian King Artaxerxes I "in the seventh year of the king" (Ezr 7:7), 457 BC, implemented in the fall. Authorized the Jews to rebuild the temple & the city of Jerusalem (Ezr 7:11-28).

2. Unto Messiah the Prince:

This can only refer to Jesus, since He is the one who fulfilled the time frame given here.

3. Seven, and threescore and two weeks: 69 prophetic weeks are 483 years. Counting from 457 BC, this leads to the fall of AD 27, since there is no year "zero."

That fall, Jesus was baptized and anointed & began His public ministry "in the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar" (Lk 3:1, 21, 22). "The time is fulfilled." (Mk 1:15).

Daniel 9:24-27 – Summary

The exact and complete fulfillment of the 70week prophecy in the life and work of Jesus proves Him to be the predicted Messiah and testifies to the reliability and power of God's Word (Isa 55:11; Jn 17:17).

Daniel 9:26-27

The "Last Week" of Jesus' Life and Work

- **1. After threescore and two [62] weeks:** After the fall of AD 27, the beginning of the 70th week of the prophecy.
- 2. Messiah shall be cut off:

Jesus would be cut off (Isa 53:8), that is, die, to "cut" (Ge 15:8-18) or mediate the New Covenant in His blood (Lk 22:20).

- **3. But not for himself:** Or, shall have nothing: Jesus sacrificed Himself to save others (Isa 53:5-8; Mt 20:28; 26:28; 1 Co 15:3).
- **4. The people of the prince shall... destroy:** Titus' army destroyed Jerusalem in AD 70.
- 5. Confirm the covenant for one week:
 For 7 years, AD 27-34, Jesus and then His disciples confirmed the promise (Rom 15:8; Ac 2:38-39). After Stephen's death (Ac 7:59) the Gospel went to the Gentiles (Mt 21:43; 24:14; 28:18-20; Ac 11:5-18; 13:45-49).
- **6. Midst of the week...cause to cease:**After 3½ years, in the spring AD 31, Jesus

died; the temple veil was torn in two, marking the end of the sacrificial system (Mt 27:51). Type met Antitype, "Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us" (1 Co 5:7), the new and living way into the Holiest (Heb 10:12-22).

Daniel 8:14 – Summary

Since the 490-year prophecy ended in AD 34, AD 1844 marks the end of the 2,300-year prophecy, and thus the beginning of Jesus' high priestly ministry of the cleansing of the heavenly sanctuary, or the pre-advent judgment. This present truth is confirmed and proclaimed by the Three Angels' Messages (Rev 14:6-11; 18:1-4), which have been entrusted to God's remnant church (Rev 10:11; 12:17; 14:12).

For the perfecting of the saints... Eph 4:12

C. Come to Life – 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus – 103. The Great Central Truth

SUMMARY: You see God's love for you in Jesus' death on the cross, the center of all other truths and the only reason for your end-time victory.

The Gospel of Jesus Christ centers on His self-sacrifice for the salvation of the human race. "There is one great central truth to be kept ever before the mind in the searching of the Scriptures--Christ and Him crucified. Every other truth is invested with influence and power corresponding to its relation to this theme. It is only in the light of the cross that we can discern the exalted character of the law of God. The soul palsied by sin can be endowed with life only through the work wrought out upon the cross by the Author of our salvation." (MS 31, 1890; 7ABC 458).

The cross is the only key to all other truths. "The sacrifice of Christ as an atonement for sin is the great truth around which all other truths cluster. In order to be rightly understood and appreciated, every truth in the word of God, from Genesis to Revelation, must be studied in the light that streams from the cross of Calvary. I present before you the great, grand monument of mercy and regeneration, salvation and redemption,—the Son of God uplifted on the cross. This is to be the foundation of every discourse given by our ministers." (*GW 315; 7ABC 457*).

The cross exerts a most powerful attraction and guarantees the greatest victory. "The cross of Calvary challenges, and will finally vanquish every earthly and hellish power. In the cross all influence centers, and from it all influence goes forth. It is the great center of attraction; for on it Christ gave up His life for the human race. This sacrifice was offered for the purpose of restoring man to his original perfection. Yea, more, it was offered to give him an entire transformation of character, making him more than a conqueror. Those who in the strength of Christ overcome the great enemy of God and man, will occupy a position in the heavenly courts above angels who have never fallen." (MS 56, 1899; 6BC 1113).

The cross is therefore the only reason for our faithfulness in the final crisis. "The only way in which men will be able to stand firm in the conflict is to be rooted and grounded in Christ. They must receive the truth as it is in Jesus. And it is only as the truth is presented thus that it can meet the wants of the soul. The preaching of Christ crucified, Christ our righteousness, is what satisfies the soul's hunger. When we secure the interest of the people in this great central truth, faith and hope and courage come to the heart." (LDE 151). Is the cross the center of your life?

8. Second Coming

The cross establishes the new covenant, opening a new way to the holiness we need to see God, which hastens the Lord's coming. (Heb 10:7-22; 12:14; 2 Pe 3:11-12).

7. Heavenly Sanctuary

Jesus' cross shed the blood He

now pleads for repenting sinners,

and by which He still cleanses the

sanctuary from all confessed sin.

(Da 8:14; Rom 8:34; Heb 7:25; 9:23).

1. Great Controversy

The cross glorifies God, proving His selfless love and the validity of His law, exposing Satan as a liar and murderer, and casting him out. (Jn 3:16; 8:44; 12:28-31; Mt 5:17-18).



2. Biblical Marriage

The cross models the agape love that Christian spouses are called to show to each other, reflecting Jesus' own love for His church. (Isa 54:5; Jn 3:29; Eph 5:21-32).

The CROSS of Christ

Jesus' sinless life and self-sacrifice enable the restoration of God's image in repenting and believing humanity, to secure their eternal redemption and unity in Christ for all creation. (Mk 1:15; Jn 10:18; Heb 5:9; 9:12, 15; Eph 1:9-14; 2 Pe 3:13; Rev 21:1).



3. Seventh-day Sabbath

Jesus' cross and Sabbath rest parallel His rest after creation, enabling believers to rest by faith also in His finished recreation. (Ge 2:2-3; Heb 4:4-11; 2 Co 5:17).



6. Christian Stewardship

The cross reveals the self-denial we need to serve others by the proper use and increase of God's gifts through faithful stewardship. (Lk 12:42; 1 Co 4:1-2; 1 Pe 4:10).



5. Second Probation

The cross grants fallen humanity more history as a second chance to show obedience to God's law, by God's Spirit, in love for Jesus. (Rom 8:1-4; Jn 14:15, 23; 15:10)



4. Sin and Death

The cross, death, and resurrection of Jesus prove that the wages of sin is the second death, and the first death is a sleep in the grave. (Mt 27:46; Jn 11:11-15, 43; 20:17).

C. Come to Life – 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus – 104. His Experience of the Cross

SUMMARY: Your love for Jesus grows when you study and ponder His experience of suffering and death on the cross, as He Himself describes it.

May we all "behold what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us" (1 Jn 1:3) through the suffering and death of Christ, as Jesus describes it in His own words. "Having loved his own which were in the world, He loved them unto the end." (Jn 13:1). "Hanging upon the cross Christ was the gospel....This is our message, our argument, our doctrine, our warning to the impenitent, our encouragement for the sorrowing, the hope for every believer. If we can awaken an interest in men's minds that will cause them to fix their eyes on Christ, we may step aside, and ask them only to continue to fix their eyes upon the Lamb of God." (MS 49, 1898; 7ABC 458). May we ever and only "glory in the cross...." (Gal 6:14).

C. Come to Life – 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus – 105. The Depth of God's Love

SUMMARY: You can see the mystery of God's love in yet greater depth, as you consider the divine anguish, not only of Jesus but of the Father.

"Behold what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us." (1 Jn 3:1). "Having loved his own which were in the world, He loved them unto the end." (Jn 13:1). "God commendeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Rom 5:8). "...that the love wherewith Thou hast loved me may be in them, and I in them." (Jn 17:26). "This is my commandment, that ye love one another, as I have loved you." (Jn 15:12). Not only will the love of God be our eternal study and joy, but it is here and now to be the principle of the disciples' life.

"God's wonderful purpose of grace, the mystery of redeeming love, is the theme into which 'angels desire to look,' and it will be their study throughout endless ages. Both the redeemed and the unfallen beings will find in the cross of Christ their science and their song. It will be seen that the glory shining in the face of Jesus is the glory of self-sacrificing love. In the light from Calvary it will be seen that the law of self-renouncing love is the law of life for earth and heaven; that the love which 'seeketh not her own' has its source in the heart of God." (DA 19).

The true height and depth of this selfless, self-sacrificing love of Jesus is nowhere else more dramatically and ultimately revealed than during those despairing hours on the cross, when the Savior felt nothing but the guilt of humanity and the wrath of God against sin; when He was not upheld by the joy that previously had been set before Him of seeing souls eternally saved; when He had no assurance of His own resurrection and return to glory, but only the fear that the separation from His beloved Father might be for eternity – and yet, even then, He did not give in to the demonic challenges of the bystanders to come down from the cross and save Himself, but chose to give Himself up for us all (1 Ti 2:6; Tit 2:14).

C. Come to Life - 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus - 106. The Streams of Compassion

SUMMARY: The more you ponder the Father's suffering with His Son, the deeper you appreciate His infinite compassion and matchless love.

Some people tend to interpret the sacrificial death of Jesus on Calvary as a means to appease the righteous wrath of God against sinful humanity, as the way by which God's Son reconciled His Father in heaven to humanity on earth, or changed His wrath toward them into love and acceptance. But this view reflects more the heathens' fear of their ill-minded gods (*PK 124*) than the compassionate God of the Bible. **1.** It is true that "the wrath of God is revealed from heaven," yet His wrath is directed, not against the people themselves, but "against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men" (Rom 1:18), that is, against the sin in them. God "hates the sin, but loves the sinner." (*DA 462*).

- **2.** Jesus did not come to turn the Father's wrath into love, but because the Father Himself loved the world, He sent and gave His Son (Jn 3:16). "Behold what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us." (1 Jn 3:1). "God commendeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Rom 5:8). In love, God took His wrath against our sin upon Himself by making Jesus to be that sin for us (2 Co 5:21). **3.** God did not need to be reconciled to the world, but rather humanity to God (2 Co 5:19); and the call to reconciliation still goes out to every individual as Jesus' last day disciples spread the three angels' messages (2 Co 5:20-21; Rev 14:6-12; 18:1-4).
- **4.** Though on the cross God's Son experienced the wages of sin, eternal death, as separation from His Father (Rom 6:23; Mt 27:46), the Father did not leave His Son to suffer by Himself but suffered that separation with Him in His own heart, enduring the "sundering of the divine powers." (*7BC 924*). "The heart of God yearned with greatest sorrow when His Son, the guiltless, was suffering the penalty of sin." (*ibid.*) Anticipating the unfathomable depth of this divine pain, the Father had struggled long during Their counsel of peace "to yield up His Son to die for the guilty race. But 'God so loved the world, that He gave His only-begotten Son,'...Oh, the mystery of redemption!" (*PP 63-64*).

C. Come to Life - 1. Believe the Gospel of Jesus - 107. Humanity's Need and Choice

SUMMARY: In gratitude for such divine love you believe the gospel, and seeing your need of the Savior you choose to surrender all to Him.

Even before They created this world, the Father and the Son agreed on the plan of salvation because They knew humanity would need a Savior. Yet people overlook their need of Jesus even after they know they are sinners (Ge 3:7). So God shows them the alternatives and their results. He told Adam and Eve what sin would do to them and the whole earth (Ge 2:16-17; 3:15-19). Through Moses, He set life and death before Israel (Dt 30:1, 19). Through Jesus, He outlined the blessings of faith and the woes of unbelief (Mt 5:1-20; 23:13-39). In these last days, God calls all humanity to respond to His final revelation (Rev 1:3; 14:6; 22:18-19).

"What you need to understand is the true force of the will. This is the governing power in the nature of man, the power of decision, or of choice. Everything depends on the right action of the will. The power of choice God has given to men; it is theirs to exercise. You cannot change your heart, you cannot of yourself give to God its affections; but you can choose to serve Him. You can give Him your will; He will then work in you to will and to do according to His good pleasure. Thus your whole nature will be brought under the control of the Spirit of Christ; your affections will be centered upon Him, your thoughts will be in harmony with Him.

"Desires for goodness and holiness are right as far as they go; but if you stop here, they will avail nothing. Many will be lost while hoping and desiring to be Christians. They do not come to the point of yielding the will to God. They do not now choose to be Christians. Through the right exercise of the will, an entire change may be made in your life. By yielding up your will to Christ, you ally yourself with the power that is above all principalities and powers. You will have strength from above to hold you steadfast, and thus through constant surrender to God you will be enabled to live the new life, even the life of faith." (SC 47-48). Choose life!

C. Come to Life – 2. Receive Salvation by Faith – 201. The Three Stages of Salvation


SUMMARY: In response to the gospel of Jesus, you receive salvation by faith in three stages, typified by the three sections of the sanctuary.

God has revealed His plan to save fallen humanity from sin throughout history, to Adam and Eve (Gen 3:15), Abraham (Gen 22:18; Jn 8:56), Isaiah (Isa 53), Daniel (Da 8 & 9) and others, and clearly has illustrated it through Moses in the sanctuary system (Ex 25:8-9). Ever since Eden, God is offering to the whole human race the benefits of the life, death, resurrection, and heavenly intercession of His Son (Rev 22:17), that is, salvation in three stages, justification or forgiveness, sanctification or holiness, and glorification or sinlessness.

All three stages of our restoration are typified in the sections, furniture, and services of the OT sanctuary. The earthly structure was a model of the heavenly original (Ex 25:9, 40), where Jesus is now completing the atonement He began in His life and through death on earth (Heb 9:23-28). "What was done in type in the ministration of the earthly sanctuary is done in reality in the ministration of the heavenly sanctuary." (*GC 420*). "The correct understanding of the ministration in the heavenly sanctuary is the foundation of our faith." (*Ev 221*).

God makes all stages available by grace; we receive them through faith (Eph 2:8). Jesus' righteousness is first imputed to us (Rom 4:3-5) as our *title* to heaven (*FLB 116*), then imparted as our *fitness* for heaven (ibid.) as we partake of His divine nature (1 Co 3:16; Col 3:9-10; 2 Pe 1:4) and love the world as He did (*DA 641*). As Jesus is perfectly reflected in us, we are *candidates* for heaven (*5T 216*), glorifying God in our bodies and as His body (1 Co 6:20; Jn 17:20), and at His return He will give His glory to our bodies (Rom 8:30; Php 3:20-21).

"The sanctuary in heaven is the very center of Christ's work in behalf of men. It concerns every soul living upon the earth. It opens to view the plan of redemption, bringing us down to the very close of time, and revealing the triumphant issue of the contest between righteousness and sin. It is of utmost importance that all should thoroughly investigate these subjects..." (GC 488).

C. Come to Life – 2. Receive Salvation by Faith – 202. The Two Parts of Justification

SUMMARY: You take step 2 in the discipling process, as you enter the first stage of salvation, justification by faith in its two parts, renewed daily.

Justification, as do sanctification and glorification, comes by God's grace through faith (Eph 2:8-9; Tit 3:7). He makes it available to "whosoever will" (Rev 21:6; 22:17); the sinner receives it at conversion (1 Co 6:11), and maintains it by daily walking after the Spirit (Rom 10:8-10; 8:1-4). It means forgiveness of sins (Rom 3:23-25) upon repentance (sorrow for and forsaking of sin, 2 Co 7:9-11; Isa 55:7), restitution (Ex 22:1-15; Lev 5:16; Num 5:7; Lk 19:8), and confession of sin and of faith in Jesus as Savior (2 Chr 7:14; Lk 24:47; 1 Jn 1:9; Rom 3:25).

As soon as the repentant sinner accepts and claims by faith that Jesus took upon Himself the just penalty for his or her sins, that faith is counted or imputed to him or her for righteousness as it was to Abraham (Ge 15:6; Rom 4:3, 23-25; Gal 3:6). He or she is declared free from condemnation, is at peace or reconciled with God, and as a new creature or creation (Rom 8:1; 5:1, 10-11; 2 Co 5:17-20) is adopted into His family and so a joint heir with Jesus (Rom 8:14-17; 6BC 1070-1071). In this healed relationship the justified sinner rejoices (Rom 5:11).

In the OT, the daily sanctuary service illustrated that justification, or atonement, is accomplished only when the blood of the sacrifice is both shed (the sinner's part) and applied (the priest's part). This service typified Jesus who spilled His blood at His death on earth as the sacrifice (1 Co 5:7) and now applies or pleads it in the sanctuary in heaven as our High Priest (Rom 8:34; Heb 7:25; *Lt* 87, 1894).

This two-part process was already in place, when God instructed the Israelites to kill lambs and then apply the blood to the doorposts (Ex 12:1-13; 21-23; *PP* 277), and also later made the old covenant (Ex 24:6-8; Heb 9:18-21). Likewise, Jesus confirmed the new covenant with His shed blood (Da 9:27; Rom 15:8; Heb 2:3), and now administers it by the sprinkled (applied) blood (Heb 12:24; 1 Pe 1:2).

God's plan is to save us from sin and for service (Rom 6:1-11; 12:1; Heb 9:15). Will we cooperate?

C. Come to Life – 2. Receive Salvation by Faith – 203. Signs of Genuine Conversion

SUMMARY: You will recognize that you can receive justification by faith only in a genuine or truthful conversion, as described by Ellen G. White.

"In order to be saved, we must know by experience the meaning of true conversion. It is a fearful mistake for men and women to go on day by day, professing to be Christians, yet having no right to the name. In God's sight, profession is nothing, position is nothing. He asks, Is the life in harmony with my precepts? There are many who suppose that they are converted, but who are not able to bear the test of character presented in the Word of God. Sad will it be, in the day when every man is rewarded according to his works, for those who can not bear this test....

"In the lives of many of those whose names are on the church books there has been no genuine change. The truth has been kept in the outer court. There has been no genuine conversion, no positive work of grace done in the heart. Their desire to do God's will is based upon their own inclination, not upon the deep conviction of the Holy Spirit. Their conduct is not brought into harmony with the law of God. They profess to accept Christ as their Saviour, but they do not believe that he will give them power to overcome their sins. They have not a personal acquaintance with a living Saviour, and their characters reveal many blemishes....The [genuine] change can be made only by the Holy Spirit." (RH 07-07-1904).

Will God's people allow the Spirit of God, if need be, to move them from a mere profession to genuine conversion?

C. Come to Life - 3. Obey Jesus from Love - 301. The Three Baptisms

SUMMARY: You take step 3 in the discipling process, as you lovingly and joyfully obey Jesus and commit yourself to the three Biblical baptisms.

The new believer gladly receives three baptisms which will mark his or her new journey with Jesus. **1.** Baptism in water by immersion declares his or her conversion and confirms one's membership in Christ's body, His church. **2.** Baptism of the Holy Spirit upon prayer empowers sanctification and the exercise of ministry according to his or her spiritual gifts. **3.** Baptism of suffering means persecution and/or martyrdom, which may come to any true disciple of Jesus as people or powers reject his or her sanctified life and Spirit-filled testimony (2 Ti 3:12).

Water baptism and baptism of suffering are one-time and short-term events. The baptism of the Holy Spirit, though received once initially, requires daily renewal to be effective. This is because sanctification and gifted ministry are both lifelong developments and tasks, which can be accomplished only through constant and total dependence on the power of the Holy Spirit, received in answer to prayer. Of all three baptisms, therefore, the baptism of the Holy Spirit is the most crucial for a successful Christian walk. Without daily growth in sanctification and obedient use of spiritual gifts, neither past water baptism nor future suffering will testify of "Christ in you" (Rom 8:10; 2 Co 13:5; Col 1:27; Gal 2:20).

"Impress upon all the necessity of the baptism of the Holy Spirit, the sanctification of the members of the church, so that they will be living, growing, fruit-bearing trees of the Lord's planting." (6T 86). "What we need is the baptism of the Holy Spirit. Without this, we are no more fitted to go forth to the world than were the disciples after the crucifixion of their Lord." (RH 02-18-1890). "There is nothing that Satan fears so much as that the people of God shall clear the way by removing every hindrance, so that the Lord can pour out His Spirit upon a languishing church and an impenitent congregation. When the way is prepared for the Spirit of God, the blessing will come." (RH 03-22-1887). Are we ready?

C. Come to Life - 3. Obey Jesus from Love - 302. The Four Marks of the Final Remnant

SUMMARY: You also commit to lovingly obeying all the commandments of Jesus, and to fulfilling the other three marks of His final remnant.

Revelation describes the final remnant, God's people during the time of the end, by four identifying marks. First, they keep God's commandments (Rev 12:17; 14:12). Second, they have the testimony of Jesus or the spirit of prophecy (Rev 12:17; 19:10; 22:9). Third, they keep the faith of Jesus (Rev 13:10; 14:12). Fourth, they have patience, that is, they endure (Mt 24:13) or persevere (Rev 13:10; 14:12).

- 1. To keep God's Commandments means to delight in them out of love for the Lord Jesus (Ex 20:6; Ps 40:8; 119:35; Jn 14:5, 21; 1 Jn 2:3-6).
- 2. To have the testimony of Jesus means to hear it, especially in Revelation and EGW, to heed it, and to spread it (Rev 1:2, 3; 3; 10:11; 18:1-4).
- 3. To keep the faith of Jesus means to have the kind of faith He had, loving and tried, and to have faith in Jesus (Rev 3:18; Gal 2:16; 5:6).
- 4. To persevere means to endure unto the end without being deceived or falling away (Mt 24:13; 2 Th 1:4; 2:3; Rev 1:9; 13:10; 14:12).

These four identifying marks of the remnant are dependent on each other; none of them is effective or even possible without the other three. Keeping the Commandments requires the faith of Jesus as well as perseverance (Heb 12:1-4), both of which we receive by heeding His testimony (Rev 3:18). It is therefore essential that all members of the remnant uphold their prophetic identity by making a daily, unconditional, and uncompromising commitment to all four characteristics. The Lord greatly desires that all will be found among the faithful at His coming (Lk 18:8).

C. Come to Life - 3. Obey Jesus from Love - 303. Promises to Claim

SUMMARY: You can exercise faith and faithfulness during the trials of the last days, as you claim God's promises to His remnant people.

The Lord wants to ensure His remnant people that He has made all the provisions necessary to preserve them in the faith and enable them to be faithful in the trials and sufferings during the last day events. His promises are precious because He guarantees to protect and sustain them, to bring about justice and their deliverance, and to graciously give them their great reward and eternal inheritance.

Will each member of God's people be faithful to Him by claiming these promises in the faith of Jesus?



D. Join the Movement – 002. Dynamic Circles of Love

SUMMARY: Consider and appreciate now the **giving** side of that circle of love, which forms **phase 1** in the discipling process.

The first theme and mark of discipleship in each phase cover the <u>receiving</u> side of the relationship, the second theme and mark the <u>giving</u> side. Jesus said, "Come to Me, Learn of Me." (Mt 11:28-30); then, "Go for Me into all the world." (Mk 16:15; Mt 28:20). So the three circles of love together form the <u>process</u> by which Jesus builds His church (Mt 16:18): **1.** He calls her to Himself (Mt 16:24), **2.** grows her into His full stature (Eph 4:13; 5:27), and **3.** sends her to complete her number (Rom 11:25-26). Then He will return to take His beloved bride home into God's eternal glory (Jn 14:1-3).



D. Join the Movement – 1. Accept Our Prophetic Identity – 101. The Three Movements of God's People

SUMMARY: You take **step 4** in the discipling process, as you **accept** our prophetic identity as the third **movement** in the history of God's people.

Lucifer became Satan through self-exaltation, jealousy of Christ, and finally rebellion against God Himself (Isa 14:12-15; Eze 28:11-19; PP 33-43). Cast to the earth, he keeps misrepresenting God as unjust and selfish (Ge 3:1-5). God promised Satan's defeat through the "Seed" (Ge 3:15; 17:19; 22:17; Gal 3:16), who would reveal and vindicate His true character of merciful justice and self-sacrificing love to the fallen world and the unfallen universe (Jn 1:18). To proclaim this Seed, God raised up a people in three movements (Rev 12) and gave them present truth as shown in the sanctuary, particularly the atoning self-sacrifice of the Messiah, righteousness by faith in Him, and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The first two movements as a whole failed their divine calling. But God always had and still has a faithful remnant ready to be used to help finish His work of saving His people from sin, and thus restoring honor and glory to His name and harmony to the universe (GC 678).

D. Join the Movement - 1. Accept Our Prophetic Identity - 102. Two Rival Church Systems

SUMMARY: You accept our identity as this true and faithful end-time remnant body of Christ in contrast to the apostate Babylonian church system.

The history of each of the three movements of God's people reveals a struggle between two forms of teaching and life. God's Biblical design for His people was and is that they be a movement advancing in His power (Ne 9:22-25; Ac 1:8; Rev 18:1), full of faith and love, in loyalty to His covenant and in holiness of life (Dt 5:29; 6:5-6; 7:6; 2 Pe 3:11) under the servant-leadership of Spirit-filled OT prophets, kings, apostles, NT and other true prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers (1 Sa 3:19-21; 1 Ki 3:7-9; Joel 2:28-29; Ac 2:4,37-41; 13:1-3; Eph 4:11-16).

In their apostate form, God's people exhibit a hypocritical form of godliness without spiritual power (Mt 23:25-32; 2 Ti 3:5), unconverted hearts, disloyalty to God's commandments and widespread idolatry. Kings and false prophets and teachers, who lack divine authority, lead them astray and cause them to misinterpret, reject, and substitute the directions, pleadings, and warnings of the prophets, the Holy Spirit and even Christ Himself (1 Ki 16:30-33; 18:17-21; Da 9:5-6; Ac 7:51-53; 2 Pe 2:1-3; Rev 18:1-4). God's people change into fallen churches.

Apostasy among God's people is nothing else but the work of Satan. He wants to make God's plan of salvation of no effect and thereby deprive Jesus of the satisfaction of the travail of His soul, of the joy that was set before Him at the cross (Isa 53:11; Heb 12:2), and thus hurt Him even more (Ge 3:15; Mt 23:37-39; Rev 18:5-10; Isa 28:21). Since Satan did not succeed in tempting Jesus to sin or keeping Him in death (Mt 4:1-11; Rev 12:1-5), he directs his anger at faithful God's people by deceiving and persecuting them (Rev 12:17; 13:7, 15). He tries to force them to transgress God's law, especially the Sabbath (Rev 13:17), and prevent them from claiming direct access to Christ's power to plead His blood for the forgiveness of our sins, to cleanse them and make them overcomers (Da 7:25; 8:11-13; Eph 2:18; 3:12; Heb 4:16; 1 Jn 1:9, Rev 2; 3).

Satan is trying to achieve this goal through his apostate or Babylonian church system, which assumes the place of Christ. It is the counterfeit to the divine or Biblical form of God's church, which has Christ as her head. However, God's true remnant will be faithful and persevere in keeping all the commandments of God and the testimony of Jesus by the faith of Jesus (Rev 12:17; 14:12). Christ will therefore have a people on the earth who testify of His glory (Rev 18:1), His power to save and sanctify (Eph 4:25-27), and His great longing to take His bride home to her eternal bliss (Jn 14:1-3). He will come for her very soon – quickly (Rev 22:20). Will we prove faithful as individual believers and as a body?

D. Join the Movement – 1. Accept Our Prophetic Identity – 103. The Purpose and Nature of God's People*

SUMMARY: As a member of the true remnant of God's people, you accept and implement the divine calling to final unity, growth, and fullness.

Lucifer became the devil by spreading lies in heaven about God's law and character. He drew a third of God's angels and afterwards humanity into his rebellion (Ez 18:1-19; Rev 12:3-4; Gen 3:1-5). He also caused questions about God in the minds of unfallen angels and other worlds (*PP 33-43*). In order to meet this satanic challenge, God needs and seeks to fully reveal and vindicate His true character of merciful justice and self-sacrificing love, to restore His divine image in humanity, and to recreate peace and harmony to the whole universe (*DA 763-764*).

God started this process on earth by calling a people to unity with Him and one another (Jn 17:6-26). He is growing them into a global movement through the work of a faithful remnant, in order to reflect His true character in the fullness of His church, against which the gates of hell cannot prevail (Mt 16:18; *DA 413*). In this way, Satan is proven wrong and God can finally remove all doubts about His character from the universe forever and execute justice on sin and sinners (*GC 678*). Will God's remnant church be faithful to her high calling (Lk 18:8)?

D. Join the Movement – 1. Accept Our Prophetic Identity – 104. The Mission and Message of God's Remnant*

SUMMARY: You accept and help implement the divine mission of the remnant to proclaim the three angels' messages and the pillars of our faith.

The Advent Movement is God's remnant people, whom He called out (Gr.: *ekklesia*) from various backgrounds within the universal church, so that they call out the invisible portion of His people into His visible end-time church (Mt 28:18-20; Ac 1:4-8; Jn 10:16; Rev 18:1-4). In other words, God gave His remnant a present truth message and sent them on the mission to proclaim it to the churches and the world (Rev 10:11).

In fact, the remnant church does not have a mission; she is this mission. She does not exist without it. The church offers what she is. Either she is involved in mission or she dies, becomes a social club. But when she is involved in mission as a common goal outside of herself, she will grow into the unity and fullness that God desires, thus bringing glory to God and to the world faith in Christ (Jn 17:18-26; Eph 4:11-16).

This unity does not allow for congregationalism, which fragments the church. Christ expresses the fullness of His church globally, not locally. We have one world (earth) with one problem (sin) and one remedy (Christ), so we need one church (SDA) with one mission (Eph 4:1-6). God's end-time remnant church is His prophetic messenger giving His last call to all believers to come out and form His one fold (Jn 10:16).


D. Join the Movement – 1. Accept Our Prophetic Identity – 105. Chart of the History of God's People

SUMMARY: As the SDA messages are God's last offer of mercy and final warning to an evil world, you accept our calling to be faithful unto death.

God's plan of salvation to completely free this dark planet from sin and sinners involves three movements of sinful human beings, each of which are called to bring progressive revelations of present truth to the world. All three movements of God's people have a history of apostasy, but also a faithful remnant, through which God reflects His true character and carries out His plan of salvation (Mt 16:18; Rev 12:11).

While world events signal the soon close of human probation, the SDA movement, God's end-time remnant, is called to bring His last offer of mercy and warning to the lost race. As the three angels' messages spread around the planet, individuals as well as groups from Pagan, Israelite, Jewish, and Christian backgrounds join the movement, while many of the members forsake their faith under test (*LDE 173-178*).

Once probation closes, only the faithful ones who have been sealed (Mt 24:13; Rev 2:10; 7:3), will be protected from the seven last plagues and be translated when Jesus comes. They are the final, global remnant of God's people – the 144,000 (Rev 7:1-8; 14:1-5).



D. Join the Movement - 1. Accept Our Prophetic Identity - 106. The Calling and Character of the 144,000

SUMMARY: Since we are to be faithful amidst apostasy, you accept our calling to strive to be among, and reveal the character of, the 144,000.

John the Revelator sees the 144,000 being sealed on the earth (Rev 7:1-8), then standing with the Lamb on mount Zion and before the throne of God (14:1-5), and on the sea of glass singing the song of Moses and the Lamb (15:1-3).

It is not crucial to know whether their number is literal or symbolic (7BC 783), how they relate to the great multitude (Rev 7:9-17; 7BC 784/5), and who is to compose them (MS 26, 1901; 7BC 978). Scripture portrays them as a special group with an experience unique in the history of God's people (Rev 14:3), in fact, of this world and the universe. Therefore, the important questions are:

- 1. What features characterize the 144,000 (7BC 783)?
- 2. What is their role during the time of the end and before the throne of God?
- 3. What may motivate us, and/or hinder us, to be numbered among them?

We are admonished, "Let us strive with all the power that God has given us to be among the hundred and forty-four thousand" (*Mar 241*). Are we striving with all this divine power? And what is it that we should be striving for?

D. Join the Movement - 2. Affirm the SDA Beliefs - 201. The Four Landmarks or Pillars

SUMMARY: You take step 5 in the discipling process, as you grasp our four landmark beliefs, and affirm them with meaningful conviction.

The Seventh-day Adventist movement clearly distinguishes itself from general Christianity by four unique, while true and orthodox Biblical beliefs. "By early 1848 the Sabbatarian Adventist leaders, through extensive and intensive Bible study, had come to basic agreement on at least four points of doctrine....Sabbatarian Adventists, and later Seventh-day Adventists, came to see those teachings as 'landmarks' or 'pillar' doctrines. Together they set this branch of Adventism off from not only other Millerites, but from Christians in general....The so-called landmark doctrines formed the nonnegotiable core of the movement's theology." (George R. Knight, *Lest We Forget*, Review and Herald 2008, p. 102).

"No line of truth that has made the Seventh-day Adventist people what they are is to be weakened. We have the old landmarks of truth, experience, and duty, and we are to stand firmly in defense of our principles, in full view of the world." (67 17). Will we prove faithful?

D. Join the Movement – 2. Affirm the SDA Beliefs – 202. The 28 Fundamental Beliefs – Overview

SUMMARY: You also affirm with meaningful conviction all 28 fundamental beliefs, as they have been expressed in the history of our movement.

The official introduction to the current 28 Fundamental Beliefs states: "Seventh-day Adventists accept the Bible as their only creed and hold certain fundamental beliefs to be the teaching of the Holy Scriptures. These beliefs, as set forth here, constitute the church's understanding and expression of the teaching of Scripture. Revision of these statements may be expected at a General Conference Session when the church is led by the Holy Spirit to a fuller understanding of Bible truth or finds better language in which to express the teachings of God's Holy Word."

According to "Seventh-day Adventists Believe...," Review and Herald, 1988, iv, the history of the Fundamental Beliefs can be described as follows: While Seventh-day Adventists have always been reluctant to formalize a creed, they have found it necessary to summarize their beliefs. In 1872 the church published a "synopsis of our faith" in 25 propositions, which were then expanded to 28 in the Yearbooks of 1889, and 1905 through 1914. A new statement encompassing 22 "principle features" of belief as they "may be summarized," was first printed in 1931.

The 1980 General Conference session replaced the statement with a similar but more comprehensive summary in 27 paragraphs, published under the title "Fundamental Beliefs of Seventh-day Adventists." At the 2005 General Conference session, a 28th fundamental belief, "Growing in Christ", was inserted as #11 as a statement on spiritual warfare, and the 2015 Session voted on the rewording of some beliefs.

D. Join the Movement - 2. Affirm the SDA Beliefs - 203. Fundamentals 1 to 3

SUMMARY: You affirm with meaningful conviction our fundamental beliefs 1 to 3 about the word of God and the nature of God.

The end-time remnant of God's people has been entrusted with comprehensive Biblical truth as it is in Jesus. "A complete system of faith has been revealed, and correct rules for practice in our daily life have been made known." (*RH 07-22-1890*). This includes **1.** known truth held in common with other Christian groups, **2.** lost truth that has now been recovered, and **3.** present truth that is especially pertinent for the last days. Among the known truths are the divine inspiration of the Scriptures and the triune nature of the Godhead.

However, even regarding the truths held in common with other Christians, Seventh-day Adventism differs in several particulars. For instance, we understand the Bible to be thought inspired, not verbally dictated. "The writers of the Bible were God's penmen, not His pen....It is not the words of the Bible that are inspired, but the men that were inspired." (1SM 21). Furthermore, the authority of the Bible is not regarded as lower than or even equal with tradition, but as the highest and final authority in matters of doctrine and practice.

D. Join the Movement - 2. Affirm the SDA Beliefs - 204. Fundamentals 4 and 5

SUMMARY: You affirm with meaningful conviction our fundamental beliefs 4 and 5 about God's Son and the Holy Spirit.

Seventh-day Adventists hold as present truth some aspects of the work of Jesus Christ, which other Christian groups have not yet discovered, misjudge regarding their significance, or deny altogether. We understand that God calls for the worship of Jesus Christ as the Creator, which implies the acknowledgment of the Seventh-day Sabbath as the Biblical day of worship (Rev 14:7; Fundamental Beliefs 6 and 24). We understand that Christ's atonement includes not only His death on the cross, but also His ongoing intercession in the heavenly sanctuary, and His pre-Advent judgment of all professed Christians, which He began in 1844 (Heb 7:25; Da 8:14; Fundamental Belief 24).

As Seventh-day Adventists, we understand the Holy Spirit to be, not a divine force, but a person of the Godhead (Jn 15:26), Who can be vexed, fill individuals, teach, guide into and remind of truth, seal believers, and be grieved (Isa 63:10; Lk 4:1; Ac 2:4; Jn 14:26; 16:13; Eph 1:13; 3:5; 4:30). Also, we hold that the Holy Spirit has not ceased to give spiritual gifts as during the apostolic age, as some churches teach, but rather that He continues to extend these gifts to the church until the end of the world (Fundamental Beliefs 17 and 18).

In fact, as Seventh-day Adventists we expect a special outpouring of gifts during the time of the global reformatory movement (9*T* 126) and the latter rain (Joel 2:23), both of which overlap. We understand that just as Christ sent the Holy Spirit and filled the apostles on the day of Pentecost as the former rain to begin to grow His church (Ac 2:16-18; 19:4-7), so will He in the last days pour out the Holy Spirit as the latter rain to ripen and prepare His church for the return of Jesus and eternity (Rev 10:11; 18:1-4; *GC ix; FLB 334; TM 506*).

Are we making room in our hearts for these "times of refreshing" (Ac 3:19)?

SUMMARY: You affirm with meaningful conviction our fundamental beliefs 6 and 7 about creation and the nature of humanity.

Today, a basic assertion is "that classical religious teachings about God are compatible with the modern scientific understanding about biological evolution. In short, theistic evolutionists believe that there is a God, that God is the *creator* of the material universe and (*by consequence*) all life within, and that biological evolution is simply a natural process within that creation. Evolution, according to this view, is simply a tool that God employed to develop human life." (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Theistic_evolution). In other words, God created evolution.

Seventh-day Adventists uphold the Biblical creation and the Sabbath as literal, historical six 24-hour periods, and the Sabbath as a literal day of rest. "The language of the Bible should be explained according to its obvious meaning, unless a symbol or figure is employed." (*GC* 599). In other words, "the words ought to be understood literally, that is, in their ordinary historical and grammatical sense, except in those instances where the writer used figurative language." (10BC 787). We maintain that the "Bible is God's great lesson book, His great educator. The foundation of all true science is contained in the Bible. Every branch of knowledge may be found by searching the word of God." (*COL* 107).

At least two aspects distinguish the Seventh-day Adventist understanding of the nature of the human person from other Christian teachings. First, man is a unified person who is a living soul only as long as body and spirit are together; death as unconscious sleep in the grave is the result of the separation of these two elements. This Biblical concept stands in contrast to the Greek idea that humans can be divided into a mortal body and an immortal soul, which continues conscious life after death. Secondly, while all humans receive the consequences of Adam's sin, that is, a fallen nature and mortality, none of them inherit Adam's guilt, except as they participate in his sin as individuals (*PP 306*).

Will the remnant people of God be faithful in the proclamation of these crucial truths?

The Seventh-day Adventist understanding of the great controversy between Christ and Satan is present truth, an integrating world view that traces and accounts for ongoing rebellion against God from angelic and human perfection past and lost (Isa 14; Eze 28; Ge 1-3), via earth's sinful history, to the future perfection eternally restored (Rev 21 & 22), made possible through the work of Jesus on earth and in heaven.

The parties and battles of this controversy are the major features in the prophecies of the war in heaven and of the actions of secular and religious powers against God's people (Daniel 2, 7-12; Revelation 12-19). This battle took its most violent form and decisive turn in Jesus' life and death on the cross (Ge 3:15; Isa 53), where He achieved the ultimate victory for all humanity (Heb 9:11-15). Will you participate?

The Seventh-day Adventist understanding of spiritual gifts differs from other Christians in several respects: **1.** We hold that the Holy Spirit has not limited His gifts to the apostolic age, but that He will bestow them on the church according to His own wisdom until the end of the world (1 Co 13:8-13). **2.** Since we believe in the priesthood of all believers, that all members belong to the *laos* or people of God, we do not make a great distinction between "clergy" and "laity," though we recognize that special leadership gifts require ordination (Eph 4:11; Ac 13:1-3; 1 Ti 4:14). **3.** We believe that the best evidence for the infilling with the Holy Spirit is a changed life of loving obedience to God's commandments (Eze 36:27; Jn 14:15; Rom 8:1-4; Eph 5:15-20), whether or not it is accompanied by specific gifts such as speaking in tongues or prophecy (Ac 19:6).

Seventh-day Adventists are very aware of Jesus' warning of false end-time prophets (Mt 24:24). But noticing the implication that there is also true prophecy in the last days, they value the exercise of this gift within their movement in the ministry of Ellen White. They understand that her ministry was similar to the prophetic gift exercised by individuals in Biblical times, whose messages did not become part of the Scriptures (1 Chr 29:29; Act 11:27; 13:1; 21:9). They recognize that the writings of Ellen White do not add to, update, or supersede God's Word, but rather help them see its true meaning through divinely inspired clarifications and applications to the faith, life and calling of the remnant church.

SUMMARY: You affirm with meaningful conviction our fundamental beliefs 19 and 20 about the law of God, incl. the Sabbath.

Seventh-day Adventists differ in three respects from a popular view of the law in other Christian circles: **1.** They understand that the law of God was given, not only in Ten Commandments to Israel, but already to man in the garden of Eden at creation, and is therefore valid for all humanity. **2.** They know that the law reflects God's character, making it eternally valid; therefore the cross of Jesus did not destroy but rather fulfill it (Mt 5:17-19). **3.** They maintain that keeping the law is not legalism as a means of salvation, but rather loving obedience as evidence of salvation (Ex 20:6; Dt 30:6; Jn 14:15; 1 Jn 5:2-3). Salvation by faith and keeping God's commandments are therefore not mutually exclusive, but the first is expressed in the second. Seventh-day Adventists proclaim the lost truth of God's Sabbath as the distinguishing sign of God's faithful people (Ex 31:13-17; Rev 14:7).

Seventh-day Adventists understand that as the Creator and Preserver, God has ownership of the earth and all that is therein (Ex 19:5; Dt 10:14; Ne 9:6; Ac 14:14), and has given humanity responsibility for the proper care and use of the earth and their lives (Ge 1:26-28; 2:15; 1 Co 6:19-20; 3 Jn 2), holding them accountable as stewards of His physical resources (Mt 25:14-30; Lk 12:42-48) and His spiritual gifts (1 Co 4:2, 1 Pe 4:10).

As stewards, Seventh-day Adventists also uniquely emphasize a behavior that aims at complete spiritual, emotional, and physical health through godly conduct, lifestyle, and appearance (Tit 2:11-14; 2 Pe 3:11), so they glorify God both in their bodies and in their spirits (1 Co 6:20).

In the midst of the confusing and conflicting voices in contemporary culture about the meaning and purpose of marriage and family, Seventh-day Adventists uphold the Biblical concept of a lifelong heterosexual companionship and of parenthood (Ge 1:28) as gifts from God to man to find maturity in loving relationship, ensure the procreation of our race, and reflect the close and holy love relationship between Jesus and His church.

In view of the ongoing great controversy between Christ and Satan, Seventh-day Adventists are called to warn humanity that Satan is trying to destroy God's creation gifts of both marriage and the Sabbath, in order to disrupt the stability of society and the church, and hinder all true disciples of Jesus to worship Him as Creator (Rev 14:7) and find in Him the soul rest that humanity needs but cannot give (Mt 11:28-30; Heb 4:9-16).

Seventh-day Adventists emphasize the present truth of Jesus' mediatory and judgment ministry in the heavenly sanctuary, leading to the end of probation for all humanity, as a necessary preparation for His return to earth to take the faithful into His eternal kingdom.

D. Join the Movement - 2. Affirm the SDA Beliefs - 215. Fundamentals 26 to 28

SUMMARY: You affirm with meaningful conviction our fundamental beliefs 26 to 28 about death, resurrection, the millennium, and the new earth.

In contrast to those who teach the immortality of the soul, Seventh-day Adventists hold to the Biblical view of death as unconscious sleep in the grave (Ecc 9:5; Ac 2:29). This brings special significance to the coming of Jesus, since on that last day, when He raises the dead (Jn 6:39, 40, 44, 54), it will not mean that He reunites immortal souls with dead bodies, but that He will resurrect to new immortal life, those who had truly been dead (1 Co 15:53-54). Without this first resurrection, there would be no life for the dead, not even life of disembodied souls.

Again in contrast to other Christian groups, Seventh-day Adventists understand the Millennium to be a time of Christ's reign with the resurrected saints in heaven, not on the earth. They also recognize that the wicked are dead and will be judged during this time, then come to temporary life in the second resurrection, to receive their verdict and be destroyed in hell fire on earth (Rev 20:9). Since they kept their mortality, the wicked will not burn in an eternal fire, but be destroyed forever. The fire will be eternal only in its effects, but not in its duration (Jude 7).

Seventh-day Adventists understand this fire to be the end of all sin and sinners, and therefore of the great controversy between Christ and Satan. Heaven will then literally be on the renewed earth where God and Jesus dwell with their faithful people forever.

<u>D. Join the Movement</u> – 3. Order Your Life as a Steward – 301. The Seven Areas of Stewardship

SUMMARY: You take step 6 in the discipling process, as you commit yourself to faithfully ordering your life in all seven areas of stewardship.

We recognize that because He created humanity and our world (Isa 42:5; Jn 1:1-3; Col 1:16; Rev 10:6), "The earth is the Lord's, and the fullness thereof: the world, and they that dwell therein" (Ps 24:1). Our Lord was also well pleased with all His creation (Ge 1:4, 10, 12, 18, 21, 25, 31; PP 47). He who owns and places the highest value on everything we are and have, has entrusted humanity with the treasures of this planet (Ge 1:26) and holds us accountable for their proper care and use according to our abilities and means (Mt 25:14-20; Lk 12:42; 1 Co 4:2).

"It is an honor bestowed upon man that God should entrust to his keeping the riches of earth, and it is done that he may co-operate with God by using these precious gifts in advancing the Lord's work in the earth... He has given to every man his work, and he trusts men as his stewards with treasures of wealth and of intellect. Whatever you render to God is, through his mercy and generosity, placed to your account as a faithful steward. But ever bear in mind, 'Of thine own have we given thee.' This is not a work of merit on man's part." (*RH 08-24-1905*).

Stewardship of life is therefore more than a theoretical concept. It is rather a total lifestyle involving the practical, everyday realities of health, time, talents, environment, relationships, spirituality, and finances. These seven areas are grouped in this Guide under the term "STEWARD" as an acronym: **S** =Spirituality, **T** =Talents, **E** =Environment, **W** =Wellbeing, **A** =Assets (Finances), **R** =Relationships, **D** =Days (Time). God will reward our fidelity with greater ways to serve Him, a share in His joy, and co-inheritance of Jesus' kingdom (Mt 25:21, 23, 34; *COL* 361).

<u>D. Join the Movement − 3. Order Your Life as a Steward − 302. The Three Levels of Preparation</u>

SUMMARY: You also commit yourself to faithfully ordering your life on the three levels of preparation for the last days.

We know we live in the time of preparation for the final events. "The work of the people of God is to prepare for the events of the future, which will soon come upon them with blinding force." (2SM 142). "Transgression has almost reached its limit. Confusion fills the world, and a great terror is soon to come upon human beings. The end is very near. We who know the truth should be preparing for what is soon to break upon the world as an overwhelming surprise." (8T 28). This means then, "Unless we understand the importance of the moments that are swiftly passing into eternity, and make ready to stand in the great day of God, we shall be unfaithful stewards. The watchman is to know the time of night." (6T 407).

This urgency of God's call is based on the intensity of the end-time events, as we approach earth's last great crisis. "In the great final conflict, Satan will employ the same policy, manifest the same spirit, and work for the same end as in all preceding ages. That which has been, will be, except that the coming struggle will be marked with a terrible intensity such as the world has never witnessed. Satan's deceptions will be more subtle, his assaults more determined. If it were possible, he would lead astray the elect. Mark 13:22" (*GC xi*). "It is often the case that trouble is greater in anticipation than in reality; but this is not true of the crisis before us. The most vivid presentation cannot reach the magnitude of the ordeal." (*GC 622*).

This urgency and intensity are not meant to frighten God's people, but to awaken them to the dire need of swift preparation. "I see the necessity of making haste to get all things ready for the crisis.--*Letter* 90, 1897." (*CL 21*). This is true for the little time of trouble. However, for the advancement of the cause of present truth, and in preparation for the great time of trouble, God's people will sacrifice and sell their properties as the Lord will direct each household (*EW 56-57*). It is then, and during the great time of trouble, that the faithful remnant shall trust wholly in God, and He will sustain them as He fed the Israelites and His prophet Elijah in the wilderness. He promised that our bread and water shall be sure (Isa 33:16; *EW 56*).

The Lord is calling His remnant to make spiritual preparations through revival of faith and godliness. Are God's people inquiring of Him how to make their respective financial and physical preparations, as single households, but also as local congregations and as a global church?



E. Grow in Grace - 002. Dynamic Circles of Love

SUMMARY: Consider and appreciate now the receiving side of that circle of love, which forms phase 2 in the discipling process.

The first theme and mark of discipleship in each phase cover the <u>receiving</u> side of the relationship, the second theme and mark the <u>giving</u> side. Jesus said, "Come to Me, Learn of Me." (Mt 11:28-30); then, "Go for Me into all the world." (Mk 16:15; Mt 28:20). So the three circles of love together form the <u>process</u> by which Jesus builds His church (Mt 16:18): **1.** He calls her to Himself (Mt 16:24), **2.** grows her into His full stature (Eph 4:13; 5:27), and **3.** sends her to complete her number (Rom 11:25-26). Then He will return to take His beloved bride home into God's eternal glory (Jn 14:1-3).



E. Grow in Grace – 1. Let Jesus Form Within – 101. The Three Parts of Sanctification

SUMMARY: As a result of justification by faith, you enter into the second stage of salvation, sanctification by faith according to its three parts.

Sanctification is the second stage in God's restoration of humanity into His image, the likeness of His Son Jesus, by grace through faith (Eph 2:8). The righteousness of Jesus is imparted, He is formed within the believer by the indwelling of His Spirit (1 Co 3:16; Gal 4:19; Col 1:27; 3:10; 2 Pe 1:4). This "work of a lifetime" (AA 560) is illustrated by the three pieces of furniture in the Holy Place of the sanctuary.

The lampstand brings continuous light into the dark room. It symbolizes Jesus as the light of the world, and His church which reflects His light as He lives within them. The seven lamps filled with oil represent the whole Word of God, inspired by the Holy Spirit and understood, followed, and proclaimed in the Spirit's power by God's people. They are also being trimmed or freed from obstacles to reflect Jesus better.

The showbread is continuously kept on its table before God. It symbolizes Jesus as ever living mediator before His Father, and so the bread of life. The two stacks of bread represent the temporal food and spiritual blessings Jesus provides for His people so they grow into His likeness. The priests eating the bread typify all the believers who commune with Jesus, the living Word, and feed on His written Word.

The altar of incense is used to burn incense continuously. It symbolizes Jesus as the intercessor for His people, presenting His merits to the Father on their behalf. The offer of the lamb at the time of the incense illustrated that Jesus' merits are His perfect purity and His precious blood shed for all. Believers pray at the time of the incense knowing that Jesus' merits make their prayers acceptable to the Father.

E. Grow in Grace - 1. Let Jesus Form Within - 102. The Image of God - Overview

SUMMARY: This second stage of salvation, as you grow in grace, means you let Jesus form within you in all aspects of His person and calling.

God created us in His image (Ge 1:26), Jesus (Heb 1:3), and He wants to restore it in us, so we become like Jesus in all aspects of His person and life (Rom 8:29; 1 Jn 3:2). "Every phase of the Christian life is to be a representation of the life of Christ." (*RH 10-17-1899*). Christ is to live in us (Jn 17:23); He is shapes life now and is our only "hope of glory" (Col 1:5, 27). "In every soul wherein Christ, the hope of glory, dwells, His words are reechoed, 'I delight to do Thy will, O My God, yea, thy law is within my heart.' Psalm 40:8." (*MB 109*). "Without the life of Christ in us, we cannot withstand the storms of temptation. Our eternal safety depends upon our building upon the sure foundation." (*DA 599*).

How does Jesus form in us? **1.** He comes by the Holy Spirit (Jn 14:15-18); as we ask for and are filled with His Spirit (Lk 11:13; Eph 5:18), we are one with Him and one another (Jn 17:23). **2.** Jesus forms within us, as we behold Him by daily and prayerfully studying and reflecting on His Word, for it is only by beholding Him that we become changed (2 Co 3:18). "We need a more intimate knowledge of Christ. We should sit at his feet, and learn of him....As we behold and dwell upon his love, we shall see matchless charms in his character. He was perfect in all things....He was all that the law required; but what the law demanded of Christ, it demands of all humanity. We must be Christ-like, and give an example to the world that is worthy of imitation. In this way we shall honor God. And the Lord says, 'Them that honor me, I will honor.'" (*RH* 05-07-1889).

- **3.** Jesus forms within us as we commune with Him in constant earnest prayer (Lk 18:1; 1 Th 5:17-18). "He who feels most deeply his need of divine aid will plead for it; and the Holy Spirit will give unto him glimpses of Jesus that will strengthen and uplift the soul. From communion with Christ he will go forth to work for those who are perishing in their sins. He is anointed for his mission; and he succeeds." (*DA 436*).
- **4.** As Jesus forms in us we do His works, for "without me ye can do nothing." (Jn 15:5). "The most talented worker can do little unless Christ is formed within, the hope and strength of the life" (*RH 08-19-1902*). Therefore, "I can do all things through Christ which strenghteneth me." (Php 4:13). As we abide in him, we bear fruit and do His works (Jn 15:4; 14:12). "He who abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as He walked." (1 Jn 2:6). It also works the other way. "In order for us to develop a character like Christ's, we must share in His work." (*AG 335*).

Will God's people avail themselves of the opportunities and ways to let Jesus form within them?

"In every soul wherein Christ, the hope of glory, dwells, His words are reechoed, 'I delight to do Thy will, O My God, yea, thy law is within my heart.' Psalm 40:8." (*MB 109*). "Without the life of Christ in us, we cannot withstand the storms of temptation. Our eternal safety depends upon our building upon the sure foundation." (*DA 599*).

E. Grow in Grace - 2. Study the Word of God - 201. How God Speaks to Us

SUMMARY: You take step 8 in the discipling process, as you hear Him speak to you, especially in His word, so you become and stay doctrinally pure.

God had spoken with Adam and Eve face to face (Ge 1:28; 2:16-17), but sin made this impossible (Ge 3:23; 1SP 7; GC v). Ever since Eden, God has communicated with people individually and corporately in various indirect ways (Rom 1:18-20; Heb 1:1-2; Rev 14:6; 18:1), so He may reach every single person. How we respond to Him, is our free decision and responsibility. "Hear His voice." (Jn 10:1-5; Heb 3:7; 4:7).

God speaks to us most clearly in His written Word (Ps 119:105; Jn 17:17; 2 Ti 3:16). "All whom God is leading will manifest a high regard for the Scriptures in which His voice is heard." (5BC 1147). Soon we will commune with Him again face to face (1 Jn 3:2; Rev 22:4).

Are God's remnant people allowing themselves to hear the Lord's voice and to heed it (Rev 2:7, 11, 17, 29; 3:6, 13, 22)?

E. Grow in Grace – 2. Study the Word of God – 202. "Behold the Lamb of God"

SUMMARY: As you behold Jesus in His word or feed on Him, typified by the showbread, you grow in grace while He restores His image in you.

At conversion we put off the old man of sin and put on the man of holiness, even Jesus Christ Himself through the indwelling of His Holy Spirit (Eph 4:22-24; Col 3:9-10; Gal 2:20; Col 1:27; Jn 14:16-18; 1 Co 6:19). However, subsequent progress in sanctification depends on the daily beholding of God in Jesus who then changes us more and more into His likeness through His Spirit (2 Co 3:18; 4:6). We become transformed by the renewing of our mind as we heed the call to "behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world." (Rom 12:1-2; Jn 1:29, 36).

We behold the Lamb of God when we study Jesus in His Word, and earnestly strive to be like Him (2 Ti 3:14-17; 6BC 1098). "Those who study the Redeemer's wonderful sacrifice grow in grace and knowledge." (5BC 1137). In this way, "The contemplation of this sacrifice will be the glory of those who, as the fruit of it, will live through the eternal ages." (DA 623). But while we are still here, are we not called to "send the bright beams of the Sun of righteousness into all the dark places of the earth? To be a Christian is to be Christlike." (6BC 1097). Are we heeding the call?

E. Grow in Grace – 2. Study the Word of God – 203. The Four Steps of Bible Study

SUMMARY: You benefit from studying Jesus' word and beholding Him in it only to the extent, to which you follow these four essential steps.

Fundamental Belief 1 summarizes the SDA view of the Bible: "The Holy Scriptures, Old and New Testaments, are the written Word of God, given by divine inspiration through holy men of God who spoke and wrote as they were moved by the Holy Spirit. In this Word, God has committed to man the knowledge necessary for salvation. The Holy Scriptures are the infallible revelation of His will. They are the standard of character, the test of experience, the authoritative revealer of doctrines, and the trustworthy record of God's acts in history. (2 Peter 1:20, 21; 2 Tim. 3:16, 17; Ps. 119:105; Prov. 30:5, 6; Isa. 8:20; John 17:17; 1 Thess. 2:13; Heb. 4:12.)" (*GC website*).

The study of and obedience to God's word are extremely crucial in these last days. "Those who endeavor to obey all the commandments of God will be opposed and derided. They can stand only in God. In order to endure the trial before them, they must understand the will of God as revealed in His word; they can honor Him only as they have a right concept of His character, government, and purposes, and act in accordance with them. None but those who have fortified the mind with the truths of the Bible will stand through the last great conflict. To every soul will come the searching test: Shall I obey God rather than men? The decisive hour is even now at hand.

"Are our feet planted on the rock of God's immutable word? Are we prepared to stand firm in defense of the commandments of God and the faith of Jesus?...The events connected with the close of probation and the work of preparation for the time of trouble, are clearly presented. But multitudes have no more understanding of these important truths than if they had never been revealed. Satan watches to catch away every impression that would make them wise unto salvation, and the time of trouble will find them unready....When the testing time shall come, those who have made God's word their rule of life will be revealed...will stand firm as a rock." (GC 593-594, 602).

"The truth and the glory of God are inseparable; it is impossible for us, with the Bible within our reach, to honor God by erroneous opinions. Many claim that it matters not what one believes, if his life is only right. But the life is molded by the faith. If light and truth is within our reach, and we neglect to improve the privilege of hearing and seeing it, we virtually reject it; we are choosing darkness rather than light. 'There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof *are* the ways of death.' Proverbs 16:25. Ignorance is no excuse for error or sin, when there is every opportunity to know the will of God...[to] know for ourselves what He requires of us." (*GC* 597).

Are God's people "rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Ti 2:15)? First, we want to honor God; secondly, our "soul's salvation is at stake" (*GC 598*). Bible study that yields reliable truth and a firm faith follows four essential steps:

E. Grow in Grace – 3. Pray According to God's Will – 301. The Purpose and Process of Effectual Prayer

SUMMARY: You take **step 9** in the discipling process, as you worship God by **praying** according to His will, typified by the altar of **incense**.

Although pagan gods do not see, hear, or know (Da 5:23; Rev 9:20), occultists use "curious arts" (Ac 19:19), magic practices, to communicate with them (AA 288). Their petitioners try to solicit their attention and help by flattering titles and many repetitions (1 Ki 18:26; Mt 6:7). By contrast, the true God created and loves the world and cares for His people (Jn 1:3; 3:16; 1 Pe 5:7). We are to pray to Him in trust and simple words (Lk 11:1-13). But do we still think we need to pray to motivate God to help us? Or do we really believe that God knows all our needs (Mt 6:25-34) and is willing and indeed longing to provide for us even before we ask (Isa 65:24; Mt 6:8; 7:7; Jn 15:7; COL 146; OHC 129)?

The truth is that God wants to motivate and empower us, through His Spirit (Rom 8:26-27), to ask of Him the very things He already has. In this way, at least three purposes of prayer are fulfilled: First, God is glorified, that is, His true character of love, justice and mercy is revealed. God is glorified through Jesus as He answers our prayers (Jn 14:13-14); God is glorified through His church, as His answers enable us to bear much fruit (Jn 7-8, 16). Second, our answered prayers supply us with all the help we need, such as forgiveness and healing (Heb 4:16; 2 Ch 7:14; 1 Jn 1:9). Third, as our answered prayers confirm God's goodness, our joy in knowing Him becomes full (Jn 16:22-24).

How crucial it is, therefore, that God's people understand and take their place within the divine process of effectual prayer! Evidently, such prayer requires the close cooperation of four parties: God the Father Who initiates it, the Holy Spirit Who empowers it, God's people who express it, and the Lord Jesus Who purifies it to make it acceptable to God. While the three divine parties are always in complete agreement, the "weak link" in the chain of events is that as humans we are by nature unaware of our true needs and unable to pray for them "as we ought". We are therefore in constant and dire need of the prompting and empowering of the Holy Spirit so we will pray correctly (Rom 8:26).

Will we avail ourselves of the ready and enabling cooperation of the triune God that makes our prayers possible and effectual? As we enter into this 5-step process with Him, we shall give all the credit and praise for answered prayer to God alone.

E. Grow in Grace – 3. Pray According to God's Will – 302. The Power and Privilege of Effectual Prayer

SUMMARY: You will be the more **constant** and **confident** in prayer, the deeper you appreciate the **power** and **privilege** of petition and intercession.

"The glory that rested upon Christ [after His baptism] is a pledge of the love of God for us. It tells us of the power of prayer, -- how the human voice may reach the ear of God, and our petitions find acceptance in the courts of heaven." (*DA 113*). "It is a wonderful thing that we can pray effectually, that unworthy, erring mortals possess the power of offering their requests to God. What higher power can man desire than this, -- to be linked with the infinite God? Feeble, sinful man has the privilege of speaking to his Maker. We may utter words that reach the throne of the Monarch of the universe. We may speak with Jesus as we walk by the way, and He says, I am at thy right hand." (*MYP 250*). What a God!

The Lord has always been calling, encouraging, and even waiting for people to speak with Him (Ge 3:9; 4:9-10; 1 Ki 19:9; Eze 22:30; Joel 2:17-19; Mt 7:7; Jn 14:13; 15:7,16; 16:23-24; Heb 4:16; Jas 5:15; *DA 667*). However, we realize that even as believers, we do not know how or what to pray according to His will, and that for our prayers to be effectual, we totally depend on the inspiration of the Holy Spirit (Rom 8:26; *1SM 344*). As we remain in God's Word and will (Ge 2:19-20; Jn 15:7) and walk in His Spirit (Rom 8:1, 14), He impresses us about our true needs (Jn 16:8-11; *5T 632-633*) and how to pray (Rom 8:26), and enables us to fulfill every one of the conditions for effectual prayer (*COL 133-149*).

Therefore, the key to the power of prayer lies in the believers' full reliance on God's Spirit. The Holy Spirit always inspires us according to God's will since He knows it (Rom 8:27; 1 Co 2:10). As He is also the Spirit of Christ (Rom 8:9), the prayers He inspires us to offer are in Christ's name (Jn 14:13; 15:16; 16:23). The secret of their power or success is that Jesus will now make such prayers His own and purify them so they become acceptable to God (*AG 154; DA 667-668; 8T 178*). As Jesus' disciples pray in His name, or according to God's will, they can have confidence that "God will hear the earnest entreaties of His people. The prayer of faith will move the arm of God." (*ST 09-04-1879*; 1 Jn 5:14-15).

Are God's remnant people ready and eager to engage in such powerful, effectual, Spirit-led intercession for each other and others (1 Ti 2:1)? Are they willing and committed to be involved, together with holy angels, in God's answer to their prayers in Jesus' name (*ML 19; AG 154*)? Do we long and are we receptive for the spirit of intercession within our great reformatory movement (*8T 251; 9T 126*)?

God <u>answers</u> prayers: He <u>receives</u> them from Jesus as His desires, which His own Son enables Him to accept.

STEP 5

The God of Heaven

- a) accepts the prayers of His people through Jesus' intercession (1 Jn 5:14; AG 154);
- b) grants their desires according to His, i.e., Jesus' will (Ps 37:4; Jn 15:16; 1 Jn 5:15);
- c) involves angels and His people in answering their prayers (2 Ki 5:1-14; Jn 9:1-7; *ML* 19).

STEP 1

The God of Heaven

- a) has a plan for every individual and His church (Ge 2:18; Jer 29:11; Rom 8:14-17);
- **b)** puts it into us as desires as we remain in His Word & will (Ge 2:19-20; Ps 37:4-5; Jn 15:7);
- c) awaits the prayer requests of His people (Joel 2:17-19; Mt 7:7; Lk 11:9; Jn 16:24).

God <u>calls</u> for prayers: He <u>gives</u> them to people as their desires, which His own Spirit enables them to <u>express</u>.

STEP 4

The Lord Jesus

- a) makes the prayers of His people His own desires (DA 667; LHU 190; Pr 13, 35);
- b) mingles them with His purity so God can accept them (1SM 344; AG 154; 8T 178);
- c) presents them before God in intercession (Rom 8:34: Heb 7:25; 1SM 344).

"Whatsoever ye shall ask in my name." (Jn 14:13; 15:16; 16:23). "If we ask any thing according to His will, He heareth us." (1 Jn 5:14).

STEP 2

The Holy Spirit

- **a)** makes us feel our true needs (5*T* 632-633), and moves us to pray (1SM 344; DA 189);
- **b)** helps us to pray "as we ought" (Rom 8:26), i.e., to meet the conditions (*COL* 133-149);
- c) gives us earnestness & intensity in prayer as a divine pledge of abundant help (COL 147).

Summary of the human problem:

Our God has many good gifts for us that He wants to bestow upon us. But He will not force them on us, so He needs us to ask for them. However, we often do not know that and why we need these gifts, let alone how to pray for them.

STEP 3

The People of God

- **a)** are empowered to fulfill the conditions for answered prayer (*COL* 133-149).
- **b)** pray in Jesus' name (Jn 14:13-14; *DA* 668), according to God's will (1 Jn 5:14);
- c) but do so through their corrupt humanness (1SM 344; AG 154; TMK 75)

Summary of the divine solution:

Our God wants all our prayers to be effectual, i.e., according to His will, so He can answer them all. This is why He gives us His Word and His Spirit Who inspires correct prayers, and He receives them from His Son Who made them acceptable to Him.

E. Grow in Grace – 3. Pray According to God's Will – 303. The Provisions and Promises for Effectual Prayer

SUMMARY: Your desire to abide in Jesus, to grow in grace, increases the closer you follow the divine science in prayer and see more answers.

Just as our Heavenly Father always heard the prayers of His own Son (Jn 11:41-42; Heb 5:7), so is He committed to answer all our prayers (Mt 21:22; Jn 14:13; 15:16; 16:23; 1 Jn 5:14). He wants us to be confident that He will do so (1 Jn 5:15), if we pray in such a way that He can. These provisions are not arbitrary burdens, but rather conditions which themselves are promises we claim by faith (Eze 36:26-27; COL 333; Ed 126; MB 76). They are not necessary to persuade God to act, but to make us ready to receive what God already has in store for us (Isa 65:24; Mt 6:7-8; 7:7-11). They also justify Him to give to others what we ask of Him on their behalf (1 Ti 2:1).

Once we pray according to God's will we can expect surprises and miracles. He delights to do much more than we can ask or imagine (Eph 3:20). Our God promises and loves to answer all our prayers, when we, "as we ought",...



F. Share the Love - 002. Dynamic Circles of Love

SUMMARY: Consider and appreciate now the giving side of that circle of love, which forms phase 2 in the discipling process.

The first theme and mark of discipleship in each phase cover the <u>receiving</u> side of the relationship, the second theme and mark the <u>giving</u> side. Jesus said, "Come to Me, Learn of Me." (Mt 11:28-30); then, "Go for Me into all the world." (Mk 16:15; Mt 28:20). So the three circles of love together form the <u>process</u> by which Jesus builds His church (Mt 16:18): **1.** He calls her to Himself (Mt 16:24), **2.** grows her into His full stature (Eph 4:13; 5:27), and **3.** sends her to complete her number (Rom 11:25-26). Then He will return to take His beloved bride home into God's eternal glory (Jn 14:1-3).



F. Share the Love – 1. Exercise Christlike Love – 101. The Two Commandments

SUMMARY: You take step 10 in the discipling process, as you exercise love according to the great commandment and the second one like it.

An expert of the law asked Jesus, "Which is the great commandment in the law?" (Mt 22:36). The Lord answered by quoting Dt 6:5, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind." (v. 37). He confirmed, "This is the first and great commandment." (v. 38). But then Jesus placed another commandment on the same level, quoting from Lev 19:18, "And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." (vv. 39-40). The Lord allowed no commandment to be seen as more important than the other. They are both of equal significance as only love fulfills the whole law (Rom 13:8-10; Gal 5:14).

So, what makes the second commandment to be like the first is, that both are based on the great principle of love, and both require the concerted attention and cooperation of our whole being, heart, soul, strength, and mind (Dt 6:5; Lk 10:27). But there is one more aspect of their relationship. In a similar discussion with Jesus earlier (Lk 10:25-28), another lawyer had tried to justify himself by asking a further question, "And who is my neighbor?" (v. 29). In response, the Lord recounted a recent incident of a Samaritan rescuing a Jewish traveler from death who had been wounded on his way to Jericho (vv. 30-35). Jesus ends the story with a definition of *neighbor* that connects both commandments in a yet deeper way.

Jesus concluded with a question, "Which now of these three [priest, Levite, Samaritan], thinkest thou, was neighbor unto him that fell among the thieves? And he [the lawyer] said, He that shewed mercy on him. Then said Jesus unto him, Go, and do likewise." (Lk 10:36-37). The lawyer realized that the *neighbor* as defined in Jesus' question was not the one who had a need, but the one who met a need; not the one who required help, but the one who provided it; not the one who depended on mercy, but the one who extended it. The lawyer had asked who qualified to be his neighbors and thus to receive his love. But Jesus challenged the lawyer to qualify to become their neighbor by giving his love to those in need.

So why does Jesus' definition of *neighbor* establish a deeper connection between the first two commandments, to love God and our neighbor? Because Jesus is both our God as the Creator and our foremost and ultimate neighbor as the Savior. "In the story of the good Samaritan, Jesus gave a picture of Himself and His mission. Man had been deceived, bruised, robbed, and ruined by Satan, and left to perish; but the Savior had compassion on our helpless condition. He left His glory to come to our rescue...and made complete provision for us at His own charges." (*DA 503-504*). In Jesus, we love both our God and our neighbor. Therefore, the first two commandments are alike because they both call us to love Jesus.

Jesus fulfills the various meanings of the word *neighbor* in a unique and preeminent way. Through His incarnation, life, death, resurrection, and intercession, He alone qualified to become our ultimate *rayah* (Hebrew 7455), the "associate, friend, fellow Israelite, brother, companion, husband" of all true believers, and their *plesion* (Greek 4139), "the one near" (Jn 4:5; Heb 8:11). He is near us now through His Holy Spirit, living in us, as a friend who sticks closer than even a brother (Pr 18:24). And throughout eternity He also will be near us physically because then we are where He is (Jn 14:3). Jesus will ever be the nearest and dearest neighbor to His redeemed, both in terms of local proximity and relational closeness.

What then motivates His people to "go, and do likewise" (Lk 10:37), to become a neighbor to those in need as Jesus did? **1.** We recognize that we ourselves were and are in need of a neighbor who shows loving compassion on us, a Savior who rescues us from ruin (Rom 5:8; Heb 5:2). **2.** As we allow the love of the Savior to rescue us and then to enter us by His Spirit, He moves us to show compassion on others in need (Rom 5:5; 1 Jn 3:17). **3.** By lovingly helping to meet needs, our greater goal is to allow Jesus, through us, to show Himself to the needy as their ultimate neighbor (Ac 3:6-26). **4.** As the Samaritan and Jesus helped those who despised them, so we also love our enemies (Isa 53:3; Mt 5:44; Rom 12:20).

F. Share the Love – 1. Exercise Christlike Love – 102. Love in 1 Corinthians 13

SUMMARY: The love you are called to have for others, as described in 1 Co 13, is the self-sacrificing divine agape love of Jesus Himself.

The word *love* in today's society is used in many different ways, most of which do not reflect its Biblical meaning. The Greek in Bible times knew four distinct words for *love*. These were, in the order of NT usage, *eros*, *storge*, *philia*, and *agape* (*5BC 340*). **1.** *Eros* describes the physical, including sexual, aspects and is mostly of a conditional, if not selfish nature. It appears only twice in the Greek OT, in Prov 7:18 and 30:16, but never in the NT. **2.** *Storge* stands for the affectionate feelings between relatives, especially between children and parents, and spouses. It is used only once in the NT, in Rom 12:10, giving the sense that church members are to regard each other as brothers and sisters.

3. Philia is used in the NT to denote affection to another person, or attraction to things, due to appreciation for the qualities in the other. It describes everything from love of God (2 Ti 3:4) to love of money (1 Ti 6:10). **4.** Agape, rarely used elsewhere, is reserved in the NT to denote the unconditional, selfless, self-sacrificing nature of God's love to humanity, as ultimately shown in the death of His own dear Son on the cross. Agape love is not based on unstable feelings, nor is it motivated by any quality in the other person. It is rather an inherent principle in the lover, the unconditional commitment to do, invest, or lose everything, even life itself, to secure or regain the wellbeing of the beloved (Jn 3:16).

This kind of love not only describes God's attitude or actions toward humanity, but His very character; not only does He love, He is love (1 Jn 4:8). For this reason, God's love toward humanity is everlasting (Isa 54:8; Jer 31:3) and will not be retracted (Hos 3:1; 11:8; Jer 31:20; Rom 8:28-39). It can only be hindered by disobedience (Isa 59:2; Jer 7:28-30) and rejection (Mk 6:4-6; Mt 23:37-39). It is nothing less than this divine love that Jesus calls His disciples to have one for another (Jn 13:14, 34-35; 15:12), neighbors, and even enemies (Mt 5:43-48; Rom 12:20). Only in this way can they reveal God's character to the world (Jn 13:35), just as Jesus did (Jn 1:18). Paul defines *agape* love in 1 Co 13.

"It is...deception to suppose that a man can have faith unto life eternal, without possessing Christlike love for his brethren....Christians love those around them as precious souls for whom Christ has died." (MS 133, 1899). When will God's remnant be so filled with His Spirit, the fire of God's love, that the whole earth will be filled with His glory (Rom 5:5; Rev 18:1)? Jesus desires to send it (Lk 12:49).

SUMMARY: You may express such mutual agape love in many different forms and situations, as described in both positive and negative ways.

The NT Scriptures are full of admonition to God's people to love one another (Jn 15:17; Rom 12:10; 1 Th 4:9; 1 Pe 1:22; 3:8; 1 Jn 3:11; 3:23; 2 Jn 5). Six reasons are given: **1.** God loved us (1 Jn 4:7, 11). **2.** Jesus loved us (Jn 13:34; 15:9, 12). **3.** By this the world will know that we are Jesus' disciples (Jn 13:35). **4.** We fulfill the law (Rom 13:8). **5.** God's love is perfected in us (1 Jn 4:2). **6.** That we may be blameless at the coming of Jesus (1 Th 3:13). Jesus is our divine example. He calls us to love one another as He loved us (Jn 13:15, 34; 15:12). How are we doing?

SUMMARY: You take step 11 in the discipling process, as you show this agape love by contributing to meetings of the local and wider church.

"Those who worship Him in sincerity and truth will be accepted by Him. If church members will put away all self-worship, and will receive in their hearts the love for God and for one another that filled Christ's heart, our heavenly Father will constantly manifest His power through them. Let His people be drawn together with the cords of divine love. Then the world will recognize the miracle-working power of God. (*MS 125, 1907*)." (*7BC 939*). Involvement with Christlike love in church meetings are forms of worship, as members contribute to the service of God and their fellow believers (Rom 12:1-13). "Unselfish devotion and a spirit of sacrifice have always been and always will be the first requisite of acceptable service." (*PK 65*).

Moreover, "The convocations of the church, as in camp meetings, the assemblies of the home church, and all occasions where there is personal labor for souls, are God's appointed opportunities for giving the early and the latter rain.--TM 508 (1897)." (*LDE 188*). We need both rains!!

Involvement with Christlike love in any and all church meetings can be forms of worship, as members give God His proper place in their lives, and invest their spiritual gifts, natural talents, and physical resources in the service of their fellow believers (Rom 12:1-13). "Unselfish devotion and a spirit of sacrifice have always been and always will be the first requisite of acceptable service." (*PK* 65).

F. Share the Love – 3. Help With Practical Support – 301. Minister to Members and the World

SUMMARY: You take step 12 in the discipling process, as you share love by giving practical support to church members and the community.

Jesus wants us to care for our fellow believers. Some ministry may be directed to those who suffer for the faith. "In all who suffer for My name, said Jesus, you are to recognize Me. As you would minister to Me, so you are to minister to them. This is the evidence that you are My disciples." (*DA* 637; Mt 25:31-40). Other ministry should be directed to needy members of the local church. The Jerusalem congregation provided a model for such care, as it created a common fund and chose deacons to meet those needs (Ac 2:44-45; 4:32; 6:1-7).

Other ministry focuses on the needy in the world around us. "Not to any class is Christ's love restricted. He identifies Himself with every child of humanity....His followers are not to feel themselves detached from the perishing world around them. They are a part of the great web of humanity; and Heaven looks upon them as brothers to sinners as well as to saints. The fallen, the erring, and the sinful, Christ's love embraces; and every deed of kindness done to uplift a fallen soul, every act of mercy, is accepted as done to Him." (DA 638).

Consider, "The angels of heaven are sent forth to minister to those who shall be heirs of salvation. We know not now who they are; it is not yet made manifest who shall overcome, and share the inheritance of the saints in light; but angels of heaven are passing throughout the length and breadth of the earth seeking to comfort the sorrowing, to protect the imperiled, to win the hearts of men to Christ. Not one is neglected or passed by. God is no respecter of persons, and He has an equal care for all the souls He has created." (DA 639).

"As you open your door to Christ's needy and suffering ones, you are welcoming unseen angels....They bring a sacred atmosphere of joy and peace. They come with praises upon their lips, and an answering strain is heard in heaven. Every deed of mercy makes music there. The Father from His throne numbers the unselfish workers among His most precious treasures." (*DA 639*). "When we love the world as He has loved it, then for us His mission is accomplished. We are fitted for heaven; for we have heaven in our hearts." (*DA 641*).



G. Bear much Fruit - 002. Dynamic Circles of Love

SUMMARY: Consider and appreciate now the receiving side of that circle of love, which forms phase 3 in the discipling process.

The first theme and mark of discipleship in each phase cover the <u>receiving</u> side of the relationship, the second theme and mark the <u>giving</u> side. Jesus said, "Come to Me, Learn of Me." (Mt 11:28-30); then, "Go for Me into all the world." (Mk 16:15; Mt 28:20). So the three circles of love together form the <u>process</u> by which Jesus builds His church (Mt 16:18): **1.** He calls her to Himself (Mt 16:24), **2.** grows her into His full stature (Eph 4:13; 5:27), and **3.** sends her to complete her number (Rom 11:25-26). Then He will return to take His beloved bride home into God's eternal glory (Jn 14:1-3).



G. Bear much Fruit – 1. Recognize and Confirm All Talents – 101. Importance and Lists of Spiritual Gifts

SUMMARY: You take step 13 in the discipling process, as you bear fruit by recognizing and confirming your spiritual gifts and other talents.

The indwelling Holy Spirit brings to every believer a growing obedience and likeness to Jesus, expressed in mutual Christian love and love of all (Rom 5:5; Jn 15:5; 2 Co 3:18; Rom 12:10; Mt 5:44-48). This sanctification of the characters of church members is meant to make them useful in the finishing work of the Lord. "Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit: so shall ye be my disciples.... I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain." (Jn 14:8, 16). So, "Impress upon all the necessity of the baptism of the Holy Spirit, the sanctification of the church, so that they will be living, growing, fruit-bearing trees of the Lord's planting." (6T 86).

"If we realized the solemnity of the time in which we are living, if we realized how greatly the world needs to see Christ's grace revealed in His followers, we would work more earnestly and diligently for the Master. Let those who claim to believe the truth put their belief into practice. Let all unite in carrying out God's will. All are to work in perfect harmony, receiving from the same source their influence and their power." (*RH 02-11-1902*). "God desires them to become all that He has made it possible for them to be, and to do their very best with the powers He has given them....Precious are [their] opportunities, and earnestly should they be improved." (*RH 12-03-1908*). God's biddings are enablings (*COL 333*).

Our heavenly Father is very willing to bestow the Holy Spirit on His remnant people, but He awaits their demand. "Not until through faith and prayer the disciples had surrendered themselves fully for His working was the outpouring of the Spirit received. Then in a special sense the goods of heaven were committed to the followers of Christ. "When He ascended up on high, He led captivity captive, and gave gifts unto men." Eph. 4:8. 'Unto every one of us is given grace, according to the measure of the gift of Christ," the Spirit 'dividing to every man severally as He will." Eph. 4:7; 1 Cor. 12:11. The gifts are already ours in Christ, but their actual possession depends upon our reception of the Spirit of God." (COL 327).

"Those only who are constantly receiving fresh supplies of grace, will have power proportionate to their daily need and their ability to use that power. Instead of looking forward to some future time when, through a special endowment of spiritual power, they will receive a miraculous fitting up for soul winning, they are yielding themselves daily to God, that He may make them vessels meet for His use. Daily they are improving the opportunities for service that lie within their reach. Daily they are witnessing for the Master wherever they may be, whether in some humble sphere of labor in the home, or in a public field of usefulness." (AA 55). In short, Jesus' disciples daily seek His gifts and opportunities to exercise them.

They are given to establish and comfort the believers (Rom 1:11-12); to benefit, edify, and spiritually and numerically grow the church (1 Co 12:7; Eph 4:12-16); and through these functions to bring glory to God (1 Pe 4:11), as they are being exercised in love (1 Co 13:1-3; 1 Pe 4:8). The New Testament explicitly mentions a number of spiritual gifts in three different and partial lists; others are alluded to elsewhere.

Spiritual Gift Lists – New Testament





H. Tell the World - 002. Dynamic Circles of Love

SUMMARY: Consider and appreciate now the giving side of that circle of love, which forms phase 3 in the discipling process.

The first theme and mark of discipleship in each phase cover the <u>receiving</u> side of the relationship, the second theme and mark the <u>giving</u> side. Jesus said, "Come to Me, Learn of Me." (Mt 11:28-30); then, "Go for Me into all the world." (Mk 16:15; Mt 28:20). So the three circles of love together form the <u>process</u> by which Jesus builds His church (Mt 16:18): **1.** He calls her to Himself (Mt 16:24), **2.** grows her into His full stature (Eph 4:13; 5:27), and **3.** sends her to complete her number (Rom 11:25-26). Then He will return to take His beloved bride home into God's eternal glory (Jn 14:1-3).



H. Tell the World – 1. Enable the Latter Rain Power – 101. The Two Parts of Glorification

SUMMARY: As you progress in sanctification, you enter into the third stage of salvation, glorification by faith according to its two parts.

Glorification is the third stage of salvation, or God's restoration of humanity into the likeness of Jesus. The righteousness of Jesus is reflected in the believer through the Holy Spirit within (1 Co 3:16; Gal 4:19; Col 1:27; 3:10; 2 Pe 1:4). "The Lord calls upon His Church to arise and shine amid the moral darkness. His people are to be a spectacle to the world, to angels, and to men." (*RH 02-11-1902*).

The ark of the covenant was the only piece of furniture in the Most Holy Place. It contained the two tables of the moral law, covered by the mercy seat, above which the presence of God was manifested. The law and the mercy seat symbolize the two complementary aspects of God's character and plan of salvation: His justice and His mercy, both of which have met and were completely satisfied at the cross (Ps 85:10; Rom 3:20-26; *PP 349*). This grace of God leads His people to surrender their lives to Him to His glory, both individually and as a church.

The Shekinah glory of God's presence was the place from where God communicated His will for His people. It was accessed only once a year by the high priest. God's people rejoice that they always have free access to His word and to His throne through Jesus now, and when Jesus comes He will give them glorified bodies like His, so they can dwell in God's presence and serve Him (Rev 7:15; 22:3).

Will God's remnant people glorify God in their bodies now so Jesus can give them glorious bodies soon?

H. Tell the World - 1. Enable the Latter Rain Power - 102. The Three Ways to Glorify God

SUMMARY: You take step 16 in the discipling process, as you seek to glorify God in your life in the power of both the former and the latter rain.

God's remnant people are still waiting with great anticipation for the second coming of Jesus, their "blessed hope" (Tit 2:13). Jesus will give them glorified bodies and take them to heaven so they can forever be with Him, share in His glory (Php 3:21; Col 3:4; 1 Th 4:17; 1 Pe 5:1, 10), see God face to face, and serve Him (Rom 8:17-18; 2 Th 2:14; Heb 2:10; 1 Pe 1:11; 4:13; 5:1, 10; Rev 7:14-15; 15:5; 22:3). This glorious future will be the satisfaction and joy of Jesus that was set before Him and helped Him endure the cross for our sakes (Isa 53:11; Heb 12:2; *DA 624*). In response to His sacrificial love, God's people love to glorify Him 1. in their bodies, 2. as a body or church, 3. in death.

God's people glorify Him, reflect His character, as they wait and watch for the coming of the Lord in an active manner, by sanctifying obedience and sincere ministry (Rom 13:11-14; Heb 10:25; 2 Pe 3:11-14). "Christians are not to await their Lord's return in idle expectancy. While waiting and watching they are to be vigilant in purifying their own souls by obedience to the truth, and to be earnest in working for others [*DA 634*]. It is their privilege 'not only to look for but to hasten the coming of the day of God' (*DA 633*)." (*5BC 505*). We need the former and the latter rain (*TM 506-508*) for purification as well as for ministry; all are necessary to end the delay of Jesus' coming. Are we ready?

H. Tell the World – 1. Enable the Latter Rain Power – 103. Phases of Biblical Perfection

SUMMARY: You will not prepare for the latter rain in the power of the former rain, unless you believe that Jesus seeks to make you perfect now.

Perfection is clearly a Biblical teaching. It describes God's character (Dt 32:4; Job 37:16; Ps 18:30; 19:7; Mt 5:48; Rom 12:2) and Jesus (Heb 2:10; 5:9). It is also God's goal for His people (Dt 18:13; Mt 19:21; Lk 6:40; Eph 4:13; Col 1:28; 4:12; 2 Ti 3:17; Heb 13:21; 1 Pe 5:10), and therefore He calls them to perfection (Ge 17:10; Dt 18:13; 1 Ki 8:61; 1 Chr 28:9; Mt 5:48; 2 Co 13:11). Related terms are holiness (Ex 15:11; 19:6; Lev 11:44-45; Ps 30:4; Rom 6:19, 22; Eph 4:24; 5:27; 1 Th 3:13; 1 Pe 1:15-16; 2 Pe 3:11), godliness (Ps 32:6; 12:1; 1 Ti 2:2; 4:8; 2 Ti 3:12; 2 Pe 1:6; 3:30), and blamelessness (Lk 1:6; 1 Co 1:8; Php 2:15; 1 Th 5:23; 2 Pe 3:14).

The references imply that Biblical perfection is attainable in one's lifetime (Ge 6:9; 17:1; 1 Ki 11:4; 15:14; Job 1:1, 8; *LHU* 139). True Christians will not claim it, however (Php 3:12; *FLB* 119), nor should they (*3SM* 354-355; *AA* 562; *TMK* 361). If we claim we have no sin we deceive ourselves and lie (Jn 8:7; 1 Jn 1:8-10), for only Jesus was truly without sin (Jn 8:46; 2 Co 5:21; 1 Pe 2:22; Heb 4:15; 1 Jn 3:5). On the other hand, since we are called to partake of the divine nature (2 Pe 1:4), to perfect holiness in the fear of God (2 Co 7:1), there does come a time when we are perfect in that we actually no longer sin (Jn 5:14; 8:11; Rom 6:1-2, 12-13).

The crucial question then is, when does this phase of spiritual maturity begin? Some say we sin until the Lord returns, perhaps because they don't want to make false claims, or because they know we retain our sinful nature until the Lord's coming (Php 3:21). Others say, claiming 1 Jn 3:9, that truly converted Christians stop sinning because they are now incapable of sinning. The first position overlooks that all, including Christians, who sin until the Lord returns, do so after the close of probation and thus have unforgiven sin, since there is then no more forgiveness. They would all be counted unjust (Rev 22:11) and could not be saved (Rev 19:21).

The second position overlooks that 1 Jn 3:9 cannot mean converted Christians no longer sin. 1 Jn 1:7-10; 2:1 already stated that even Christians continue to need cleansing from sin (present tense in the Greek) as part of the process of sanctification (Rom 6:19; 1 Th 4:3). There is no contradiction between the two statements, since 1 Jn 3:9 says only that Christians do not continue to sin habitually (present tense again), as a lifestyle. This does not exclude occasional sin, for which 1 Jn 1:7-10 promises forgiveness and cleansing. However, this latter passage cannot be used to prove that sinning goes on for life, as it does not address this point.

So the question still needs to be answered, when will all sinning finally stop, so Jesus can finish the cleansing of the heavenly sanctuary? Biblically, the truth of the matter lies between the two positions just discussed. 1 Jn 1:7-10 says that occasional sinning is a reality even after conversion. But the Bible also assures us that God is able to keep us from falling, in order to preserve us blameless unto, and present us faultless at the coming of Jesus (Jude 24; 1 Th 5:23; 2 Pe 3:14; Eph 5:27). This implies that all sinning will need to and can cease, not only at His coming, but before. In fact, it needs to end even prior to the close of probation (Rev 22:11).

One might object on two points: First, that sanctification is the work of a lifetime (*COL 65; HP 231*). Yet in its context, this statement is not saying that we will sin as long as we live, but that victory over sin is to be gained as long as we live (*AA 560*). Second, that we will have our sinful nature until Jesus comes. True, yet our sinful nature does not require us to act on it. We are exhorted to consider ourselves dead to sin and freed from its power (Rom 6:1-13). While we may be tempted to sin due to our sinful nature, God is able to preserve us from actual sinning if we are patient in our trials (1 Co 10:13; Jas 1:2-4; 2 Pe 2:9; Jude 24; Rev 12:14).

While the Bible says we will be blameless sometime before the close of probation, God is more specific toward His remnant church through the Spirit of Prophecy by showing that ceasing from sin is a prerequisite for the reception of the latter rain. We need to wait, watch, and pray for the latter rain (*LDE 194; DA 672*). But we also need to prepare for it by gaining victory over every sin, wrong word and action (*EW 71; LDE 192*), by cleansing from all filthiness of flesh and spirit (2 Co 7:1; *1T 619*) and from every defilement (*5T 214; LDE 192*). Such relative perfection is to be obtained <u>prior</u> to the latter rain, not then as a result of it (*TM 506-507*).

The process of our perfection can be summarized in six phases: **1.** We are reckoned perfected at conversion despite past sins and present failures, as we trust in Christ (Heb 10:14). **2.** While we are growing in His grace, we are relatively perfect at every stage despite a lack of full maturity (*COL* 65). **3.** Enabled by divine grace, we obey God's will and increase in victory over every sin and rebellious attitude (*LDE* 192). **4.** Though still having our sinful nature, we no longer sin (1 Th 5:23). **5.** At Christ's coming, our sinful nature and mortality are removed (Php 3:21; 1 Co 15:54). **6.** We continue to grow in Christ through all eternity (*BEcho*, 5-15, 1892).

H. Tell the World - 1. Enable Latter Rain Power - 104. The Blessings of Jesus

SUMMARY: You also want to remember, that Jesus calls and enables you to be an overcoming witness in order to secure your own happiness.

God is calling us to receive both the former and the latter rain Spirit so we become more than conquerors, or overcomers (Rom 8:37; Rev 12:11). Jesus promises us this victory and shows us how to gain it as the only way to true happiness now and for eternity.

In the Sermon on the Mount (Mt 5:1-8:1; Lk 6:17-49), Jesus gives His inaugural address as the King of His new kingdom of divine grace. Right at its beginning (Mt 5:1-12), He "proclaims that the main objective of the kingdom is to restore the lost happiness of Eden to the hearts of men, and that those who choose to enter in by the 'strait' gate and the 'narrow' way (Matt. 7:13, 14) will find true happiness" (5BC 324).

In the book of Revelation, Jesus announces His soon return as the King of kings finally to establish His eternal kingdom of divine glory (Da 7:14). Throughout the book, He gives some more blessings and instructions to His beloved remnant people in these last days, so they may not only retain their citizenship in the present kingdom of grace on earth, but also secure it for the soon coming kingdom of glory.

H. Tell the World – 2. Reflect Jesus in Character and Lifestyle – 201. The Events of the Day of Atonement

SUMMARY: You see your need of perfection, as you reflect on the affliction of the soul during the annual as well as the global Day of Atonement.

The Annual Event 1 1. In the divinely ordained OT order of annual feasts, the Day of Atonement marked the end of the yearly round of confessions and sacrificial 2 offerings for sin. Once a year (Lev 16:34), atonement was made because of and for all the sins of God's people of the past year (Lev 16:16, 30, 34). Thus, the sanctuary itself was cleansed from its defilement caused by the record of accumulated sins (Lev 16:16, 20). 3 2. The annual Day of Atonement was a Sabbath of rest (Lev 16:31; 23:32), and a holy convocation (Lev 23:27; 29:7) for the people of God. 4 They were not to work (Lev 16:29: 23:28, 31), but to afflict their souls (Lev 16:29, 31: 23:27, 32: Nu 29:7), that is, to review their lives and 5 6 search their hearts for any sins not yet repented of, and to receive atonement through sin offerings, as long as the high priest was still inside the Holy Place. Once he came out and purified the altar of burnt offering, the cleansing was completed (Lev 16:18-20). Now the high priest placed 7 all confessed sins on the scapegoat, which was then lead into the wilderness to die (Lev 16:21). 3. The Israelites who had not kept the Sabbath of rest, and neglected to afflict their souls while the high priest was still in the Holy Place, were to be cut off from the people of God (Lev 23:29), and God announced that He Himself would destroy them (Lev 23:30). This was therefore 10 11 a day of judgment for God's people (Lev 16:30; 1 Pe 4:17). In this way God assured their holiness, to which He had called them because He is 12 holy (Lev 11:44-45; 19:2; 20:7, 26). Only through a holy people can Jesus continue to reveal God's character to the world (Ex 19:6; 1 Pe 2:9; Jn 13 8:2; Mt 5:14), who, individually and corporately, thereby glorify Him in their lives (1 Co 6:20; 10:31; Php 1:11). The Global Period 14 1. The Day of Atonement is serious business. Once a year, God brought about total cleansing to all those of His people who took the time 15 allotted to them to search their hearts (Lev 16:29); but to those who did not, it meant exclusion and death. Since 1844, when Jesus our eternal 16 high priest (Heb 8:1-2) began cleansing the heavenly sanctuary (Da 8:14), we live in the global Day of Atonement or the pre-advent 17 Investigative Judgment. Now all people in the world are called to afflict their souls by giving God the opportunity to show them their sins and give them repentance and forgiveness (Lk 24:47; Ac 5:31; 17:30). God wants to restore all people to His perfection (Mt 5:48), His righteousness 18 and holiness (2 Co 7:1; Eph 4:24; 1 Th 4:7); it is available to "whosoever will" (Rev 21:6; 22:17). Without it nobody can bring glory to God (Jn 19 20 15:5; 1 Co 6:20; 10:31; Phil 1:11), let alone enter His kingdom and see Him face to face (Mt 5:20; Heb 12:14; 1 Jn 3:2). 2. The time allotted to humanity to receive such holiness is "now" (2 Co 6:2), while their probation still lingers. Nobody knows when this 21 22 gracious offer will be over. Anyone's life could end anytime, and we do not know when the sealing of the faithful is finished (Rev 7:3). We do 23 know, however, that once our High Priest leaves the heavenly sanctuary He will no longer plead His blood for sinners (Rev 22:11). By then, 24 global probation has ended, the plagues will be poured upon all the wicked who neglected their opportunity (Rev 16:1-21), and they will be 25 destroyed by the brightness of Jesus' coming (2 Th 2:8-10). Then the Lord will deliver His people (Da 12:1) and take them to heaven together with all resurrected believers (1 Th 4:15-18). There they will reign with Him a thousand years (Rev 20:4, 6), that is, evaluate and confirm His 26 27 righteous judgment on all wicked people and fallen angels (Da 7:22; 1 Co 6:2-3). 3. After His return, Jesus will put all the sins God's children ever confessed and were forgiven, on Satan (ST 5-16-1895) and bind Him on 28 the desolate earth, a wilderness without people to deceive (Rev 20:2-3). After the millennium, all the wicked will be raised in their old bodies to 29 be condemned and annihilated together with Satan and his evil angels in the global lake of fire (Da 12:2; Jn 5:29; Rev 20:10,14-15). Then, 30 Jesus will renew the earth (Rev 21:1) and restore to His people never-ending righteousness and happiness (2 Pe 3:13). 31 **The Ongoing Process** 32 So now, "today," we still have the divine opportunity to afflict our souls while the heavenly sanctuary is being cleansed. This afflicting is an ongoing daily work toward complete holiness during personal probation. It consists of four steps: 1. We behold (2 Co 3:18) and desire the attributes of God (Ex 20:1-17; 34:6-7), Jesus (1 Jn 2:6) and the Spirit (Gal 5:22-23). 35 2. We let God search our hearts and show us our sins and hurts as well as His leading (Ps 139:23-24; Rev 2:23). 3. We allow ourselves to be humbled while recognizing our sinful ways (Dt 8:2; 2 Ch 7:14; Ps 51:17; Jas 4:5-10). 4. We repent and confess to God and one another, and He will forgive, cleanse and heal (2 Ch 7:14; 1 Jn 1:6-10; Jas 5:16). SUMMARY: You see God's **calling** to this afflicting of the soul, as you note the **parallels** between the annual Day of Atonement and end-time history.

H. Tell the World – 2. Reflect Jesus in Character and Lifestyle – 207. Divine and Human Anger

SUMMARY: Finally, you deal specifically with anger, as it is the strongest emotion to which Satan is going to tempt God's people in the final days.

Anger is one the most powerful emotions known to humanity. It may express itself in negative attitudes such as bitterness, resentment or hatred, in hasty and passionate words of evil speaking such as false accusation, slander or calling names, or in abusive and destructive actions such as murder or other violence (Eph 4:31; Col 3:8; Ge 4:8; Mt 5:21-22). In any case, cherished anger sets aside reason (4T 431), ruins our health as it wounds and poisons the heart (Pr 17:22; Ed 197; OHC 235), and it damages the character (1MCP 192). More tragically yet, it dishonors the Lord God and brings reproach to the Christian since it reflects the spirit of Satan rather than the character of Jesus (TDG 270; DA 353).

To be sure, as Moses and David showed (Ex 32:19; 2 Sa 12:5), "there is an indignation that is justifiable, even in the followers of Christ....Such anger...is not a sin." (*DA 310*). It reflects rather God's anger against sin as also seen in Jesus (Rom 1:18-21; Mt 23:13ff.; Mk 3:5). But there are big differences between divine and human anger. There "is a righteous indignation against sin, which springs from zeal for the glory of God, not that anger prompted by self-love or wounded ambition, which is referred to in the scripture, 'Be ye angry, and sin not." (*TM 100*). So God's people may show righteous indignation but never claim it to justify human anger. They are called to vindicate God by reflecting Jesus.

Therefore, God's people need to overcome human anger through Jesus' attributes (Pr 16:32; Eph 4:30-32; Col 3:12-17; Jas 1:19-22). Soon, Satan will persuade men to regard the Sabbath keepers as offending God, troublers of the people, and enemies of law and order; and will accuse them of disaffection toward the government (*GC 590-592*), thus seeking to provoke God's people to passion (*COL 171-172*). But as these trials come, will God's remnant give anyone reason to say that their accusers were correct (*HP 246*), or will they respond to injustice and suffering as Jesus did (Lk 23:34; 1 Pe 2:19-23; 4:12-19)? Will they manifest His spirit by wearing His yoke of obedience, restraint, and service (*TDG 288*)?

H. Tell the World - 3. Spread the Gospel of Jesus - 301. The Cost of Overcoming

SUMMARY: You take step 18, the last in the discipling process, as you seriously count and decide about the cost of being an overcoming witness.

Before Jesus sends his disciples out to be witnesses for Him, then and now, He prepares them for the task. He tells them clearly what is ahead of them when they obey the call. "The Saviour's eye penetrates the future; He beholds the broader fields in which, after His death, the disciples are to be witnesses for Him. His prophetic glance takes in the experience of His servants through all the ages till He shall come the second time. He shows His followers the conflicts they must meet; He reveals the character and plan of the battle. He lays open before them the perils they must encounter, the self-denial that will be required. He desires them to count the cost, that they may not be taken unawares by the enemy.

"Their warfare is not to be waged against flesh and blood, but "against the principalities, against the powers, against the world rulers of this darkness, against the spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places." Ephesians 6:12. They are to contend with supernatural forces, but they are assured of supernatural help. All the intelligences of heaven are in this army. And more than angels are in the ranks. The Holy Spirit, the representative of the Captain of the Lord's host, comes down to direct the battle. Our infirmities may be many, our sins and mistakes grievous; but the grace of God is for all who seek it with contrition. The power of Omnipotence is enlisted in behalf of those who trust in God." (DA 352).

"Those who in the strength of Christ overcome the great enemy of God and man, will occupy a position in the heavenly courts above angels who have never fallen." (6BC 1113). "All who have borne with Jesus the cross of sacrifice will be sharers with Him of His glory. It was the joy of Christ in His humiliation and pain that His disciples should be glorified with Him. They are the fruit of His self-sacrifice. The outworking in them of His own character and spirit is His reward, and will be His joy throughout eternity. This joy they share with Him as the fruit of their labor and sacrifice is seen in other hearts and lives. They are workers together with Christ, and the Father will honor them as He honors His Son." (DA 624).

H. Tell the World – 3. Spread the Gospel of Jesus – 303. The Suffering of Heaven

SUMMARY: Your will long to help spread the gospel of God's love at any cost, when you consider the suffering sin has caused in heaven.

We hardly have any conception of the suffering that six thousand years of Satan's reign on the earth have brought to the heavenly angels and the heart of God. As humans, we are quick to blame God for all the suffering in the world, and to demand an immediate and satisfying answer to the many "Why?" or "Why me?" questions that burden and sadden us. And although we do not believe that He initiates such suffering, we still may wonder why He allows it. And even then, we tend to focus on what it does and means to us, without considering its effects on our God.

Yet as believers, we recognize that already the book of Job, as one of the oldest of Scripture, reveals the great controversy between God and Satan as the true reason for all the misery on earth. Truly, Moses' "long years spent amid desert solitudes were not lost. Not only was Moses gaining a preparation for the great work before him, but during this time, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, he wrote the book of Genesis and also the book of Job, which would be read with the deepest interest by the people of God until the close of time." (*ST 02-19-1880*).

Why? Because this controversy between Jesus and Satan has a divinely designed end: the destruction of sin and sinners (Rev 20:14-15), the restoration of humanity and the earth to its original state (Rev 21:1-5), eternal harmony and joy in the universe (*GC* 678), and with that also the end of the divine grief over the suffering on this planet. God's people help bring it to an end, as they hasten the coming of Jesus by perfectly reproducing His character in their lives (2 Pe 3:11-12; *COL* 69), and by giving His last warning in latter rain power (Mt 24:14; Rev 18:1-5).

Does God's remnant see the burden, the duty, the sacred privilege, to help end all suffering on earth and in heaven? Will they tell the world of the Savior's last offer of mercy, even as they pray and prepare for the "times of refreshing?"
